Federal Finances.

The annual statement of revenue and expenditure in the financial operations of the Dominion Government is now made public. The revenue is the largest in the history of the Dominion, being \$71,180,623. But the expenditure is proportionately greater still reaching the enormous sum of \$78,850,708, in round numbers seventy-nine million dollars.
