# CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

## OF THE

# ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

---

### CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be denominated "The Ontario Rifle Association."
2. Any person being a subscriber of \$1 per annum shall become a member of the Association.
3. Donors of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as life members of the Association.
4. Any Battalion or Rifle Association in the Province subscribing not less than \$10 annually to the funds of the Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, in the proportion of one to every half-dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to elect from its members the persons to hold such memberships, and return their names and addresses, when elected, to the Secretary of the Association, to be registered by him one week previous to the match.
5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council.  
The Lieut.-Governor of the Province of Ontario, for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
6. There shall be a President.
7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents,—one for each Military District.
8. There shall be a Council, composed as follows :—
  - 1st. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected primarily at this meeting, and hereafter at the annual meeting.
  - 2nd. The ex-Presidents of the Association.



3rd. The District Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia.

4th. The Brigade Majors.

5th. The Presidents of local affiliated Associations and Clubs,  
being members of the Association.

Five of whom shall form a quorum; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

9. The Council shall choose from their members elected, the President of the Association.

10. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such districts, and who shall be elected by the Council.

11. There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

12. The Council shall have the sole Management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

13. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any case altered, nor new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

14. The annual prize meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.

15. The prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.

16. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.

17. There shall be an annual meeting, to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

Secretaries of Rifle Associations affiliated, or desirous of affiliating with the Ontario Rifle Association, will confer a favour by forwarding the names and addresses of the office-bearers of their Association, as soon after their election as possible, in order that they may be published in the Annual Report.

## BY-LAWS.

The annual meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto on the second day of the Annual Match.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council ; the first of which shall be held on the day after the annual meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of all members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure for sums of current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

# REPORT OF COUNCIL

OF THE

## ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION,

1876.

---

Your Council beg to submit their Annual Report of the proceedings of the Association for the year 1876.

The Eighth Annual Meeting took place on the Association Ranges, Garrison Common, Toronto, on the 29th August and following days, and proved a most successful one in every particular.

Its success was mainly due to the changes made in the programme as recommended by the Committee appointed at the Annual Meeting in September, 1875, and whose report will be found in the Appendix (marked A).

The reduction of Battalion Teams from ten to eight will, we think, induce a greater number of Battalions to compete in that Match, thereby increasing the general list of competitors.

The substitution of the "Extra Series Prizes" for the "Pool" and "Running Man" Targets was found to answer admirably, being attended with an increase of revenue and general satisfaction to competitors. We would, however, suggest that a greater effort be made to secure prizes for this Match in the country districts, instead of leaving them to be made up from Toronto, Hamilton and Guelph.

The "Maiden Stakes," a Match in place of the "Nursery," and open only to those who had never won a prize at a Dominion or Provincial Meeting, was another new feature, which was found to give satisfaction, and its continuance is recommended.

Mr. E. O. Bickford, of Toronto, generously gave the sum of \$100 as a special prize for this Match.

A great improvement was noticeable in the introduction of single range Matches, as they give an opportunity to those who cannot remain for the whole meeting of firing in at least one or two competitions, and also a better chance to the medium shots of winning prizes.

Your Council have had under consideration the question of replacing the iron targets at present in use by canvas ones ; but inasmuch as it is yet an open question which system of targets is likely to give the greatest satisfaction, the Council are unable to make a recommendation of any definite change in the meantime.

Attention is called to the Balance Sheet, which shows a material increase at the credit of the Association. This, however, is not likely to continue unless vigorous means are taken to increase the membership. This subject was referred to at the last Annual Meeting, and a Committee was appointed to take the matter into consideration, whose report was subsequently approved of, and will be found in the Appendix, marked (B). The Council have approved of this report being carried into effect during the year 1877.

The pasturage of the Common continues to be a source of revenue to the Association, the heavy rains in the beginning of the season adding greatly to the estimated receipts, and answering the purpose of a fertilizer.

With great pleasure your Council record the interest taken in the Association by His Excellency the Governor-General, Earl Dufferin, who was pleased to offer during his stay in Canada a Silver and a Bronze Medal for competition annually. These medals were awarded for aggregate scores, and their possession caused a keen and eager struggle among the best marksmen at the meeting.

To the Managers of the several Railway Companies who granted single fares to competitors the Association is indebted, as by this boon the attendance was greatly increased; and to the Reporters of the *Globe*, *Mail* and *Leader*, your Council would tender their acknowledgments for full and accurate daily reports of all the proceedings.

Before closing, your Council has with regret to announce the resignation of its late President, John Gordon, Esq., who, owing to business engagements, was compelled to sever his active connection with the Association.

Mr. Gordon, on the resignation of Lieut.-Col. Gzowski, in the most public-spirited manner accepted the charge, and during his

three years tenure of the office, contributed his aid both in time and money in advancing and fostering the interests of rifle shooting in this Province.

His Honour Judge Macdonald, of Guelph, a Vice-President of the Association since its formation, succeeds Mr. Gordon.

TO THE COUNCIL

OF THE

ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

---

The Committee appointed at the Annual Meeting of the Association in September last, for the purpose of taking into consideration matters connected with the prize lists and prize meetings of the Association, and the best method of selecting the Canadian team for Wimbledon, beg to report as follows :—

1. With regard to the selection of the team to Wimbledon, while the Committee are of opinion that in theory the proper method of selection would be by a series of competitions on a common neutral ground, where competitors would meet and shoot under exactly the same circumstances of wind, weather, &c., this method is attended with too many disadvantages and inconveniences either to give satisfaction to the Dominion at large, or to secure the best possible representation on the team. There are many excellent shots not only in the outer provinces, but even in Ontario and Quebec, who, while anxious enough to secure places on the team, either find it impossible to proceed to Ottawa for the purpose of competition, or else are unwilling to go there at the risk of failing to secure a place. The Maritime Provinces complain, and the Committee think with reason, that many of their best shots are by these reasons prevented from joining in the competition, while the few that may be sent to compete have to contend against so many from Ontario and Quebec that their chances of representation are reduced to a minimum. The method of selection adopted in the case of the 1875 team is, however, more objectionable still. Where each province is allowed to hold its own competition, and the team is selected by comparing the results of the competitions in the various provinces, there are the objections of these provincial competitions being held under different states of weather; some on ranges much more favour-

able for good shooting than others; and, what is more serious still, some with less honesty of management than others, where the end in view with each Provincial Association is to have as large a representation as possible.

Under these circumstances the Committee recommend as by far the least objectionable mode of selection that of apportioning the team between the several provinces, allowing each provincial association to adopt its own method of selecting its quota.

A distribution of the team, having some regard to the number of volunteers and shots in the several provinces, even though somewhat arbitrary, might be made as follows:—

Ontario,	New Brunswick,
Quebec,	Manitoba,
Nova Scotia,	British Columbia, and
	Prince Edward Island,

allotting such number to each province as may be thought proper.

2. The Committee recommend that in the Battalion Match, instead of ten, eight be the number of representatives of each battalion, brigade, squadron or field battery, as the case may be—it being considered that while this change will tend to a larger number of entries by county battalions, a smaller number than eight would not be a fair test of the shooting strength of a corps.

3. They recommend the discontinuance of the match known as the "Nursery Stakes;" that the Elkington Cup be offered for competition, as a First Grand Aggregate Cup, to be won three times before becoming the property of the winner; that a Consolation Match at 500 yards be introduced, in which none who have won prizes in any of the Snider matches of that meeting shall be allowed to compete; that \$10 be the highest prize in this match; and that as large a number of prizes as possible be offered, none amounting to less than \$4.

4. The Committee recommend that no prizes in any match of less than \$4 be offered; that if possible the prize list in the "All Comers" be increased in both number and amount.

5. They recommend that the use of the Pool and Running Man Targets be discontinued; that instead of these, one ordinary target at 200 yards and another at 500 yards shall be kept open during the first three days of the meeting for two matches, to be called respec-

tively "Extra Prizes, First Series," and "Extra Prizes, Second Series," the former at 200 and the latter at 500 yards; competitors to be permitted to enter as often as three times for either match, firing seven rounds, but to take only one prize in each. To provide prizes for these, it is proposed that the Association should invite contributions of prizes in "kind," not only in Toronto but in other places. The Committee believe that if a proper method of inviting contributions is adopted, two good prize lists can be made up. They recommend an entrance fee of fifty cents for each entry; also, that the winning competitors be permitted to select their prizes from the lists, position on the prize list determining priority of choice; and that with a view to this, all "kind" prizes be placed on exhibition from the opening of each meeting.

6. It is also recommended that registrar keepers be required to call out in a loud voice the value of each shot, as entered by them at the time of entering same: thus, "Bull's Eye, 5," or "Centre, 4," as the case may be.

7. They recommend that Wimbledon targets (Brunel's system) and scoring of 1874 and 1875 be for the future adopted, and that telegraphic communication be secured between the firing points and the targets, thus effecting a great saving of time.

8. The Committee believe that more satisfactory marking could be secured by employment of markers belonging to Toronto and neighbouring rifle associations, and that the expense would be very little increased thereby, if at all.

9. They recommend that on the first day of the competitions the firing be commenced punctually at the hour named on the tickets for the first squads; that if necessary, the "commence firing" be deferred till one o'clock, rather than that punctuality in the presentation and reception of the firing tickets should be interfered with at the opening of the competitions.

All of which is most respectfully submitted.

## R E P O R T

*Of the Committee appointed to consider the best means for increasing the memberships and funds of the Ontario Rifle Association.*

*Fourth.*—That Committees be appointed to canvass the members of the Dominion and Ontario Legislatures during the Session, with a view to a continuation of the grants, and that the other Provinces be requested to take similar action.

*Fifth.*—That Major Gibson, Lieut. Macnachten, Lieut.-Col. O'Malley, Lieut.-Col. Williams, and Lieut.-Col. Skinner, M.P., be members of the Committee to canvass the Ontario Legislature.

*Sixth.*—That Lieut.-Col. Gzowski, Lieut.-Col. Kirkpatrick, M.P., Lieut.-Colonel Skinner, M.P., Capt. Casey, M.P., and Allan Gilmour, Esq., be members of the Committee to canvass the Dominion Legislature.

# REGULATIONS

FOR

## THE ANNUAL PRIZE MEETING

OF THE

### ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION,

29th AUGUST, 1876, and following days.

---

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

I.—The Meeting shall be conducted under the direction of an Executive Committee, composed of the chairman and two members of the Council, to be nominated by the Council.

II.—In the conduct of the Meeting the following Regulations are to be observed, together with such directions as may be given from time to time by the Executive Committee.

III.—All members of Volunteer Corps competing for Prizes restricted to Volunteers, shall appear in the authorized full dress or undress uniform of their Corps, with a regulation belt and pouch. Cap covers allowed. Uniforms to be fastened, and the heel-plate of the rifle to rest against the outside of the uniform when firing.

IV.—Competitors shall submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

V.—No hair triggers shall be allowed.

VI.—No fixed artificial rests shall be allowed, the forearm and hand being clear of all support.

VII.—Competitors may wipe out or clean out their rifles during any competition, between distances only.

VIII.—No two Competitors shall shoot with the same rifle in the same match.

IX.—No post entries shall be made for any competition after the firing for such competition has commenced.

X.—Every Competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and, unless otherwise specified, not oftener than once for any prize.

XI.—No one shall be allowed to join a squad after the commencement of the second competitive round.

---

#### 2.—DISQUALIFICATIONS AND FINES.

XII.—Should a Competitor lose his firing ticket, omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed by the Executive Officer, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity given him of competing for the Prize for which his ticket was issued, his claim on the Association in regard to such competition shall be cancelled.

XIII.—Any Competitor who shall be detected in an evasion of the conditions prescribed for the conduct of any Prize, shall be disqualified from further competition during the Meeting, and forfeit his entrance fees; and in case of such conduct being considered by the Executive Committee as "discreditable," he shall be disqualified from ever again competing at the Ontario Rifle Association Prize Meeting.

XIV.—Any Competitor who has once joined his squad, and shall leave it, to fire a shot from any other firing point before the squad has completed its shooting, shall be disqualified in that competition.

XV.—Any person firing when the danger flag or disc is shown at the target or firing point, or discharging his rifle, except at a target to which he has been told off, or into the place provided for that purpose, shall be debarred from all further competitions during the Meeting, and shall forfeit his entrance fees. This shall not apply to a Competitor accidentally firing at the wrong target when no danger flag is up.

XVI.—Any Competitor "snapping a cap" or "firing off" a charge without going close up to and pointing his rifle in the direction named for that purpose, shall be fined \$2.

### 3.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

XVII.—1. Competitors who are prevented from being present at the Meeting shall have the entrance fees they have paid returned after the Meeting, provided that they send their tickets and give written notice to the Secretary before the day on which the Prize for which they have entered has been announced for competition.

2. Competitors prevented from competing by illness will receive back their entrance fees in full, on production of a medical certificate and their entry tickets.

### 4.—PRIZE WINNERS.

XVIII.—All winners of Prizes shall apply to the Secretary's Office for a Certificate, which must be countersigned by the Secretary before any Prize can be delivered.

XIX.—Winners of Money Prizes shall, on receiving the amount of such Prizes from the Cashier at the Finance Department, give up their certificates to him.

XX.—All Money Prizes shall be paid on the ground.

XXI.—Winners of Money Prizes who have the option of taking them either in money or in kind, shall make known their decision to the Secretary before the close of the Meeting.

XXII.—All Prizes, pool and sweepstakes moneys, not claimed before the 31st December, shall be forfeited to the Association.

### 5.—DISTANCES AND TARGETS.

XXIII.—There shall be eight distances, viz. :—

200 yards	500 yards	900 yards
300 "	600 "	1,000 "
400 "	800 "	

### SIZE OF TARGETS.

The size of targets will be as follows :—

At 200 and 300 yards—

6 feet by 4 feet wide ; Bull's Eye (circular), 8 inches ; Centre (circular), 16 inches ; Inner (circular), 28 inches ; Outer, remainder of target.

At 500 and 600 yards—

6 feet square ; Bull's Eye (circular), 22 inches ; Centre (circular), 38 inches ; Inner (circular), 54 inches ; Outer, remainder of target.

At 800, 900 and 1,000 yards—

6 feet by 12 wide ; Bull's Eye (circular), 3 feet ; Centre (circular), 4 feet 6 inches ; Inner, 6 feet square ; Outer, remainder of target.

Bull's Eyes counting 5, Centres 4, Inner 3, Outer 2.

### 6.—RIFLES.

The Rifles shall be classified as follows :—

#### CLASS I.

Snider-Enfield Rifles of *bona fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Imperial Government viewer's mark.

1. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
2. Sights strictly in accordance with Government pattern.
3. Any pad or shoe for the heel-plate of the butt admitting of removal, and thereby allowing of variation at pleasure in the length of the stock, shall be disallowed.

N.B.—Sights may be blackened, but white, red, or other colouring matter shall not be allowed.

#### CLASS II.

“Any rifle ;” maximum weight, 10 lbs.

1. Sights of any description, except telescope, magnifying, and those shown as disallowed in Diagrams.
2. Maximum pull of trigger, 3 lbs.

### 7.—AMMUNITION.

1. In all competitions, unless otherwise specified, any ammunition may be used, provided of Government issue, or that supplied by the Association.
2. Ammunition (1874 issue) for Snider-Enfields will be supplied on the ground at 20 cents per ten rounds.

### 8.—POSITION.

Any position at all ranges.

### 9.—SIGHTING.

1. Tickets for sighting shots, price 10 cents each, will be sold at the Office provided for that purpose. They will be delivered up to the Register Keeper when a shot is taken. Such tickets to hold good in any Match during the continuance of the Meeting.

2. Any Competitor joining the squad when the first round of sighting shots has been fired, shall be restricted to one sighting shot.

3. Competitors who at gun-fire have not completed the number of rounds prescribed by the conditions of a competition, shall be allowed *one* free sighting shot when such competition is resumed.

10.—TIES.

The names of Competitors who have to shoot off ties shall be posted up daily, at 8 a.m. and 12 p.m., on the Ties' Notice Board.

Ties shall be decided as follows :—

1. When the firing shall take place at more than one distance :
  - (a.) By the score made at the longest distance in the competition ; and if still a tie, and there be three distances in the competition, by the score at the second distance.
  - (b.) If still a tie, by the fewest ..... *misses.*
  - (c.) If still a tie, by the fewest ..... *outers.*
  - (d.) If still a tie, by the fewest ..... *inners.*
  - (e.) If still a tie, by the inverse order of shots, counting by twos from the last shot to the first.
  - (f.) If still a tie, by inverse order of shots, counting singly from the last to the first.
  - (g.) If still a tie, by firing shot for shot at the longest distance.
2. When firing takes place at one distance only :
  - (a.) By the fewest ..... *misses.*
  - (b.) If still a tie, by the fewest ..... *outers.*
  - (c.) If still a tie, by the fewest ..... *inners.*
  - (d.) If still a tie, by the inverse order of shots, counting by twos from the last shot to the first.
  - (e.) If still a tie, by the inverse order of shots, counting singly from the last shot to the first.
  - (f.) If still a tie, by firing shot for shot at the longest distance.

IN MATCHES.

- (a.) By the aggregate scores made at the longest distance in the competition.
- (b.) If still a tie, by the fewest ..... *misses.*
- (c.) If still a tie, by the fewest ..... *outers.*
- (d.) If still a tie, by the fewest ..... *inners.*
- (e.) If still a tie, by the Competitors who have made the highest score on each side firing five rounds at the longest distance in the competition.

11.—ENTRIES.

1. All entries for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 7th Matches must be made upon forms supplied by the Secretary, on or before Saturday, 26th August. Post entries, for which double entrances will be charged, will be received up to noon on the opening day ; after which time no entrances will be received for these Matches. Entries for other Matches may be made on the ground.

2. No post entries shall be made for any competition after the firing for such competition has commenced.

## ISSUE OF FIRING TICKETS.

Firing tickets shall be issued under the following conditions :—

1. That should a Competitor lose his ticket, omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed by the Executive Officer, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity given to him of competing for the Prize for which the ticket was issued, his claim on the Association in regard to such competition shall be cancelled.
2. That any *erasure* or substitution of one name for another shall render the ticket invalid.
3. Competition for the second stages of any Prize shall be considered as Matches.

## 12.—POST ENTRIES.

1. Post entries will not be squadded until the regular entries have been provided for.
2. Post entries will be detailed to fire according to the number on the ticket issued, but the Council cannot hold themselves responsible should the holders of such tickets find it impossible to shoot before the close of the competition ; in such case the entrance fee will be returned.

## 13.—INSTRUCTIONS TO COMPETITORS.

1. By special arrangement with the Northern, Grand Trunk, Great Western, Toronto, Grey and Bruce, and Nipissing Railways, Competitors will be carried to and from the Match at Single Fare; on the St. Lawrence and Ottawa Railway at One and a Half Fare; the Brockville and Ottawa Railway at One and a Third Fare, on being furnished by the Secretary of the O. R. A. with Certificates, before leaving home; and the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company at rates which will be furnished on application to the Secretary of the Association.
2. Competitors desiring camp accommodation will be furnished with the same on application to the Quartermaster. One Tent will be issued to every six Competitors. Any person drawing a Tent, &c., will be held responsible by the Association for its safe return.
3. Meals may be procured at the authorized Refreshment Tents on the Ground.
4. All Competitors in camp will be subject to Police Regulations.
5. All Competitors camping will be charged \$1 for the use of the Association Tents and Blankets during the Match.
6. The Bugle Calls will be as follows :—  
 NON-COM. OFFICERS IN CHARGE OF MARKERS. — Non-Com. Officers' Call, followed by one G, Targets 1 to 8; by G G, Targets 9 to 14; by G G G, Targets 14 to 20.  
 REGISTER-KEEPERS.—Officers' Call.  
 COMPETITORS.—Assembly.
7. The competition will be conducted strictly in accordance with the regulations as published. The Matches will take place, if possible, in the order of publication. Any deviations from the rule will be published on the board at the Secretary's Hut. Temporary discontinuance on account of bad weather will be at the discretion of the Council.
8. No member of a squad or a firing party must absent himself without leave during firing. Any Competitor delaying the squad will be passed by. Muzzle-

loading rifles may be wiped out during any competition, provided the squad is not delayed by so doing. Independent loading is permitted with muzzle-loaders.

9. Any Competitor protesting against any ruling of the Officer of the squad, or feeling himself aggrieved in any way, must make a statement of his grievance in writing, giving the names of two or more members of his squad who can bear him out in his statements, and hand it in to the Secretary. No exception will be allowed, however, to the marker's signal, or the decision of the Executive Committee.

10. Unless otherwise ordered, the shooting shall begin daily at 9 a.m., and cease when the mid-day gun is fired at 12 noon. It shall be resumed at 1 p.m., and cease at 6 p.m.

11. Sweepstakes will be opened daily at Targets unoccupied by Prize competitions.

12. All Competitors shall be subject to the Executive Committee, the Officer or Non-Commissioned Officer in charge of his squad, and the General Regulations for the conduct of the Match; and any Competitor infringing the rules, or disobeying orders, shall be debarred from further competition, pending the decision of the Executive Committee.

13. No Competitor<sup>1</sup> to *cap*, or with breech-loader, to *load*, until called to the front to shoot.

14. Competitors shall, if required, submit their rifles for inspection before, during, and after a Match, and any Competitor found guilty of plugging, or other unfair behaviour, will be disqualified from further shooting, and forfeit entrance fees and prizes.

15. No practice will be allowed on the ranges, either before or after the day's firing, during the continuance of the Match.

16. All Competitors must be members of the Ontario Rifle Association, by affiliation or directly.

17. No Telescope or Field Glass, except those in possession of the Officers of the Association, shall be allowed at or near any firing point, except in the "Any Rifle" Matches.

18. No communication shall be allowed, on any pretence whatever, between the Firing Point and the Target, except with the permission of the Executive Committee.

19. No person, except the person firing and the one about to fire, shall be allowed within the Firing Ropes at each Firing Point.

20. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the General Regulations of the Meeting; as also with the Conditions attached to the Prize or Prizes, for which they have entered, *as the plea of ignorance of such Regulations and Conditions will not be entertained.*

21. They must refer to the Notice Boards daily, and ascertain whether any orders have been issued which alter or affect original detail.

22. They must attend at the Firing Point punctually at the hour detailed on the Register Ticket, and deliver the ticket to the Register Keeper.

*N.B.*—Unless a Competitor produces his Register Ticket at the Firing Point, he cannot be allowed to fire.

23. In all competitions restricted to the Use of Breech-loading Rifles, Competitors shall, as far as possible, be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot *alternately.*

24. Where only one Competitor is present, he shall necessarily fire his shots consecutively and without undue delay.

25. In competitions open to "Any Rifle," the Competitors shall be formed in a squad, and fire shot for shot in the order in which their names are called.
