STUDY OF CRISIS OF 1896

FOSTER SETTLES MULLOCK AND BOWELL FIGHTS IN FAVOR OF PROPOSAL FOR EXPORT DUTY LOCKS

Former Defended Against Charge That He Was One of the Famous "Nest of Traitors."

Ottawa, Feb. 10.—(Special).—For one solid hour to-day the world of common sense was the scene of a wild whirlwind of reminiscences of '96. The squall came up unexpectedly, as the most breezy debates of the house often do come up. When it had spent itself there were left on the pages of Hansard various "hitherto unpublished" chapters in the history of Sir Mackenzie Bowell's brief but tumultuous premiership.

Mr. Martin of Quebec's P.E.I. made an enquiry concerning the mail service between the island and civilization. This enquiry has been made at least a thousand times in the house. It is received as a matter of course, and has ever since broken the very marrow of the answer. But today it provoked an answer, a long and partially irrelevant answer from Sir William Mullock. From this it grew into a debate in which Sir William Mullock and Sir Mackenzie Bowell mixed themselves up in unholy conflict.

Bad Blood Will Out. Obviously there is "bad blood" between Sir William Mullock and George Eulas Foster. St. Petersburg Face to Face With Renewal of Strike

People in Ugly Mood. 30,000 Workmen Out Already and Numbers Likely to Increase—Troops and Police Use Energetic Measures to Prevent Former Tactics.

Moscow, Feb. 10.—A remarkable session of resolutions was passed at a conference here to-day of physicians, residing in the government of Moscow. These, which will be presented to the Moscow zemstvo, endorsed the demands which the St. Petersburg workmen formulated Jan. 27 and expressed indignation at the method of the bureaucracy, "whose aim is the suppression by violence of all attempts of the nation to secure political liberty."

HE CANNOT GET INTO JAIL

AS MASS GOVT. PROTECTS SIR WILFRID DENIES CHARGE BRODEUR NOT HIS EMISSARY

Points to Procedure He is Sworn to Observe, and Mr. English Must Appeal to Caesar.

Ottawa, Feb. 10.—(Special).—Quebec's political crisis, with its federal ramifications, was brought to the attention of the house by Dr. Mowbray and Dr. Leonard Dr. Leonard referred to the mission of Hon. ARMIES CLOSELY IN TOUCH

Both Japs and Russians Fortify and Refortify and Harass Each Other.

Headquarters of the Russian Army, Peking, Feb. 10.—At present the attention of the Japanese is mainly concentrated on the narrow line east and west of the railway, which also passes the two main roads to Mukden. The armies are closely in touch at the line of Sandaigu, Fachingtung, Chienchiang, Lanchangtung and Shikhe. The region is entirely deserted by natives, but their stone houses and walled villages have been turned into veritable fortresses. The districts have been left almost uninhabited, except without obstructions. The approaches to the streets of the villages can be swept by machine guns hidden behind thick walls.

Notwithstanding the numbers of the Chinese, the Japanese are not slackening their energy in strengthening their positions. They are working in the face of the Russian batteries, and at night the loud noise of unloading of carts gives evidence of their unrelenting efforts.

The Russians are equally persistent, and besides harassing the Japanese, they are fortifying and refortifying. The Japanese continue to work in the face of the Russian lines and these papers are also being distributed by Chinese in the streets of Mukden.

Disgraceful Condition of Streets. Our city streets, paradoxical as it may seem, are "hot stuff" for teams, these days. Yesterday traffic was delayed on York-street, quite a while, and a whole string of cars piled up, through the upsetting of a large Grand Trunk lorry loaded with boxes and a monster Siche Gas Machine, which were piled promiscuously all over the street.

Fortunately little damage was done to the goods, but there was quite an excited crowd on for a time, including half a dozen of the officials and workmen of the Siche Gas Company, whose office and erecting shop is on York-street, opposite where the upset happened. They stated that owing to the extremely heavy construction of the machine, the machine had suffered no damage except scratched paint, and they allowed it to continue on its journey to the college building, to complete the enlarged gas plant now going in.

JAPS BLOCKADE VLADIVOSTOCK

SEA ROAD CUT OFF BY WINTER

Lighthouses in Vicinity of Tsugaru Straits Will Not Be Lighted Except on Occasions.

Tokyo, Feb. 10.—Information given out by the navy department tonight shows that the harbor of Vladivostock has been practically blockaded by the Japanese naval forces.

Entry to Vladivostock from the sea is now limited to Tsushima Straits (Straits of Korea) and Tsugaru Straits (between Hokkaido Island and the Island of Honshu). The Soya Straits (La Perouse Straits, between the Island of Hokkaido and the Island of Sakhalin) are barred by ice.

Reports received here from Hokkaido (the northernmost island of Japan) and also from coasting vessels say Soya Straits are not frozen over, but are filled with ice and bergs, making navigation practically impossible. To navigate through the difficulty of reaching Vladivostock, the Japanese government announces that the lighthouses in the vicinity of Tsugaru Straits will not be lighted except occasionally.

The official announcement says this decision was necessary for strategic reasons, and warns coasting and neutral navigators that in passing Tsugaru Straits they must exercise great caution. The Japanese continue to patrol Tsushima and Tsugaru Straits, and it is believed that the blockade of Vladivostock is effective.

It was reported from Vladivostock that the Russian and Japanese forces were in contact, but it is doubted whether they will engage from the harbor on account of the extensive seizures by the Japanese of coal-laden ships bound for Vladivostock. Large amounts of coal have been purchased by Japan, which has not ceased purchasing coal.




