Increased Cost Of Living.

The Vote and Supplementary Supply for the Lunatic Asylum for the year ending June 30th, 1911, was \$21,000.

The explanation is contained in a letter from the Superintendent of the Asylum to Mr. Harris of the Board of Works.

The increase in the price of most of the leading articles is also marked; meat, two cents per lb; bread, one cent; pork, three dollars per barrel; and suits of clothes which we used to get for four dollars are now five dollars and fifty and six dollars.

If a large public institution which buys on a wholesale scale, which can speak competitive tenders, has had to spend 25 per cent. more on up-keep, largely on account of the increased cost of food and clothing, how much more must the increased cost of living have affected the ordinary man, dependent on a fixed salary, or on a fixed weekly wage, and on broken work at that?

The increased cost of living is being felt by everybody, and is affecting every institution, and the example we have quoted from these Government Returns is a concrete illustration of what is taking place everywhere.

No wonder then that everybody is blaming Sir Edward Morris for failing to carry out his promise to Reduce Taxation as he promised in his Manifesto.

All the owners of sealing setamers have repeatedly published notices to the effect that no berths will be given to men who do not produce certificates that they have been vaccinated.

Hockeyist Hurt.

Last night while teams from the Bishop Field and Methodist Colleges were playing a hockey match, one of the players named Mastow was put out of commission by receiving a blow of an opponent's stick in the stomach; after a brief rest he was able to continue the game.

SEALS TAKEN NORTH.—Yesterday a number of seals were taken at Seal Cove and neighborhood but none were taken elsewhere north.

Who Cares a Brass Farthing?

Who cares a brass farthing what Sir William McGregor's opinion on Santoria were? Our reference to the matter was only designed to show that there could be no "misunderstanding" as to his wabbling attitude and that when Sir Edward Morris quoted him as a great authority on tuberculosis and sanatoria he was quoting a man who changed his opinion in the short space of twelve months.

The assertion in the Daily News of this morning that Sir Robert Bond objected to include in his amendment the whole sentence "I warn you against the idea of Santoria they are beyond our means," is absolutely false.

We were present during the whole debate, and are therefore in a position to affirm that when Sir Robert was asked if he had any objection to insert the words "they are beyond our means" he promptly replied "I have no objection whatever. I will insert the whole speech if you are going to support the amendment, but as I am responsible for this amendment, if the government are not going to support it then it is entirely out of place for them to suggest any alteration in my amendment. The clerk will please add the words "they are beyond our means." They only add force to my contention."

Sir Edward Morris seeing that he had blundered in his suggestion to have these words added to the amendment, pleaded to have the whole lengthy paragraph in which Sir Wm. McGregor concluded his speech inserted, and this it was that Sir Robert Bond very properly refused to accede to.

WORKING FOR LOVE! On Tuesday last the Detailed Statements of Expenditure for the twelve months ending June 30th, 1911, were tabled. A perusal of some of the statements reveals that the Leader of the Picnic Party seems to do well out of working for love.

Part of this amount was on account of professional fees in the Hague Arbitration and was a payment on account and not in full, as the Colonial Secretary stated that the bills of the counsel engaged had not been received, that he did not know how much they would amount to, and the amounts paid had been payments on account and not in full.

The supporters of the Picnic Party have boasted much of the Premier's work for love, but the taxpayer's are finding Sir Edward Morris's occupancy of the Leadership of the Government an expensive experiment.

CONFECTIONERY, More Poisoning.

Yesterday afternoon shortly after partaking of dinner of which tinned salmon was a constituent, Mrs. J. F. Ross of Military Road, was taken suddenly and seriously ill. A doctor was sent for and found that the woman like Mrs. and Miss McCourt recently had been poisoned by eating of salmon. Herole measures had to be taken to revive her and she is still unwell from the effects of the poisonous fish. A few more instances of this kind and people will fight shy of tinned goods altogether.

An Unusual Sight

Reminiscences of olden days were recalled this forenoon as hundreds of citizens watched with interest from the waterfront three sealers who lost their passage, bringing their belongings over the ice to the Kite which was jammed in the ice off Chain Rock. Unfortunately before they reached the ship she got in open water and went on without them.

Relief to the Poor

On Tuesday night a meeting of St. Vincent de Paul Society was held when \$2 coal orders and 22 orders for food, beans, some special relief, were given out. The notes for provisions were placed in the hands of the visitors last evening, and the people for whom they are intended will be seen at their homes to-day.

The Bruce is Jammed.

The latest wire from the Bruce was received at 10 a.m. to-day by the Reid Mkt. Co. It was as follows: "8 a.m. Light W.S.W. wind, jammed 5 miles east of Flint Island. Sydney Blight blocked with ice."

Supreme Court.

A petition from John Anderson, of St. John's, praying that A. W. Bishop, of Western Bay, be declared insolvent. F. A. Mews for Petitioner, Furlong, K. C., for P. J. Shea, and Royal Stores, W. E. Wolfe, for Sir Edward Morris, Warren, K. C., for debtor and Morris, K. C., for Sarah Bishop, creditor. A. W. Bishop was examined by Mews, cross examined by Furlong and Warren. On motion of Mr. Mews it was ordered that further hearing be adjourned till Thursday next at 10 o'clock.

Died in Venezuela.

The family of Mr. Edward Spencer, of Bell Island, had a wire a couple of days ago from Trinidad, Venezuela, acquainting them of his death there.

West Coast Fishery News.

From Capt. Fitzpatrick of the Portia we learn that there is plenty of fish around Rose Blanche and vicinity and good fares are got by the residents when the weather permits them getting on the grounds.

The S. S. Stella Maris which had been ice bound at Catalina for several days left there this morning and went to Trinity. She left there at 8.30 a.m. with a number of sealers for this port and should reach here to-night.

Railway News.

The special train for Avondale got there at 2 a.m. yesterday and left here at noon, but became stuck in 4 feet of snow a half mile east of that place. Yesterday all along the line there were heavy ground drifts which filled the cuts, and intense frost.

TO TAKE FISH CARGO.—The schr. Gladys S., owned by Hamilton, of Burgeo, which left there a week ago to come to St. John's, reached port at noon to-day. She will load fish at Goodridge's for abroad. The Gladys was obliged to put into Fermeuse on the way along.

DIED ABROAD.—Miss Annie Barrett, who is a domestic with Hon. Jas. Baird, had a telegram a few days ago saying that her sister had died in Montreal, where she had gone for treatment on Thursday last. The deceased had been under treatment at the General Hospital here for a month. The remains were interred at Montreal.

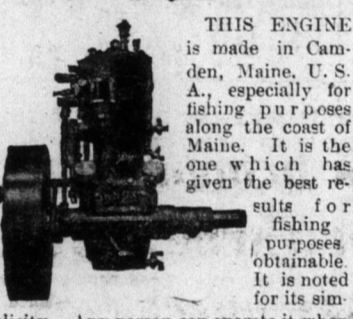


