In 1851, when Hineks became Eremier in place of Baldwin and Lafontaine, Mr. Macdonald was elected Speaker and held that office till 1854. After the general election in that year he went into opposition, and along with Mr. Brown, did good service on the Reform side. He sided with the Western Reformers on every question except Representation by Population, and was though nominally a Roman Catholic strongly opposed to sectarian education.

After the defeat of the Machonald-Cartier Government in 1858, Mr. Macdonald became Attorney-General in the Brown-Dorion Government and was a stanten supporter of Reform in the troublous days of the "Double Shuffle" and other political iniquities. On the defeat of the Macdonald-Cartier Government in 1862, Mr. Macdonald was called on to form a Government which was known as the Macdonald-Sicotte Administration. The makeshift of "Double Majority" was tried as a substitute for Representation by Population, but it would not work, and in 1863 he allied himself with Mr. Dorion, on a purely Reform basis. This Government was, however, forced to resign next year, after which negotiations commenced preparatory to Confederation, which followed in 1867. Mr. Macdonald was never in favour of Confederation. 
