CATTLE EXCLUSION BILL

PASSES ITS SECOND READING IN THE IMPERIAL HOUSE.

The Measure Means Permanent Exclusion and the Practical Ruin of the Canadian Export Trade of Live Cattle—The House of Lords will Never Repeal It.

London, March 23.—In the House of Commons to-day, Mr. J. M. White, Liberal member for Portland, moved the rejection of the bill amending the Diseases of Animals Act of 1884...

Mr. Robert Johnson Price, member for the East Division of Norfolk, seconded the motion. The speaker, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, said the bill was a serious menace to Canadian trade...

Right Hon. Sir George Trevelyan, who introduced the bill, said that he passed the House would bind its own hands and that the bill was a serious menace to Canadian trade...

The Right Hon. James Bryce, formerly president of the Board of Trade, and the Right Hon. A. J. Mundella, also an ex-president of that body, were among those who opposed the measure.

The motion to reject was defeated by a vote of 241 to 85. Many of the members abstained from voting. The Bill then passed its second reading without a division.

Do the Young Liberals of Toronto—Question Debated Last Night. The Toronto Young Men's Liberal Club last night decided to support Sunday cars.

The question was raised by Mr. J. Tossell, who moved the following resolution: "That this club place on record its opinion that Sunday street cars would be beneficial to the community at large..."

In doing so, Mr. Tossell said that he wanted Sunday cars for two reasons. In the first place, he wished a convenient means of getting to a particular church, which was two miles and a half away from his house...
