**NOTES AND NEWS.**  
GREAT BRITAIN.  
At last accounts 300 vessels were build-  
ing at Glasgow on the Clyde, half of  
which will be steamers.  
In the river Mersey in England thousand-  
s of fish are dying owing to the offen-  
sive matters discharged into its waters  
from the mills. The dead and dying fish  
are generally brown.  
An association of Colliery owners has  
been formed in Wales to prevent loss  
from stoppage by strikes, etc. An insur-  
ance fund of £50,000 and a strike fund of  
£200,000 was formed.  
Miss Shanks, the daughter of a farmer  
at Ditch Hill, in England, was bitten in  
the arm by her uncle's dog about two  
months since. The wound was cancer-  
ous and on Sept. 24 the young lady was  
taken ill and after terrible suffering she  
died of hydrophobia.  
The fastest train on the English rail-  
ways is the Great Western Express be-  
tween the Paddington depot in London  
and Exeter. Its average rate of speed is  
45 64-100 miles per hour; but between  
Paddington and Brighton it travels at the  
rate of 53 62-100 miles per hour, including  
the stopping.  
Mr. Andrew Lusk, member of Parlia-  
ment for Finchbury, who has just been  
elected Lord Mayor of London, is the son  
of Mr. John Lusk of Ayrshire. He was  
born in 1818, and has for many years been  
a member of the House of Commons. He  
was elected Member of Parliament for  
Finchbury in 1868. In 1865 he was  
sent to the House of Commons to  
represent the borough of Finchbury,  
and was again returned in 1868.

An English firm recently purchased a
