THE CHURCH AND STATE.

The Church and State to be Separated

New York, Dec. 13.—A telegram from
a reliable source received yesterday says
the Brazilian government proposes to
separate the church from the state. Un
der the monarchy the established religion
was Roman Catholic but the constitution
guaranteed tolerance to all religions so
far as the performance of worship was
concerned, in buildings provided for
the purpose, but not without the exterior
of the churches, the Roman Catholic
clergy and their educational
institutions were maintained by an
annual cost exceeding the cost of
public education.

SWINDLER ARRESTED.

MOSES A. SHAW HAS BEEN SOUGHT FOR THREE MONTHS.

He is Arrested at Last—He is Charged
with Swindling to the Extent of
\$500,000.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.—Moses A. Shaw,
for whom the authorities of Bradford and
Tioga counties, Penn., as well as several
New York merchants have been searching
for the last three months, was arrested
today on a charge of swindling
to the extent of several hundred thousand
dollars.
Shaw first became known to commercial
circles as a lumber dealer in Towan
da, Pa. His credit was so good that one
day he took \$50,000 from a bank in
Towanda to Philadelphia, N. J., where he
became more intimately connected with
the New York merchants, and carried on
more extensively than ever his peculiar
business methods.
The requisition from Governor Beaver
states that the full amount Shaw has
obtained by worthless notes is nearly
\$500,000.
