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TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

To the Members of the New Brunswick Provincial Rifle Association :

The Council, in its Annual Report to the Association, has in the first place to supplement last year's statement regarding the new Range. In that statement the total cost of equipping the Range was shown to have been \$1,339, towards defraying which a grant of \$1,000 had at the time been received from the Militia Department, and an application made for a further grant to cover the additional expenditure. The Council has pleasure in reporting that that application was, in time, favorably considered, the amount asked for, \$339, placed in the estimates, voted by Parliament, and has since been paid. Last autumn some work was done near the butt as a protection against ice and spring floods, and so fully answered the purpose that the parapet suffered not the least injury. Other permanent work done this year includes the construction of two extra target frames, which raises the number of available targets to fifteen; the raising of the 500-yard Extra Series mound and the addition of a platform along the western side of the house.

A matter for final consideration is the terms upon which the targets shall henceforth be loaned for the use of the Brigade Camp. This year six sets were hired, but the frames were so completely shot away as to be unfit for further use

and new targets had consequently to be procured. The amount paid by the Camp — \$20 — is therefore insufficient to cover the damage. Since the Annual Matches Major Arnold reports, in effect, that all the present target frames will answer for next year's matches, if not subjected to Camp target practice.

At the Annual Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association in February, a resolution passed restricting the Ottawa matches to the Martini-Henri rifle. Unfortunately this Association was quite unprepared to follow the lead, because of the scarcity of these rifles in the province. Your Council, however, took early action, by which it secured from the Militia Department a loan of fifteen rifles, newest make, in exchange for the same number of the old issue, no longer reliable. Further, and what is of more importance, through correspondence with the Department, a tacit understanding was had that issues of from ten to twenty rifles would be made to commanding officers making application and furnishing personal bonds for safe keeping. Officers commanding Corps were at once acquainted with this arrangement, and at least four Corps eventually obtained rifles — in all some sixty in number. Of those held by the Association, twenty-five at lowest, may be relied upon; so it may be calculated that, including private rifles, there are now in the province one hundred available Martinis. This being the case, we may take it for granted that our annual matches for 1894 will be shot with the Martini-Henri rifle. Such was the unanimous resolution of the competitors at Sussex; and the one remaining objection would be removed if all commanding officers would at once make the needful application and obtain for their Corps the benefit of the issue allowed.

Though for the reason above stated the Council decided not to drop the Snider this year, it yet thought it desirable to set apart one match for the Martini; without including it, however, in the Grand Aggregate. This match, the

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Provincial, was shot at Queens Ranges, and in connection with it the team match for the York and Kings pitcher.

Another feature which marked the prize meeting was the introduction of the time system of squadding, and the change seemed to give general satisfaction. With the experience thus gained, and with a more general compliance with the rule requiring entries to be made before the date of the matches, the Secretary will no doubt be able to time the several competitions more accurately than was possible on the first attempt.

Fine favorable weather and a pleasant meeting can once more be recorded. The competitions were all commenced at the hours previously fixed, and the shooting was easily finished on the afternoon of Thursday. The general meeting of competitors was held after gun-fire Wednesday evening, and immediately thereafter the presentation was made of the prizes in the completed matches. In one particular, that of the attendance of winners, this arrangement worked surprisingly well. With but two exceptions all the winners were present and received their prizes.

Success again awaited our team in the Maritime Match at Charlottetown, though by the narrow majority of two points. The teams scored as follows: New Brunswick, 631; Nova Scotia, 629; Prince Edward Island, 598. The more general use of the Martini will in the future, it is hoped, give us a larger field of experienced shots from which to draw our New Brunswick team.

The Province was represented on the Bisley team by the two members who won their places last year at Ottawa—Col.-Sgt. M. B. Henderson and Pte. Walter Langstroth. It is also to be noticed that the adjutancy of the team was filled from this Association, the selection falling on Major F. H. Hartt.

The Council have with deep regret to report that in regard to the Ottawa matches the Association failed to maintain its representation or its shooting record. The reason, of course, is to be found largely in the fact that we retained the Snider

rifle for our own matches, with the result that very few of our shots got in the proper practice with the Martini. The strength of our contingent fell to sixteen, and its members not being in form to compile the scores needful to high places in the prize lists did not come in for any honors. Five, indeed, got into the Governor General's hundred, but no eligible New Brunswicker is far enough up to stand in for the Bisley team. Such has never before been the case, and the failure will surely stir up resolution to become as capable with the Martini as hitherto with the Snider. The Council would also remind riflemen who turn their eyes to Ottawa, that the general use there of rifles of private manufacture renders it most desirable that they should go similarly well equipped. The extreme heat so often experienced at Ottawa, and the comparative roughness of the barrels and sights of the military rifles, go far to place the latter at a disadvantage with the more thoroughly tested private rifle.

The proceedings of the past year were printed in the usual pamphlet form. The printing of these reports and also all the printing for the matches was given out on tender, and it will be observed by the accounts that somewhat of a saving has thus been effected.

The accounts of the Secretary-Treasurer for the year are submitted herewith.

The Annual Meeting of last year referred to your Council the question of the disposition of the N. R. A. silver medal, with a strong recommendation that for the future it should yearly pass to the highest New Brunswicker actually proceeding to Bisley as a member of the team.

The matter has been fully considered and discussed. On reference to the charter of the National Rifle Association, it was found that one of its sections reads as follows: "The Irish, Indian and Colonial Associations, in connection with the National Rifle Association, shall be annually entitled to the silver medal of the National Rifle Association, to be competed for at the annual prize meetings of such Associations."

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The Council finally came to the conclusion that the carrying out of the recommendation would be at variance both with the spirit and the letter of the above section, and accordingly the medal was retained as first prize in the Sussex Grand Aggregate.

It was resolved, on motion of Lieut. McFarlane,

To recommend that in the match for the Hazen Cup and prizes, entries be allowed from as many teams from any one Corps as desire to enter.

There was a good deal of discussion on a motion of Capt. Carvell, to the effect

That retired officers be allowed to shoot on teams of the Corps to which they formerly belonged.

The motion, on being put, was lost.

The meeting adjourned.

Read draft of Council report.

Resolved, on motion of Col. Armstrong,

That a section be added explanatory of the action of the Council in regard to the N. R. A. medal.

With this addition the draft was adopted, to be presented to the Annual Meeting as the report of the Council for the year.

The Council adjourned.

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ANNUAL MEETING.

The Annual Meeting of the New Brunswick Provincial Rifle Association was held at the office of the President, on the evening of Wednesday, October 11th. The members present were :

The meeting was called to order at 8.30 and the minutes of last year's Annual Meeting read and confirmed.

The report of the Council for the year was submitted and read, and, on motion of Capt. McRobbie, was received and laid on the table.

The Secretary-Treasurer's statement of accounts was read. It showed receipts from all sources to the amount of \$2,742.77, and an expenditure of \$2,540.05, leaving a credit balance in favor of the Association of \$202.72.

The Auditors' report, endorsed on the statement, was also read, to the effect that vouchers had been examined and the accounts found correct.

Moved by Capt. McRobbie, seconded by Capt. Thompson,

That the accounts for the year be received and adopted and printed in the Annual Report. — Carried.

In answer to enquiry, it was stated that the amount of insurance on the Range house was \$300. The Secretary was directed to place \$100 additional insurance to cover targets and other plant stored in the house.

The minutes of the Competitors' meeting were then read, and afterwards the Council report was taken off the table for consideration.

The section referring to the loaning of targets for use by the Militia in Camp was discussed, it being shown that the cost of preparing six sets for the Camp and of replacing these six sets with new ones exceeded the amount received for their use by about \$25.

It was thereupon resolved, on motion of Lieut.-Colonel Armstrong and Captain McRobbie,

That the use of the Butt and Range plant, other than targets, be permitted free of charge, but if the use of Association targets is also desired, that the Camp be required to make good the damage and expense actually occasioned.

In this connection the Secretary was directed to write to the Kings County Rifle Association and ascertain to what extent targets would probably be needed next year for their practice and competitions, and report at the Council meeting in November.

Moved by Capt. Thompson, seconded by Capt. Lordly,

That the resolution of the Competitors' meeting, recommending the adoption of the Martini-Henri rifle for future matches, be adopted and carried into effect.

Expressions of gratification at the result of the Maritime match were made by the President and some other members, and acknowledged by Capt. McRobbie, captain of the team.

The following resolution then passed :

That application be made to the Provincial Government for a yearly grant to aid in meeting the expenses of the New Brunswick team in the Maritime match,—a grant such as is at present made by the government of Nova Scotia to its Association.

The other matters contained in the Council report, and in the minutes of the Competitors' meeting, were referred to the new Council.

The Council report was thereupon adopted.

Read minutes of the Annual Meeting for the information of the Council.

On the nomination of Captain Thompson and Col. Beer, Captain J. T. Hartt was re-elected Secretary-Treasurer.

The chair appointed as Auditors :

Captain McRobbie, Captain Thompson, Captain E. A. Smith.

After nomination and ballot the following were declared elected members of the Executive Committee :

Captain J. H. McRobbie. Lieut.-Col. E. B. Beer,
 Captain J. M. Kinnear, Lieut.-Col. J. J. Tucker,
 Lieut. J. D. Chipman.

The Secretary reported that additional insurance of \$100 had been placed on the contents of the Range house ; a new policy for \$400 being issued, dating from the 13th day of October.

Resolved, on motion of Mr. Hunter,

That the proceedings of the past year be printed in the customary form, and that tenders be asked for the coming year's printing and the work placed with the persons offering the most satisfactory terms.

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The recommendations of the Competitors' meeting were considered.

The resolution in reference to the need of steps behind the 600-yard firing point was first discussed. Finally, to a committee consisting of Col. Beer, Captain McRobbie and the Secretary, was referred the duty of deciding upon the kind of work best suited, and of having the same constructed before next annual matches.

Resolved,

That one or more team entries be allowed from any corps in the Hazen team match.

The minutes of the Annual Meeting were next taken up.

After hearing the statement of Col Beer, as to the use of targets at Sussex by local marksmen, it was

Resolved, That the Kings County Rifle Association be allowed, for its annual match, the use of Range plant and house, making good any actual damage caused; and also the use of targets, subject to the condition of re-covering them after so using them. Further, that local marksmen be allowed to use a few sets of standards, weights, etc., but must provide their own targets.

And further resolved, That any corps desiring to use the Range for a day's regimental shooting, be allowed to do so on the same terms as the Kings County Association on making due application.

Lt.-Col. Beer was requested to see to the placing of some posts and wire, to protect the butt from cattle pasturing on the Range.

The resolution as to making application to the Provincial Government for a grant was referred to the Executive Committee.

The resolution suggesting the opening of all the matches to members (thus admitting civilians to all competitions) was discussed at length.

Moved by Col. Armstrong, seconded by Col. Beer,

That in the opinion of this Council it is not desirable to make any change in the regulations governing the right of entry in the matches.

Moved, in amendment, by Captain Thompson, seconded by Captain Lordly,

That all non-commissioned officers and men, after serving nine years in the Militia, be allowed the same right of entry as retired officers now have.

On the suggestion of the President, and on motion of Captain McRobbie, as an amendment to the amendment, it was

Resolved, That further discussion and the decision of the matter be deferred until a special meeting in May or June, the members of Council then to be notified of the nature of the question to be brought up for settlement.

Moved by Mr. Hunter, seconded by Captain Thompson,

That a committee of five (5) be selected to frame a prize list and to submit it for consideration at the special meeting.—Carried.

Captain Thompson, Captain McRobbie, Mr. Hunter, Captain E. A. Smith and the Secretary were on ballot selected such committee.

The Council then adjourned.
