It will be seen from the above that the charge for the Civil Establishment is the same as that for the last year. A saving, however, has accrued under the head of Contingencies, &c.

The same sum has been taken for House-rent to the Governor in lieu of a Residence, as was voted last year.

No reduction has been made in the charge for Stationery, Postage, &c. The cost of maintaining the Colonial Vessel has been estimated at the same sum as last year, but an additional charge of £.275. on account of that vessel has been introduced into the Estimate of 1834/5, to defray the expense of arming and adapting her to the service specified in the Estimate

The allowance for Buildings is £.300. less than that voted last year. The sum required to cover "Arrears" last year was £.459. 14. $6\frac{1}{2}$.; but the Estimate for 1834/5 is entirely relieved from this charge.

In the two last items a reduction of $\pounds.759.14.6\frac{1}{2}$. has taken place; but from this sum is to be deducted the increased charge for the Colonial Vessel, amounting to £.275. so that the real saving is only £. 484. 14. 6 1.
