The City Set on a New Basis. All parties were relieved to know that the contentions of the University and city are about to be amicably settled.

The Patriotic Course. The quantity of bonded freight passing from one United States point through Canada to another point in the United States is estimated to be \$1,000,000,000.

These figures may or may not be correct. If they are, they show that if Canada has built up the United States exports of Boston and Portland the States are contributing to the maintenance of Canadian railways.

The announcement is made that the Treasurers of the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec are to visit Ottawa next month for the settlement of the financial difficulties between the Dominion Government and the old provinces of Canada.
