TOWN OF BOWMANVILLE.

ITS EXTENSIVE AND THRIVING MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES.

A Rich Farming Surrounding—An Old V. K. Loyal Settlement—Part of the Capital of the United States of North America and Ontario.

Leaving Ontario to the west, Bowmanville is an important manufacturing town in the County of Durham, 45 miles east of Toronto and 35 miles west of Cobourg.

The town is built on a beautiful elevation, the land inclining both to the east and west from a central point of view.

The first settlers were U. E. Loyalists from the Susquehanna Valley, United States, who came in 1784 attracted by the proclamation of Governor Simcoe.

In 1838 Bowmanville had its name established when erected into a separate municipality as a police village.

The Bowmanville Medical Hall was established over a quarter of a century ago by Stott & Co.

Two years ago the school-house was burned down and the schools are in temporary quarters pending the erection of new buildings.

The business part is compactly built, chiefly of brick and heavy square appearance, and its streets are familiar in every part of the Dominion.
