### A BIG FIRE AT QUEBEC

The Seminary Chapel and \$300,000 worth  
of paintings go up in flames.  
Quebec, Jan. 1.—About 3 o'clock this  
morning a fire broke out in the Quebec  
Seminary Chapel which totally destroyed the  
edifice and \$300,000 worth of original oil  
paintings. When the firemen arrived the flames  
were still confined to the cellar where the fire  
originated, but the smoke was so dense that  
all approach was cut off. About a minute  
after the arrival of the brigade the fire joined  
the ground floor on the interior of the chapel  
and, fed by the old and dry wooden  
figures of the place, gained such headway  
that it was impossible to check it. The  
flames quickly spread to the  
northeastly corner of the dormitory, which  
is a two-story building of brick and stone.  
The firemen checked its progress there and  
consequently saved the whole of that  
block surrounding the Seminary yard. Only  
the bare walls of the chapel remain and these  
are so badly shaken that they will have to  
be demolished.

The edifice was built in 1723, shortly after  
the founding of Laval University, and was  
renovated in 1870. It contained 50 altars and two  
chapels, and was valued at \$1,000,000, fully covered by insurance.

There is an insurance of \$14,000 on the  
chapel and \$16,000 on the paintings, which  
is insured in the Laval Mutual Insurance  
Company. The fire was caused by a  
candle which had been left burning in  
the chapel.

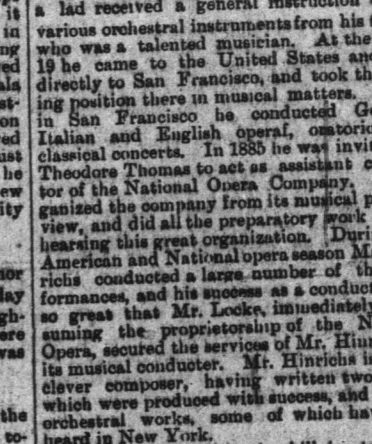
