





THE BYLAW VOTE AND ITS RESULTS

The defeat of the five bylaws on Wednesday last created a very disagreeable sensation in the City Hall yesterday. The wiping out of the General Improvement Bylaws means that the reconstruction of the Jarvis street sewer, \$500,000; the laying of stone street crossings, \$15,000; the construction of stone kerbs, \$500; the purchase of additional land for Berkeley street fire hall, \$280,000; and the cobble stone paving of St. Andrew's Market court-yard, \$300, will all have to be dropped, making a total of \$1,630,000 as a minimum. But the balance, \$119,233, will have to be met either by loan or other special means in the course of the year.

The items comprising the \$1,630,000 are \$107,725 for the opening of a street from St. George's street into Queen's Park under agreement; the cost of completing the University creek sewer, \$30,250; the extension of Front street sewer, \$100,000; the completion of contract work in Cowan-avenue, College-street, Ossington-avenue, Yorkville, and other streets; the completion of the new police station for over the City; additional land for Ossington-avenue Police Station; and the completion of the new drill shed, \$41,000; improvements to lot, \$14,000; and final additions, etc., \$119,233. It is not one instance of the above is it possible for the city to delay work for a few months.

Park Improvements. Then comes the second detailed bylaw for park improvements. The total asked was \$24,000, of which but one item, \$14,000, for Island Park and what will stand. This was originally \$30,000, but it was cut down by \$6,000. No further work will be done in improving Stanley, High, Riverside and Exhibition Parks, or in completing the new park. THE PARK READER'S FEED

The Police Magistrate decides that Campbell must retract his language. Col. Denison said that the bylaw under which proceedings were instituted was not framed with the object of depriving any citizen of the right of free speech, but there was a limit to all things and this limit ought to be clearly defined. Col. Denison quoted several extracts from the address of Mr. Campbell as delivered in the Queen's Park, and held that the language was indecent and obscene, as alleged by the prosecution. He continued: The language before me is very offensive to any Catholic who might happen to hear the address of Mr. Campbell, and he has no right to do so. He has no right to do so. At the same time they were not deprived of the right of public speech. There were no words in which they could speak, and any person wishing to do so must do so in a proper manner, and without using any language which would be offensive to any person. It was quite different, however, when a man endeavored to force his particular views on the public and, to accomplish his object, used a public park for the purpose, using language that was sure to offend a considerable number of his hearers. Such language as that used by the defendant was eminently calculated to be offensive to at least some of those who had a perfect right to enjoy the advantages of a public park without being subjected to an annoyance in the shape of indecent and obscene language. Although Mr. Campbell might be seen acting with the purest motives, yet if his course of action was calculated to give offence to many of those who happened to be in the park the action was not justifiable. The decision will have the effect of causing other Queen's Park speakers to modify their language.

CITIZEN DUAL TO WALK THE PARK

Now that "Jumbo" Campbell has been disposed of it is understood that Citizen Duval is to be the next Queen's Park orator who will have to walk the plank before the Police Magistrate in connection with his Sunday utterances. It is claimed that Duval's speeches are equally as offensive as those of Campbell, and even more blasphemous, and the morality department will put the short-hand reporter on to him.

BLEW UP THE STORE

A Clerk's Carelessness Causes a Powder Explosion. LIVERPOOL, N.S., Aug. 7.—A terrible explosion occurred here at 8 o'clock this morning. James Warman, a clerk in Colm Campbell's hardware store set fire to some powder which was split on the floor and ran quickly to the keg, which was closed by a bung. Another keg, which was also full of powder, exploded, blowing the front and side into the street. Fire at once started, but was soon out. Mr. Warman and his wife were in the store at the time, and were badly burned. Loss about \$1000.

CHASPED BY A SEVERED HAND

BRAZIL, Aug. 7.—Friday, June 30, Frederick Miller and David Heller, two employees at the furnace at the rolling mills, were killed by a premature explosion of dynamite powder while blasting out a tunnel from the bottom of the furnace. Miller was standing over the dynamite when it exploded, and the explosion was so violent that he was blown into the air and his body was scattered in all directions. Heller was also killed. The bodies were recovered and buried. The cause of the explosion is being investigated.
