sheer necessity it is worth your while.
Don't rush into it. Figure out what you aim to do before you start. Then get the advice of a friendly neighbor whose vegetable garden First of all fill

men in an Ontario city, all of whom were novices at gardening formed a pool of ten dollars each, and rented four acres of ground on the outskirts of the city. They who knew something about farming. They paid him to plow and harrow the land, purchase seed, and get the job properly started. up to his agreement, to do so much hoeing. Incidentally they paid the farmer for his supervision and direction through the season.

In November of last year they had $\$ 42.00$ still left in the treasury, and to each of thirty-five families ther
had been delivered (charges pre paid) vegetables to the mafket value of about $\$ 31.00$.
Everybody was perfectly satisfied; and, the result is, those same thirty-five men are going The point we want to make is this.
If those thirty-five men had been left to their own devices, in their own back gardens, some of them night have taken off $\$ 30$ worth of vegetables for their efforts, but
most of them would not. Whereas by tackling the job on the Community plan they shared eachothers good fortune, joked over heir disappointments, and proof regetables at market prices, and so relieved the demand for food at much
Why not try to do likewise? One other point that may help you
to decide is this The farmers of Ontario have been urged to grow more whea nd to produce more abundantly of the farm products that can est be sent overseas. The peopl therefore, are asked to growofood to feed themselves as far as pos sible so that the overseas sup plies may not be drazen on un. less absolutely necessary
It is quite possible that vegerables
may be higher in prie next may be higher in priee next fall and winter than they have been
this last year, consequently every pound of food you grow will make you that much less dependent upon them.
