A Fire, Believed to Have Been Incendiary, Destroyed \$15,000 Worth.

Simcoe, Ont., Oct. 13.—At 2 o'clock this morning fire broke out in the rear of the Methodist Church. It originated in the corner of the shed, which is built close to the church, and in which was considerable dry wood. The Rev. Mr. Prescott was one of the first on the scene, and noticed a stranger, apparently the worse of liquor, coming from the shed with a lantern. Suspicion points to the stranger, and it is generally thought to be incendiary. The building and contents are a total loss. Insured in the British America for \$5000.

The church and its contents were valued at \$12,000. There will be about \$4000 not covered by insurance.

This is the third of a series of bad fires, supposed to have been incendiary.
