An Act to revive and continue the Bounties granted by an Act, made in the Twenty-fixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for encouraging the Fisheries carried on at Newfoundland and Parts adjacent, from Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions in Europe; to continue fo much of an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as permits the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, in Foreign Ships, into and from the Port of Saint John's in the Island of Antigua; and fo much of an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, as permits Sir William Bishop, George Bishop, and Argles Bishop, to carry on the Manufacture of Maidstone Geneva; and also ſo 18 N 2

fo much of an Act, made in the Thirty-fifth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for better fecuring the Dutics on Glafs, as was to continue for a limited Time. [4th July 17.9.7.]
