Emblem, carrier dove, bearing the gospel to the heathen. Motto, "Not weary in well doing." Text, "And he stayed yet other seven days." Text, "And (Jesus) said unto them, Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

Emblem, Bible with a lighted candle. Motto, "By ye labourers together with God." Text, Gal. ii. 2; Mark xvi. 15; Rev. xii. 15.
