SENTRIES STOOD GUARD SUNDAY NIGHT.

No Person Was Permitted to Pass the Lines on Any Pretext.

Hazleton, Sept. 13.—This ominous date stood out on the calendar with conspicuous meaning when those who had managed to steal any sleep awoke this morning.

The first official action of the day was the closing of all the liquor saloons until 4 o'clock this afternoon. This was done after a conference between Mayor Altshuler and Gen. Gobin.

This was done because of the funerals of the ten victims fixed for this morning and the fear of what might develop if the strikers had access to liquor which was wrought up with grief and rage.

The strictest discipline prevailed at the camps of all the regiments. Gen. Gobin is very much displeased at the parade of uniforms in the city.

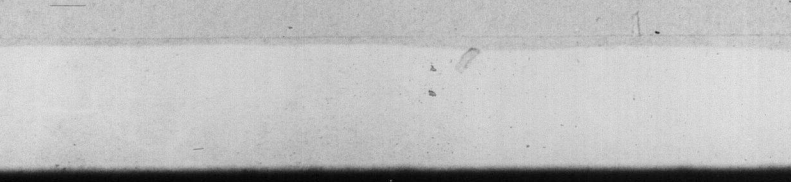

ANOTHER UGLY FAILURE

The Clothing Firm of E. W. Gough, This City and Belleville, in Difficulties.

The most important failure noted for several weeks that of E. W. Gough, the Queen-street clothier. The assignment was made to Mr. E. J. Henderson, who in his possession of the business here and at Belleville. There is likely to be trouble.

First a writ was issued against him on an overdue note, which was arrested on the charge of perjury. A second writ was issued at the instance of H. J. Caulfield & Co., this city, for \$17,000.

Mr. Gough is widely known, having conducted business in both Toronto and Belleville. Since 1888 he has been twice in business difficulties and has effected compromises. In June last he came from Belleville and opened a second store on Queen-street, but an estimate placed the liabilities at about \$35,000, largely owing to Montreal creditors. Assets will probably amount to \$20,000.

Mrs. Gough has a claim for some \$20,000 against the estate, but this would include the amount of paper for which she is liable. The estate of Mr. Gough failed in 1891, when Mrs. Gough had a claim against the estate, which was allowed to stand. It is understood that she holds Mr. Gough's life insurance policies. The failure is probably the indirect result of the writ for \$17,000, which was issued against him by Gough by Messrs. Laidlaw, Knappe & Hickel at the instance of E. Bossman & Co., wholesale clothing store, Front-street east.

James A. Cantle of Montreal has effected a compromise at 20 cents on the dollar. E. G. Crawford, grocer, Fort Erie, has assigned to E. F. Matthews.

The creditors of the estate of N. P. Finch, general merchant, Aylmer, have been notified that the debtors stock has been sold at 65%, and the clothing, boots and shoes at 75%. The creditors will receive about 10 cents on the dollar.

William McKinnon, general stockbroker, Hat Portage, has assigned to Louis Hillard. C. Langford, carriages, Warton, has assigned to D. M. Hillard.

William Mowat, dry goods, Napanea, has compromised at the rate of 25 cents on the dollar. Assignee Barber, who has charge of the estate of Abraham Cohen of Bathurst, has declared a second dividend of 25 cents on the dollar. Mr. Barber will in Buffalo received from the insolvent \$200,000 in securities. It is expected that a further dividend of 10 or 15 cents will be declared.

A writ by Thalhander Bros. & Co. of Montreal for \$8200 has been issued against Stittling & Co., general stockbrokers, of Toronto, who are alleged to have defrauded creditors of the firm was held at Toronto, at which an offer of 30c cash was refused.
