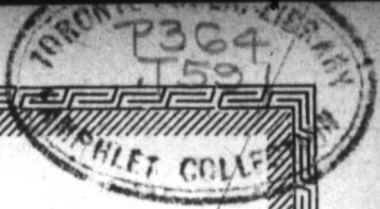

THIRTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE  
INDUSTRIAL REFUGE  
AND FOURTH OF  
THE AGED WOMEN'S HOME.

We shall this year give, *first*, the report of that part of our work, which, though the latest undertaken, is to a large number of our friends and the public, in a peculiar sense, more interesting.

But, before entering on details, let us devoutly thank our Heavenly Father, who has blessed our unworthy labors in this part of His vineyard, bringing us to the close of another year, not only without any serious trouble, in either department of our work, but enabling us to carry on both branches comfortably, and supplying all our pecuniary needs.

The *Aged Women's Home* has just completed its fourth year, and the unsought testimony of those who have placed



aged, feeble, and respectable women with us, has been most satisfactory. Said one lady, "It is one of the best institutions in town, and I mean to give you a double subscription." A gentleman says: "The poor old woman I so gladly pay for, has never been, for many years, so comfortable and contented as since she has been in the Home; it is a real benefit to have such a Home." Such remarks are made to us often, and so also is this question asked: "Why don't you build an addition so as to accommodate more?" To answer that requires consideration. We have had twenty and twenty-one old ladies, at a time, the greater part of the year, and that is as many as can be attended to, by one Matron and an assistant, especially, when it is taken into consideration, that twelve of these are over eighty years of age, and ten over seventy, and many of them, more or less feeble both in mind and body, thus requiring a great deal of care and kindness, as well as patience, in attending to their many little peculiarities and wants. Perhaps it would be well not to have a larger number in one Home. During the year two died, both very old and very considerable sufferers. One had been kindly looked after for some years by ladies of St. Peter's church, and, after placing her in our care, they regularly paid the monthly fee, and also, after her death, the funeral expenses. The other was admitted from the "Old Folks' Home," Terauley street. Some lady connected with that Home had agreed to pay the monthly fee, but after some time the payment ceased, and our Home was obliged to meet all expenses. We may mention here, that we do not admit any to the Home unless some church or friend becomes responsible for \$5 a month. And this last year we have adopted a printed

agreement, which must be signed by the responsible party, because, as in the case above mentioned, and one other still with us, the persons placing them in the Home have failed to meet the payment. The Home is intended only for *respectable old women*, and such are generally members of churches, or have friends interested in them, to whom it is a great comfort to know, that for such a small sum they can, in their old age, have a comfortable home and the necessary attention and care.

As we mentioned in last year's report, we do not make any *special* collection for this department of our work, neither do we receive any City grant for it, therefore we are grateful to all those who, recognizing the needs, kindly add—when giving their subscription for the Industrial Refuge—something for the Aged Women's Home. These special gifts will all be found in the list of collections.

To be the means of helping the old and feeble, who are left without any one to attend to their needs, to a place where they will meet with quiet comfort and patient care, is surely one of those works which will bring to the helper the blessing of the Master.

Miss Lee still remains our faithful, kind and careful matron.

Religious services were most faithfully given during the session by students from both Wycliffe and Knox colleges. We thank them heartily, and will look forward to a repetition of what is so much valued by the old people themselves. We are indebted also to several ladies outside the management for visiting regularly, and reading and praying



with the inmates. We would also thank Dr. Clapp for his unfailing kindness to them through much sickness.

With regard to the *Industrial Refuge*, we can say very little that is new. This is its 34th Annual Report, and in such institutions there is but little variety to record. Disappointments and encouragements alternate, the first preponderating, while dealing with this class of women. But surely, when we reflect on the value of one such, *saved*, we should not grudge our labor nor relax our efforts, nor cease to bear with patience their indifference to all earnest solicitation to lead a new life, nor their ingratitude, nor even their repeated falls. Our Saviour's "seventy times seven" is a very wide and comprehensive command, which we may not put aside, and instances are every now and then occurring which brings home, to our understandings, its wisdom, and very much of encouragement in our work.

Of those leaving the Refuge for service this year, two or three have been such—long borne with, often falling—but we trust at last in a hopeful way of becoming useful members of society. We mentioned last year, that owing to the Mercer Reformatory, the Haven, and the Good Shepherd,—institutions which deal more or less with the same class though differing from us in the method—we do not have as many of the young as we used to, and that holds good this year also, and indeed to a greater degree since the Salvation Army has also taken up this class and has a Refuge for them. Nevertheless, we still have those—though comparatively few in number—who are glad to avail themselves of the shelter of our Refuge, and prove it by the faithful work they do—their earnings this year,



with diminished numbers—still amounting to over \$1,600—and the interest they take in the work is unabated.

At the close of last year the number in the Refuge was twenty-seven. We have only added forty-two during the year; of these only eight have gone to service, but these have done and are doing well. This may seem to some a poor record, but analyzed it means, that the sixty-nine of this year, have done better than the eighty-five of last. The proportion of work is considerably greater. Now, too, we find that comparatively few Roman Catholics come to us, the Good Shepherd and House of Providence looking carefully after those belonging to that church.

Our lessened numbers has induced us to try and do without a sub-matron, Mrs. Spence and her daughter now taking the sole charge. To their united attention to, and care for, the interests of the Refuge, both as regards the inmates themselves, the economical management, and the remunerative work done, we owe very much and appreciate highly their services.

The managers desire to thank Dr. Brittain, very heartily, for his kind attention to the needs of the inmates in the Refuge, and also for attending to those in the Aged Women's Home during Dr. Clapp's absence.

The managers would also assure all those, both ladies and gentlemen, who so faithfully attend to the religious instruction and services, that they appreciate their kindness very highly.

We also thank David McGee, Esq., for his kind attention, for so many years, to the Auditing of the Accounts.

For several years Dudley & Burns have published our Annual Report at greatly reduced rates, we beg to acknowledge how much we are indebted to them for this continued proof of their interest in both departments of our work.

We also thank the managers of the Bible and Tract Depository for a donation of Hymn Books.

*Some anonymous kind friend sent us yesterday \$15 for the Homes. Presumably the same who sent us \$20 in Feb. last which latter sum is acknowledged in our list of donations.* We desire to express our sincere thanks.
