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At the Chinese inquiry, which held its first Victoria sitting in the board of trade room this morning, Frank W. Davey, surveyor of customs, occupied the stand the whole session under examination by Dominion Government Counsel George W. McCrossan. He gave particulars of the departmental methods of landing Chinese here and let light into the devious ways in which Chinese are smuggled into the country without payment of the poll tax, telling how a plot had been unveiled in which the Vancouver Chinese interpreter was alleged to have acted as a tax collector in a Chinese village. From Mr. Davey's evidence it was shown that a most stringent examination is followed on all boats arriving, so that Chinese are not allowed to leave the wharf, and those only after having been searched and placed under bond. Mr. Davey told of the attendance of W. J. Taylor, K. G. of the Chinese board of trade, Victoria, at the investigations of Chinese applying for entry here. It was also brought out that Chinese landing here in Vancouver mostly carried gold money, which was in direct contradiction to the story that the Vancouver interpreter had a bag of gold from which he handed small sums to Chinese as they came ashore.

ECHO OF THE CRIPPEN CASE... London, Feb. 7.—Despite the fact that Dr. Hawley H. Crippen died on the gallows for the murder of his wife, Florence Elmore, Ethel Clara Leneve, the woman with whom Crippen fled to Canada, by her lawyers yesterday demanded a retrial of the Crippen case. Miss Leneve's attorneys took their action before the probate court, in which Miss Leneve is seeking to obtain property willed to her by Crippen. They contended that the American doctor's conviction on such palpable evidence as was presented at the trial, which have no legal status in a probate court. The probate judge took the matter under advisement. In the event of a reversal of the verdict of the jury which convicted Crippen, the most serious legal scandal England has seen for decades is predicted.
