



New York, Jan.26.—Further heavy liquidation in the industrials upset the whole stock market this morning. Whisky and sugar were the sensational features. Commission houses sold the stuff as if a general house cleaning was going on all over the street. Speculators hurt in the smash-up of the industrials' quotations were obliged to liquidate other accounts, and as a result the whole general market went to pleces, but in the afternoon there was a sharp rally which carried the industrials upward somewhat, and the rest of the market sympathixing with the advance. Whatever short interest there may have been in the market seemed to be pretty thoroughly eliminated on this advance. The rise was the result of desperate manipulation on the part of two or three pools which have been suffering agonies during the last week or two. So far as the industrials are concerned it looks to us as if on rallies such as occurred to-day the market is a sure sale. The recent capers cut by the trust stocks dispose of all possibility of outside patronage or support in such stocks. More than that there are suggestions that perhaps all has not yet been exposed which is known of the unfortunate situation in the inside of some of these stocks.
