Judgment that Without Agreement Giving the Shipper the Title, the Title Goes When the Goods are Delivered to a Common Carrier.

LAURENCE, Me., May 7.—The first case in Maine affected by the "original package" decision of the United States Supreme court has just been decided.

M. H. Cole of Boston, makes a claim for liquor seized by the state constable on the ground that the liquor belonged to him and was in the original package.

The judge held that in the absence of any agreement giving the shipper the title to such goods until delivered to the consignee the person ordering the goods as soon as they are placed in hands of a common carrier.

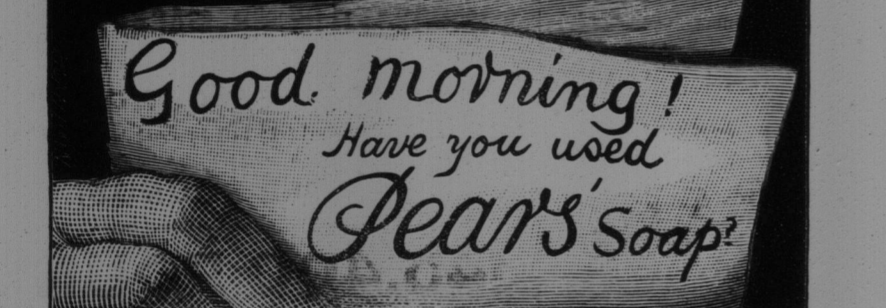
