



Tiflis Reports Say Control Being Secured.

Situation in Crimea Bad, a Dollar Worth 50,000 Rubles-Turkish Nationalists Have Eye on India.

Constantinople, Nov. 88—Armenia is passing under Bolshevik control, so it is said in reports received here from Tiflis. Turks and Bolshevik Tartars have effected a junction at Alexandropol, and it is probable the city of Erivan has been occupied by Turkish troops. Armenian troops are reported to be surrendering or seeking refuge in Georgia. The Russian Bolsheviki, it is said in reports from Sabastopol, are sending units from three armies now in the Crimean region to Baku and transcaucasus. The purpose is, it is declared, to give the troops a period of rest, and to arrange for a redistribution of forces in the Asiatic campaign.

London, Nov. —A despatch to the London Times from Constantinople says the Nationalists under Kazim Kaarabekin Pasha outflanked the Armenians, who fell back on the fortress of Arka, wheih was captured by the Turks.

The despatch adds that Alexandropol and the railway between Erivan and Tiflis are menaced and that the situation of the Armenians is critical.



How Exchange in European Countries Helped Dutch Traveler.

Venice, Nov. 8.—A Dutchman, who has been making a tour of Europe, visiting Venice among other places, gives the following curious account of his travel-

following curlous account of his traveling expenses.

He left his home in Maestricht to go to Paris with 20 florins. Those he changed into French money, getting for them 126 francs. His ticket cost him 24, so he arrived in the capital with 102. He then left for Turin, the journey costing him 44 francs.

At Turin he changed the remaining 58 francs into Italian money, getting for them 84 lire. Of those he spent 21 going to Venice, and other 18 in going to Munich. There he changed the balance of 45 Italian lire into Austrian marks, of which he got 225. A ticket Berlin cost him 100 marks and anher to Aix-la-Chapelle 110.

He was now within a dozen miles or of his starting point, Maestricht, and ad still remaining his 20 florins, 15 ustrian marks. Those he had changd into Dutch money getting for them nly 65 centimos (18 cents). The are was 78 centimos. 





### AS PRICES GO DOWN.

AS PRICES GO DOWN.

Improved feeling displayed on the Canadian stock markets yesterday, provided a healthy tonic after days of liquidation, and gave the financial district a chance to think it all over. So long as the descent in commodities and stocks is gradual, there is less room for rashness in selling, and more opportunity for picking up bargains on the exchanges. Few will make any claim with positivness that stocks have reached their bottom, as it is only necessary to study past reactionary movements to observe the unreasoning length to which declines may go. Some of the banks seem to expect easier money before long, and that will help the stock market. One broker reported that he had been offered a loan on stocks during the week for the first time in six months, and he took it at 61-2 per cent.

Another main condition affecting the market is the business situation, which has shown further signs of dullness, because of the deadlock between buyer and seller. A banker commenting on this condition yesterday said: "The deadlock will have to be solved by the seller accepting lower prices. The manufacturer will have to be satisfied with less


