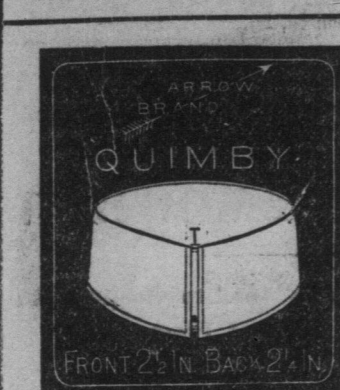

TEAMSTERS ARE UP IN ARMS

Two Hundred Teams May Stop on City Work Because Non-Unionists Are Employed.

Hamilton, June 14.—(Special.)—The Hamilton Teamsters' Union Executive Committee held a meeting this afternoon, and it is said, ordered a strike on city work. About 200 teams are interested. A number of the union stated that the cause of the trouble is the presence on city jobs of five teams belonging to William Milne, a hotel-keeper, who is not a member of the union. These teams were ordered by an alderman, who the foreman protested.

It reviewed the arrangements made between Barton Township and the city to divert the surface water eastward, and showed in effect, that both were responsible for the prevention of overflows. He suggested that the sharp turns in the drain be straightened, and that the cost be equitably borne by the township and city. The township might also be made responsible for the raising or widening of bridges affected by the drainage.

DELAY IS VERY EXPENSIVE

Unless China Settles There Will Be \$10,000,000 a Month Added After July 1.

POWERS HAVE NOT YET AGREED.

Therefore the Method of Paying Has Not Been Fixed—British Proposal Most Likely.

Washington, June 14.—The recent large reduction of the foreign forces in China caused surprise in official quarters, but this reduction is now accounted for by the terms on which the indemnity was made up.

The indemnity remains unsettled on July 1, several of the governments will require \$10,000,000 a month, and their monthly expenses after that time.

The recent changes between the cabinet at Washington and other capitals has not resulted in any agreement on the question of indemnity, and the matter is now committed back to the Ministers at Peking.

FRESH PROPOSALS.

Paris, June 14.—Despatches received here from Peking to-day say the Foreign Ministry is considering fresh proposals from Mr. Rochill, affecting the Chinese indemnity.

The proposals concern matters of indemnity, and may or may not be accepted. But, unless they are disposed of, the Ministers will not pronounce a decision as to the manner in which to pay the indemnity.

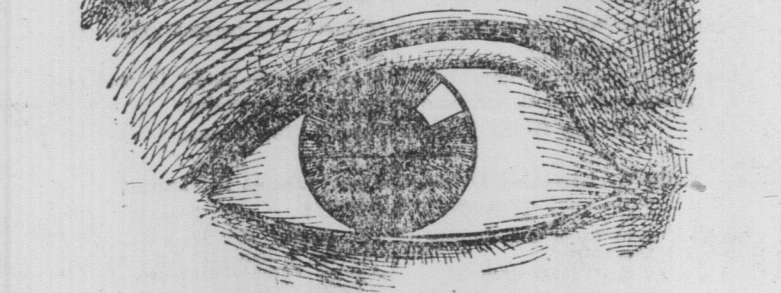

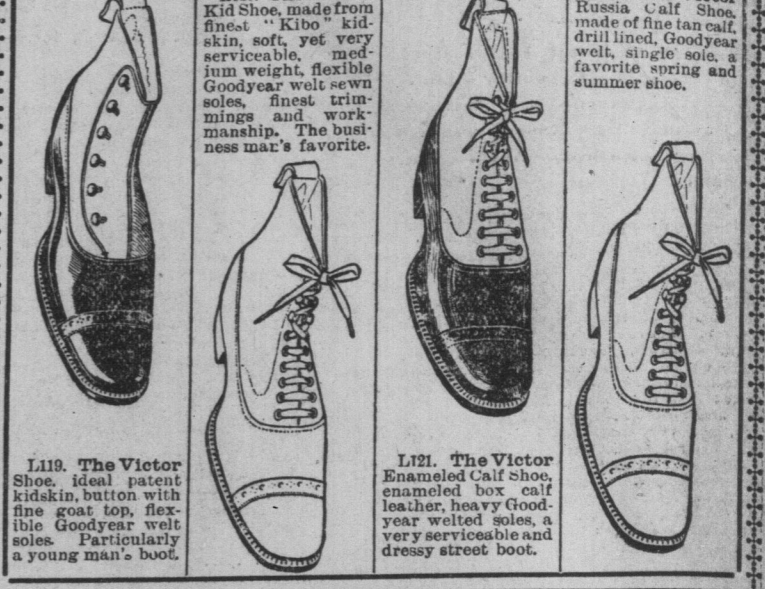
