♀ VENUS.—January 1st Venus sets 4h. 51m. A., and will be an Evening Star until the end of August. It will be in conjunction with the Sun September 23, and a Morning Star after the end of the month. In April, May and June it will be above the horizon from about two to three hours after sunset, and in November and December from three to four hours before sunrise. August 19th and October 30th Venus will be at its greatest brilliancy.

♂ MARS—will be a Morning Star until about the second week in November, and an Evening Star the remainder of the year. From January to the end of June it rises between midnight and sunrise—from the beginning of July to about the 10th November between sunset and midnight, and will be above the horizon throughout the greater portion of each night from the beginning of September to the end of December.

♃ JUPITER—will be an Evening Star until the beginning of February, and in conjunction with the Sun on the 8th. It rises on the 1st March 6h. 9m. M.; will be a Morning Star until the 1st September, and again an Evening Star during the remainder of the year. In August and September Jupiter will be the longest time above the horizon between early evening and sunrise.

♄ SATURN.—Until the middle of March Saturn will be an Evening Star, and in conjunction with the Sun on the 26th. It rises on the 16th April about half an hour before sunrise, and will be a Morning Star until the 4th October, when it rises 5h. 47m. A., and souths 11h. 56m. After that it will be an Evening Star. From the middle of August to the 15th October, (when it sets about an hour before sunrise), Saturn will be above the horizon throughout each night.

M., in Longitude 64° 30' E., and Latitude 7° 45' N. Ends on the Earth, 10h. 32m. M., in Longitude 47° 18' E., and Latitude 11° 20' N.

II.—An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, July 19, 1879, invisible at Halifax.

Begins on the Earth, July 19, 1879, 1h. 56m. M., Mean Time at Halifax, in Longitude 5° 13' W of Greerwich, and Latitude 10° 32' N. Central Eclipse begins 2h. 59m. M., in Longitude 19° 46' W., and Latitude 7° 44' N. Central Eclipse at Noon, 4h. 55m. M., in Longitude 44° 13' E., and Latitude 12° 18' N. Central Eclipse ends 6h. 41m. M., in Longitude 98° 16' E., and Latitude 23° 18' S. Ends on the Earth, 7h. 44m. M., in Longitude 83° 50' E., and Latitude 20° 31' S.

III.—A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, December 28, 1879, invisible at Halifax.

EXPLANATORY.

Aphelion—that part of a planet's orbit farthest from the Sun.

Perihelion—that part of a planet's orbit nearest the Sun.

Elongation—angular distance of a planet from the Sun, as seen from the Earth.

Penumbra—a partial shadow resulting from the diminished light of the sun to the earth or moon, during a solar or lunar eclipse, appearing as partial.

Declination—the distance of a heavenly body from the equinoctial line.

Ecliptic—the plane of the earth's orbit nearest the sun.

JANUARY.—In these foot notes for farmers we endeavour to indicate briefly, each month, the more important matters to be attended to during the month, not only on the farm, but also in connection with the general advancement of Agriculture by the operations of Societies and Clubs. There should be a Farmers' Club meeting at least once a month in every Agricultural district. One of the most necessary "operations" of a farmer this month is to take stock. This may be done by taking a large sheet of ruled paper and placing on one side a statement of the value of the live stock and produce of all kinds in the barn and elsewhere, implements, sums collectable for produce sold during year, &c., to which may be added the increase in annual value by estimate of land seeded down, but from which a crop has not yet been obtained. On the other side a statement is to be made of

debts due and liabilities of all kinds. The difference between the total amounts on each page will show the amount of capital invested on the farm. If the farmer is himself owner of the land, its value will have to be added, minus mortgages or other incumbrances. In order to show the results of the past year's operations, it will be necessary to take another sheet, and, in like manner, place on one side a statement of all payments for seed, manure, implements, feed, wages for labour, insurance, rent or interest, &c., and on the other page a statement of cash received or due for produce of all kinds sold within the year, or used in the farmer's family. Add to this latter list the increased value of the farm, and the difference between the two totals will indicate the profit or loss on the year's operations. Every farmer who takes an observation of this kind on the first day of January will have

MARCH.—It is too early to commence field operations beyond the carting out of manure and preparing and placing stuff for fencing, but a good deal of work may now be done in the garden. This is hot-bed month, and how to make a hot-bed is a secret worth knowing. Select a sheltered spot, protected from animals, lying to the sun, and not far from a well or water butt. Build on this space a neat pile of manure, of such a size that when the frame is put on top, there will be a clear foot of manure outside all round. Cow manure will not heat at this season. Horse manure will not heat at this season, if the animal has not been fed upon oats or some kind of grain. Keeping these facts in view you can select your manure, or make such a mixture as will give the degree of heat required. Spread over the manure, inside

the frame, about four or five inches of very fine soil; this should have been prepared in the Fall, and kept dry under cover all winter,—otherwise it is likely now to be a hard frozen mass. The glass ashes are then to be put on and kept close till the hot bed heats; the steam and heat will start the seeds of weeds, which may be allowed to grow. Air is then given, and when the heat modifies, weed and rake the surface and sow your spring seeds,—cauliflowers, cabbages, celery, tomatoes, &c., for the kitchen garden; and stocks, verbenas, petunias, asters, balsams, and such like annuals for flower-garden ornament. The seeds will bear a good deal of heat before they emerge from the soil, but as soon as the first leaves begin to appear the frame must be aired daily, taking care to avoid cold draughts.

taking the place of ploughs for turning up the land in spring. Every farmer should pride himself in raising his own wheat. Should the season prove early, and the soil be in a condition to admit of cultivation, all those crops that do not suffer from early spring frosts and require a long season, or the cool weather of spring, for their successful culture, should now be put in. The crops that especially require early sowing are peas, broadbeans, parsnips, onions, carrots. Towards the close of the month, the fields generally may be in a condition for working. Field peas, horse beans, tares, oats, and wheat should be put in as early as possible. Wherever the land is dry potatoes cannot be put in too soon. The gardens should be gone over, and all small fruits, such as currants, gooseberries, strawberries, raspberries, &c., carefully dressed. If manured the previous fall so much the better.

Impatiens, Solanum robustum and marginatum, Melianthus major, Ricinus gigantea, R. Duchess of Edinburgh, R. Bourbonensis and R. sanguineus, Phormium Tenax (New Zealand Flax), Arundo Donax variegata, Puccinia japonica, Cannabis sativa (Hemp), Chilian Beet, Zea variegata (striped maize), Cannas Imperator, tricolor, Rendalleri, Ancei and gigantea. The Garden is opened to the public early in May and continues open as long as the weather permits in the Fall.

JUNE.—All seed crops not yet committed to the soil should be put in without delay. After the 1st day of June it is not too early to sow any kind of seed suitable for our climate. The drill crops put in during April and May will now require attention, first in the way of hand hoeing, where this has to be done, and secondly by the use of the horse hoe or cultivator. to be planted or sown. Put out cabbages and caul flowers, but only in soil that has been well worked and well enriched. The *Haltica*, or turnip flea, is the great enemy of the cabbage; all efforts at his destruction have failed, and the only effective way of waging war with him is to treat him generously by sowing, between the cabbage rows, common white mustard, the young seedling plants of which are far more palatable than cabbage. Tomatoes also may be set out later in the month. Ground cherries do best when they come up from seed in the soil, which they will do for years. Finish planting everything now in field and garden, such as Indian corn, hush and pole beans, cucumbers, squashes, cauliflowers. Tender plants may now be put out in the flower beds. Do not touch strawberry plants, fly weeds, or horehound, and do not now hoe around raspberry canes, otherwise the fruit will not form.

Celery may be planted out at the end of the month. If there are still any "farmers" in the Province who are not members of an Agricultural Society, or if no such Society exists in their district, then the duty devolves upon them this month of joining a Society or organizing a new one. There can be no general progress among our farmers without co-operation, for the obtaining of suitable thorough-bred animals of the very highest class is beyond the reach of individuals. The reason attention is called to the matter this month is that a new Society desiring to participate in the Legislative grant-in-aid requires to send in the declaration required by Sec. 13 of the Act *before the first day of July*.

month of seed-time, yet Turnip sowing may still be done. Some even prefer to sow their Swedes this month, and the soft Turnips for immediate feeding need not necessarily be sown till the end of July. The ground should have undergone a thorough pulverization. Light sandy soil is the best for Turnips. They start best after the ground is warm, but the bulbs swell most rapidly during the cool dewy nights of Autumn. The soil must be worked to a deep or made too fine for Turnips. Town manures are valued for this crop, and crushed bones have been applied with the best effect, either when covered in the drills in the manner of ordinary dung, or sown by machine along with the seeds, so as to be in

Immediate contact with the latter. Guano has been largely used of late years. Superphosphate is very efficacious. One point of Turnip culture that is often neglected in Nova Scotia, although well understood elsewhere, is that the seed should be put in the moment the soil is prepared. If the earth of the prepared drill gets dried up in the sun before the seed is committed to it, how can the latter be expected to germinate. Hoeing and weeding of all drill crops should be carried on actively this month and completed before haying time. Get your haying apparatus and implements in order. Get the kitchen and flower gardens in good order before haying begins, as there will be "no time" then.

are working into a mixed husbandry, so that cattle may not be fed on hay all winter and pastured in summer, but fed in winter on straw and roots and coarse grain, and in summer partially or wholly on green fodder in-doors. This is the only way to enrich a farm, or to attain to anything like high farming. We therefore recommend our readers to note at this season how convenient it is to have a field of tares or green oats or barley or Indian corn or rape, or any other green eatable thing for the cattle to grow or fatten upon when the pastures are all burnt up. After haying there will be work in the garden and especially in the orchard. Look after the ripening fruit, destroy caterpillars, if any still remain; pick the early August apples, and send them into market. When the rains come, beds of strawberries may be made up. See that the ground is well drained and enriched with old manure. Mushrooms now appear in the horse pastures.





SEPTEMBER. - It is the duty of every farmer in the Province to visit the Annual Agricultural Exhibition, and to take his family with him, in order that they may realize the advices that are being made in the culture of the soil, and the improvement of farm animals. Those enterprising farmers who are looking forward to taking prizes at the Fall Exhibition will now be busy with their live stock. Feed is the main thing to fit an animal for Exhibition, but there are other matters to be attended to as well, such as careful grooming and kindly treatment. It will be proper now to estimate what stock should be kept during the ensuing winter, so that any surplus may be sold off, either in present condition or after being fattened off with some extra feed, which is easily accomplished at this season on waste material, when grain is being cleaned and roots taken up. Sheep should be dipped or washed with some suitable sheep dip, if there is any appearance of ticks,





as the eggs hatch out in winter time and the young ticks are very troublesome to the sheep, causing loss not on y of wool, but of condition and health. It is a good plan to wash or smear twice a year, in Spring when the wool is taken off, and in Fall when the eggs are being laid in the wool. A good smear may be made with butter and sulphur.

OCTOBER.—This is the happiest month for the farmers, for in it they gather in the crops, which are the most anxious objects of their cares. Roots ought to be cultivated on every farm to a much larger extent than they are at the present time in Nova Scotia. We say nothing about grain, because every farmer is likely to look after that, and harvest it carefully. But in regard to root crops there is a good deal of misconception. To take up and store roots successfully is a simple

art when properly understood, but the frequent destruction of roots in the cellar shows that it is not always understood or carried out. Potatoes should be dug in dry weather, and allowed to dry completely on the surface before being put together in heaps or in the cellar; the best way is to put them on a barn floor and exclude the light, otherwise they will become green and acquire a bitter taste and poisonous qualities. Mangels, turnips and carrots should be topped and the fine root fibres cut off. Before storing they should, in like manner, be exposed to dry air that the wounds may heal over; if put at once into the cellar, the wounded tissue will begin to ferment, and a large portion of the roots will be rotted by contact. If facts such as these are kept clearly in view, no farmer need lose his roots. Of course the cellar must be kept well aired and dry, and frost carefully excluded.

NOVEMBER.—The improvement of cattle has at length taken a secure hold of the people of Nova Scotia. This improvement is being carried out principally through the agency of Agricultural Societies. These Societies are apt to forget that their arrangements for the ensuing season, in regard to animals, are most profitably made at this time of year. Every society keeps, or ought to keep, a sufficient number of male animals for the use of members. If the selection and purchase of these be deferred till Spring time, large prices have to be paid, and the demand is usually so great that suitable animals cannot be obtained. For beef cattle the Short Horn Durham breed is the best; their growth is more rapid than that of any other kind. For milk alone, Ayrshires are to be preferred, Devons make the best working oxen, are quick, active, and easily fed, and soon fatten in the wild

pastures for beef. For domestic cows in the city the creamy Alderneys or Jerseys are most suitable. As soon as the root crops are all cleared off the fields, and the weeds and potato vines are put in heaps to rot, the farmer should employ his whole strength of man and beast in fall ploughing. Whether on old or new land, fall ploughing is a most important operation. Without it a farm cannot be worked to advantage. After ploughing, do not forget to go carefully over the water furrows to make way for the exit of the floods of rain and melting snows that are sure to soak your fields before seed time. A well ploughed, well drained, field may be sown in Spring as soon as the frost is gone, whilst one that is irregularly ploughed, or has no water furrows, may long remain a puddle, defying every attempt to improve its condition. The best part of what is too often left to be "Spring work" is done in the month of November. All land intended for oats, peas, and horse beans should be effectively worked this month.

These societies are organized under the Central Board of Agriculture, and each Society is entitled to draw from the Provincial Treasury, (through the Board), an annual grant in aid to promote its operations. The special purpose of a Society is to improve the live stock of its district, which is accomplished by obtaining and keeping for the use of Members superior male animals, such as bulls, rams and boars, Societies

This Court and the Exchequer Court were organized under the provisions of 38 Vic., cap. 11.

The Supreme Court has both original and appellate jurisdiction—Original, as to (1) habeas corpus in criminal and extradition cases; (2) judicial opinions to the Crown; (3) private bills and petitions therefor referred by the Senate of House of Commons; and (4) civil suits in which the validity of a Dominion or Provincial Act is questioned. Appellate, in appeals (1) from the Exchequer Court; (2) from the Provincial Courts; (3) in habeas corpus cases; and (4) in election cases.

THE EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court has original jurisdiction (1) in revenue cases, (2) in civil suits when the Crown for the Dominion is plaintiff, (3) controversies between the Dominion and the Province, or between two Provinces.

The Judges and officers are the same as in the Supreme Court.

**GEORGE'S ISLAND**, west side of Island, Halifax Harbor, lat 44° 38' 30" N., lon 63° 33' 20" W., two fixed white catoptric lights, vertical, 20 feet apart, 50 and 30 feet high, drab square building, 21 feet high. GUYSBORO' HARBOR, W. side of entrance, near Peart Point, Chedabucto Bay, lat 45° 22' 50" N., lon 61° 29' 10" W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 8 miles, 30 feet high, white square wooden building, height 20 feet. Lighted 1864.

SHELburne HARBOUR.—A red Iron Can Buoy has been placed in 44 fathoms, on west side of Middle Rock Shoal; a red Can Buoy off extreme of Spit, in four fathoms, and a black Spar Buoy on east end of Adamant Shoal.

BULL ROCK, a Spar Buoy painted black has been placed in 10 fathoms water S. S. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., about 150 yards from the Bull Rock, off Western Head, Shelburne County.

CAPE ROSEWAY, near south-east point of MacNutt's Island, Shelburne harbor, lat 43° 37' 15" N., lon 65° 15' 45" W., 2 white catoptric lights, vertical, 21 yards apart, upper light visible 18 miles, and 120 feet high, lower 65 feet and visible 10 miles, octagonal building, vertical black and white stripes, height 77 feet. Lighted 1788, repaired 1858. A black Can Buoy S. S. E. from the Jig Rocks, in 9 fathoms water.

NEGRO ISLAND, on north side, lat 43° 30' 54" N., lon 65° 20' 58" W., red and white catoptric light, revolving every minute, visible 12 miles, 43 feet high, white square wooden building, height 29 feet. Lighted 1872. For guiding vessels in and out of Clyde River or Negro Harbor.

BACCARO, on west side of entrance to Barrington Harbor, lat 43° 26' 54" N., lon 65° 28' 12" W., fixed red catoptric light, visible 10 miles, 49 feet high, white square building, with black ball seaward, height 35 feet. Lighted 1850. A Spar Buoy to the south of Bantam.

BARRINGTON E. BAY LIGHTSHIP, lat 43° 31' 5" N., lon 65° 34' 25" W., fixed white light, hull and spars painted red, with word "Barrington" in white letters on both sides. Height 30 feet above deck. Moored in 6 fathoms at low water. Wessels' Lodge bearing S. W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., distant 3.8 mile, Paecaro Light bearing S. S. E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E., distant 6 and 3.16 miles, and Bantam Rocks, bearing S. E. by E. 7-8 E., distant  $6\frac{1}{2}$  miles. To guide vessels into Barrington East Bay, and through Barrington Passage. Lighted 1875. A red Can Buoy on Angle Rock.

CAPE TABLE, on Cape, lat 43° 23' 19" N., lon. 65° 37' 11" W., white catoptric revolving light, bright 15 seconds, dark 25 seconds, visible 12 miles, 53 feet high, white octagonal building, 50 feet high. Lighted 1861. A steam fog whistle on Cape, elevated about 40 feet above high water, sounds in thick weather, fogs and snow storms, a blast of ten seconds' duration each minute, with an interval of 50 seconds between each blast.

BRAZIL ROCK, red and black buoy, horizontal stripes, moored in 15 fathoms water, S. S. E., half a mile from Rocks.

STODDART ISLAND, on N. W. point of island, lat 43° 28' 39" N., lon 65° 43' 10" W., fixed red catoptric light, visible 9 miles, 22 feet high, white small square tower. To guide vessels into the anchorage of Stoddart Harbor and Shag Harbor Sound.

E., before it can be steered for to avoid shoal spot off St. Ann's Point. Spar buoys mark the channel. Black left on port hand, red on starboard in approaching the harbor.

TUSKET RIVER, Big Fish Island, south-west point, lat  $43^{\circ} 42' 10''$  N., lon  $65^{\circ} 57' 15''$  W., 2 fixed white catoptric lights, horizontal, 8 yards apart, visible 12 miles, 50 feet high, white square wooden building, height 23 feet. Visible seaward; in windows each end of a dwelling house. Lighted 1864.

WESTPORT, Peter's Island, entrance to Grand Passage, lat 44° 15' 30'' N., lon 66° 20' 20'' W., 2 fixed white catoptric lights, horizontal, 24 feet apart, visible 10 miles, each 40 feet high, square white building, height 15 feet. Lighted 1850. Visible from the northward between the bearings of S. by W. and S. S. W., and from the southward between the bearings of N. E. by E. and N. N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. Bell Buoy painted red, north side of N. W. Ledge.

BRIER ISLAND, north-west Point, lat 44° 14' 57'' N., lon 66° 23' 30'' W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 13 miles, 92 feet high, white octagonal building, height 55 feet. Lighted 1809. A steam fog whistle on N. W. of Brier Island, south side of light house, sounds during thick and foggy weather and snow storms as follows:—Blast of four seconds, interval four seconds, blast of four seconds, interval of four seconds, blast of four seconds, interval of forty seconds—making sixty seconds. The Bell Buoy placed on the North-West Ledge, off Brier Island, drifted from its moorings and was washed ashore and destroyed in a gale in December last. A spar bell buoy was moored in its place in January, and has remained in position ever since.

BOAR'S HEAD, 17 yards from edge of cliff, lat 44° 24' 16'' N., lon 66° 13' W., red and white catoptric light, revolving alternately every minute, visible 14 miles, 70 feet high, white square building. Lighted 1864. On south entrance to Petit Passage.

POINT PRIM, south point of entrance to Annapolis Basin, lat 44° 41' 34'' N., lon 65° 47' 20'' W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 13 miles, 76 feet high, square tower, vertical red and white stripes, height 22 feet. Lighted 1817. Fog whistle on Prim Point sounds in snow storms and in thick or foggy weather 8 seconds in each minute, making an interval of 52 seconds between each blast.

MARSHALL COVE or PORT WILLIAMS, south shore, lat 44° 56' 52'' N., lon 65° 16' W., 2 fixed white catoptric lights, vertical, 20 feet apart, upper 66 feet high, visible 10 miles, white square building, height 22 feet. Lighted 1859. Lantern on top of dwelling; lower light in bow window, visible from W. S. W. round N. to E. N. E.

MARGARETVILLE, on extremity of point, south shore, lat 45° 2' 57'' N., lon 65° 4' W., two fixed red catoptric lights, 30 and 27 feet high, visible 8 miles, square building, horizontal white and black stripes, height 22 feet. Lighted 1859. Visible from W. S. W. round N. to E. N. E.

BLACK ROCK, south shore, lat 45° 10' 10'' N., lon 64° 46' W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 12 miles, 45 feet high, square white building, height 35 feet. Lighted 1848. Light on top of dwelling, visible from all points of approach. A fog whistle on the extreme point of Cape d'Or, on the opposite side of the channel from Black Rock, sounds during thick weather, fogs and snow storms, twice in each minute, each blast being of six seconds duration, with intervals of 24 seconds between. The whistle will probably be heard in calm weather, or with the wind, at a distance of 20 miles, and in stormy weather, or against the wind, from 5 to 8 miles, according to the state of the atmosphere.

PARSBORO', or Partridge Island, west side of river, lat 45° 23' N., lon 64° 19' W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 9 miles, 37 feet high, white square building, height 32 feet. Lighted 1852. Lantern on dwelling.

SPENCER POINT, on north shore, Cobequid Bay, lat 45° 23' 30" N., lon 63° 37' W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 6 miles, 35 feet high, window in building 20 feet high. Lighted 1863.

APPLE RIVER, on Cape Cap'ston or Hetty Point, north entrance, lat 45° 28' 20" N., lon 64° 51' 30" W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 12 miles, 64 feet high, building white, oblong, with tower, height 45 feet. Lighted 1870. Rebuilt about 33 yards S S E. from old one.

NEW BRUNSWICK.—BAY OF FUNDY.

HILLSBORO' WHARF, Petitcodiac River, lat 45° 55' 15" N, lon 64° 37' 45" W, fixed white catoptric light, visible 5 miles, 14 feet high, structure open frame, height 22 feet. Lighted 1875. To guide vessels going up the river and to the coal and plaster wharves.

GRINDSTONE, west part of island, lat 45° 43' 13" N, lon 64° 37' 25" W, fixed white catoptric light, visible 12 miles, 60 feet high, octagonal white tower. Lighted 1854. Visible from N E by E, round by N to E by S, or 215°. Cape Enrage light house, S W by W ¼ W, about 10 miles.

CAPE ENRAGE, pitch of Cape, lat 45° 35' 31" N, lon 54° 46' 55" W, fixed white dioptric light, 4th order, visible 15 miles, 120 feet high, square white building, height 23 feet. Lighted 1840. Visible between the bearings of N W round by S to N E. A steam fog whistle, 150 feet N E from the light house, sounds during thick weather 4 seconds in each minute. Will probably be heard in calm weather 10 miles, and in stormy weather from 3 to 5 miles.

QUACO, small rock off head, lat 45° 19' 20" N, lon 65° 31' 55" W, white catoptric light, revolving every 20 seconds, visible 15 miles, 58 feet high, octagonal building, horizontally striped red and white, height 46 feet. Lighted 1835. A fog bell in a framed tower on the light house block strikes every 12 seconds during thick and foggy weather and snow storms. Under favorable circumstances it should be heard two or three miles, and in stormy weather, or against the wind, about a mile.

CAPE SPENCER, pitch of Cape, lat 45° 12' 30" N, lon 65 54 W, red and white catoptric light, alternating every 45 seconds, visible 20 miles, 207 feet high, white square building, with tower, height 35 feet. Lighted 1873. Visible between the bearings from E S E round by S to W N W, Partridge Island light bearing by compass N W by W ¼ W northerly, distant 6½ miles.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND, St. John harbor, lat 45° 14' 20" N, lon 66° 3' 20" W, fixed white catoptric light, visible 20 miles, 119 feet high, building red and white in vertical stripes, height 40 feet. Lighted 1791. In foggy weather a steam whistle sounds for 10 seconds every minute. A bell buoy near E side of Partridge Island Reef.

ST. JOHN HARBOUR, lat 45° 15' 10" N, lon 66° 3' 40" W, white dioptric light, 4th order, visible 10 miles, 35 feet high, building vertical red and white stripes, height 15 feet. Lighted 1828.

LEPREAUX, on Point, lat 45° 3' 40'' N, lon 66° 27' 30'' W, 2 fixed white catoptric lights, vertical, 27 feet apart, visible 15 miles. upper light 81, lower 53 feet high, octagonal building, striped horizontally red and white, height 31 feet. Lighted 1831. Visible between the bearings of W N W around by S to E by N. Fog whistle during fogs and snow storms sounds twice each minute, first giving a blast of 5 seconds' duration, with an interval of 5 seconds, then a blast of 5 seconds duration, with an interval of 45 seconds to complete the minute.

SPRUCE POINT, St Croix River, Charlotte County, lat 45° 10' N, lon 67° 11' W, fixed white catoptric light, 32 feet high, white square building, height 28 feet. Lighted 1876. The course from Spruce Point to ballast ground is E by S ½ S, distance 2 miles. From Spruce Point to Mark Point W N W, distance 2 miles. A vessel after leaving Doucet Island, to clear the reef, should steer N until the Spruce Point light bears N W by W, and thence take a W N W course.

Lighted 1876. A bar extends E N E from light house, and vessels require to keep off a distance of 260 yards to clear it at low water.

DREW'S HEAD, on W side of Beaver Harbour, Charlotte County, lat 45° 3' 45'' N, lon 66° 44' W, fixed white catoptric light, visible 10 miles, 45 feet high, white square wooden building, height 36 feet. Lighted 1875. Seen at all points between eastern and western heads of harbor.

BLISS ISLAND, W end of Island, S side of western entrance to Bliss Harbor, lat 45° 1' 15'' N, lon 66° 51' W, fixed red catoptric light, visible 12 miles, 45 feet high, white square wooden building, height 30 feet. Lighted 1871.

CAMPORFELLO ISLAND, N point of Head Harbor, lat 44° 57' 40'' N, lon 66° 54' 10'' W, fixed white catoptric light, visible 15 miles, 64 feet high, white octagonal tower with red cross, height 34 feet. Lighted 1829. This light enables vessels to enter Head Harbor at all times. It is also a guide to vessels entering the main channel, to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy.

PORT ST. ANDREWS, N point of entrance, lat 45° 4' 10'' N, lon 67° 2' 50'' W, fixed white catoptric light, 42 feet high, visible 10 miles, white octagonal building, height 22 feet. Lighted 1833. Visible between the bearings of N W by N, and S E by S.

PORT ST. ANDREW'S, on sand reef at E entrance, lat 45° 3' 45'' N, lon 67° 0' 50'' W, fixed white catoptric light, visible 10 miles, 40 feet high, structure white, square, wood, on a framed pier, height 10 feet. Lighted 1875. To guide to all ports in inner bay, and to vessels going up the River St. Croix from Little Passage or West Quoddy. There is only a depth of 4 feet of water on the N W extension of the reef towards main land.

SOUTH WEST WOLF ISLAND, on S E point of the island, lat 44° 56' 30'' N, lon 66° 44' 10'' W, white catoptric light, revolving every ¼ minute, visible 17 to 20 miles, 111 feet high, building white, square, wood, height 35 feet. Lighted 1871. Lantern on dwelling; visible from all points of approach.

A spindle beacon, painted red, placed in 1876 on Old Proprietor Ledge, on the S E of Grand Manan Island, in lat 44° 33' 10" N, lon 66° 42' W, has a cage elevated 31 feet above high water mark, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance from 8 or 10 miles.

Lighted 1831. A gun is fired to answer signals during fogs and snow storms. Dangerous rocks extend 4 miles eastward of the light house. Fixed light 45 seconds, eclipse  $5\frac{1}{2}$  seconds, flash  $4\frac{1}{2}$  seconds, eclipse  $5\frac{1}{2}$  seconds—making 60 seconds.

SABLE ISLAND.

SABLE ISLAND, west end, lat 43° 57' N., lon 60° 8' W., white catoptric revolving light, revolves in three minutes, showing three flashes at intervals of half a minute, then a cessation of light during  $1\frac{1}{2}$  minute in each revolution, visible 18 miles, 123 feet high, white octagonal wooden building, height 98 feet. Lighted 1873. Steam fog whistle discontinued from July 1st, 1878.

SABLE ISLAND,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile from east end, lat 43° 58' 30" N., lon 59° 46' W., fixed white dioptric light, 2nd order, visible 18 miles, 128 feet high, octagonal building, white and brown alternately, height 86 feet. Lighted 1873.

Money Order Offices.

The Halifax Post Office, and the Offices in the above list marked in italics, are Money Order Offices, and are authorized to issue Orders payable at any Money Order Office in the Dominion of Canada, Newfoundland, the United Kingdom or British India.

Minor Post Offices.

In addition to the above, there are upwards of seven hundred minor Post Offices, and Way or Sub-Post Offices in the different Counties of the Province.

Principal Rates of Postage.

LETTERS.

To places within the Dominion of Canada, 3 cents per half oz. each. Letters paid less than one rate will not be forwarded. Other short paid letters will be taxed with double the amount of the deficient postage.

To Newfoundland, 5 cents per half oz. each, which must be prepaid.

To Bermuda, via Halifax, 6 cents per half oz. each, which must be prepaid.

To West Indies, and British Guiana, via Halifax, 12 cents per half oz. each, which must be prepaid.

To the United States, 3 cents per half oz. each, which must be prepaid.

To the United Kingdom and the Continent of Europe, via Halifax, or by Canadian Packet from Quebec or Portland, or by Packet via N. York, 5 cts. per half oz. each.

To St. Pierre et Miquelon, 5 cents per half oz. each.

On letters posted at an Office to be delivered from it, commonly known as Local or "drop letters," the rate will be 1 cent per 1/2 oz.; to be in all cases prepaid by Postage Stamps affixed to such letter when posted.

Re-directed Letters will be forwarded without any additional charge if not taken from the office or if handed back at the moment of their delivery, but if taken from the office and subsequently re-posted they become subject to a new rate of postage, in default of which they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, Ottawa.

Letters containing coin addressed to the United Kingdom or Foreign Countries will not be forwarded to their destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, Ottawa.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers and periodicals printed and published in Canada may be sent by Post from the Office of publication or news agency at the

rate of 1 cent per lb., to regular subscribers or news agents in Canada, Newfoundland, the United Kingdom or the United States.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals addressed to places in Canada, United States and Newfoundland, will be sent at the rate of one cent per 4 ounces, which must be prepaid by postage stamp. Newspapers and Periodicals weighing less than one ounce may be posted singly, prepaid by postage stamp, one half ct. each.

Newspapers addressed to places in Bermuda, West Indies and British Guiana, must be prepaid by postage stamp, two cents each.

Transient Newspapers addressed to places in the United Kingdom, the Continent of Europe, and St. Pierre et Miquelon, 2 cents per 4 ozs., or fraction thereof; prepayment compulsory.

MISCELLANEOUS MAIL MATTER.

Periodicals, Books, Pamphlets, and occasional Publications, Books and Newspaper Manuscript, Circulars, Prices Current, Hand Bills, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Music, Packages of Seeds, Cuttings, Roots, Scions, Grafts, Botanical Specimens, etc.

To any place in Canada, Newfoundland, the United States, 1 cent per 4 oz. each packet, and to the United Kingdom, the Continent of Europe, and St. Pierre et Miquelon, 2 cents per 2 ozs. Books, Circulars, Music, etc., must be put up open at both ends.

To Bermuda, West Indies, or British Guiana, via Halifax, 6 cents per 4 oz. each packet.

Prepayment of Matter of the above description is in all cases compulsory.

PATTERNS OR SAMPLES OF MERCHANDISE.

Can be forwarded at Book rate to any address in Canada, Newfoundland, St. Pierre et Miquelon, the United Kingdom, and certain British Colonies and Foreign countries, via England. Samples can be forwarded to the United States, but the weight must not exceed 8 oz., the postage on which is 10 cts.; they must also be genuine samples having no value.

PARCELS.

To any place within the Dominion 12½ cents per half pound, which must be prepaid. Parcels must not exceed 5 lbs in weight.

Postage Stamps.

The stamps issued by the Canadian Post Office Department, are of the following denominations, viz.: postage stamps, ½ c., 1 c., 2 c., 3 c., 6 c., 10c., 12½ c. and 15 c.; registered letter stamps, 2 c. and 5 c.

Post Cards are issued at one cent each, and may be sent to any address in Canada or United States. Post Bands are for sale at the rate of \$1.25 per hundred. Post cards are also issued at two cents each for transmission to the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, St. Pierre et Miquelon, and certain foreign countries.

Information in regard to the rates of postage to British Colonies and foreign countries, via England, or the United States, inland and foreign mail connections, the rules governing letters, newspapers, books, periodicals, sample and parcel post, and the transmission of post cards, ships letters, dead letters, franking and free matter, &c., may be obtained at any Post Office.

- “ 2 Do, 1 ball hoisted on the outer halliard and one close up on the inner halliard; outer ball dropped.
- “ 3 Do, 2 balls close up, one on the outer and one on the inner halliard.
- “ 4 Do, 2 balls separated, and one close up on the inner halliard.
- “ 5 Do, a pennant of any colour on the outer halliard, and one ball close up inside
- “ 6 Do, a pennant under a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.
- “ 7 Do, a pennant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.
- “ 8 Do, a pennant under two balls close up on the outer halliards with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

The above balls, &c., are hoisted on the east or west yard arm, according to the *quarter* the vessel first appears in.

When Sailing Vessels are reported from an outpost, the following signals are made on the lower yard, now used exclusively for sailing vessels, as repents :

For a Square Rigged Vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.

A Ship, a large ball at the end of the yard, with a small one at inner halliard.

A Barque, a large do at the end, with a small one dropped at inner halliard.

A Brig, a small one at the end of the yard, and a large one at the inner halliard.

A Brigantine, a cross close up at the outer halliard. Two or more do, a cross half hoisted.

A Topsail Schooner, a cross close up at the inner halliard.

Two or more schooners, a cross inner, half hoisted.

The upper yard of the Ship Staff is used solely to designate Steam Vessels thus :

Two large balls close up, one at the outer and the other at the inner halliard, E or W, a steamer reported in that quarter.

A small ball at the outer, and a large one at the inner halliard, a second class Packet or merchant Steamer.

A large ball at the outer, and a small one at the inner halliard, a Man-of-War Steamer or Royal Mail Steamer, or large Merchant Steamer. Lanterns are hoisted at night to denote a steamer reported.

Red light on outer and white light inner on E. yard-arm denotes Steamer East reported.

Green light outer and white light inner on W. yard-arm—Steamer West reported.

Red light above white, 12 feet apart, mail from England.

Green light above white, 12 feet apart, mail for England.

White light above red, 12 feet apart, Newfoundland mail.

White light above green, 12 feet apart, Bermuda mail.

Green light above red, 12 feet apart, English Man-of-War.

Red, green and white, 12 feet apart, enemy's Man-of-War.

The coloured lantern is always shown at yard-arm, and the white one at the inner halliard, E or W, according to the quarter the Steamer is reported in.

When a Steamer is sighted the inner (white) light is taken down.

Numbers are indicated the same as on the lower yard.

When the description of vessel is ascertained, the following descriptive colors will be hoisted at the masthead, and the inner ball taken down :

A Union Jack—a Flag Ship.

Man-of-War Screw Steamer, a white penant with a blue ball in the centre, over the Union Jack.

Man-of-War Paddle Steamer, a white penant with a blue ball in the centre under the Union Jack.

The enrolled membership has increased with remarkable rapidity, especially in the Counties of Yarmouth, Digby, Annapolis, Colchester, Cumberland, Pictou, Cape Breton and Halifax.
