

ANNUAL MEETING LORD'S DAY ALLIANCE

Action to be Taken to Close up Theatres and Other Like Places on Sunday.

It was suggested that in all probability the support of the French-Canadan organizations will be solicited in this connection.

France Will Allow Germany to Employ Force to Put Down Riots.

Paris, March 30—Dr. Von Mayer the German Charge D'Affaires in Paris tonight handed to Premier Millerand a declaration from the German Gorernment, concerning the terms of occupation of the neutral zone by German

pation of the neutral zone by German troops

The Premier immediately expressed to Dr. Von Mayer formal reservations, and added that according to his information it was doubtful if the occupation of the Ruhr was indispensable. It was only in case of occupation and consequent infraction of article 44 of the Peace Treaty could not be avoided that the guarantees offered by the German Government came into play. The matter, he said, required further elucidation.

Dr. Von Mayer, on leaving M. Millerund said he hoped to have an answer as soon as possible.

Berlin March 30—France has abandoned her demand to occupy the neutral zone and has consented to grant Germany from two to three weeks to employ a strong force in the disturbed Ruhr area, according to an announcement made to the National Assembly today by Chancellor Mueller.




