

LIGHT HOUSE ON THE NORTH CAPE.—No part of this Island has been the scene of greater destruction of life and property than the North Cape. There within our own recollection, many a good ship has been dashed to pieces, and many lives lost. In former years, the timber trade of the ports of the Gul: shore of New Brunswick, Miramich in particular, was very much greater than at present, and the number of vessels which passed the North Cape was very large; then, carcely a year passed in which vessels were not wrecked there. On this dangerous headland, the reef of which extends some two or three miles, a Light House is now in course of erection, and in September next, it is confidently hoped, it will be lighted. The expense of the erection of this Light will be borne in nearly equal proportion, by this Island and New Brunswick. To New Brunswick the light will prove more beneficial than to this Island, We trust that next year a Light will be placed on the East Point. When the latter shall be creeted, we think the Island will have done its duty, so far as lighting its shores is concerned.—Isl.
