An Ordinance for establishing an efficient system of Police in the Cities of *Quebec* and *Montreal*.

An Ordinance to provide for the security of the Province of *Lower Canada*.

An Ordinance to appropriate certain sums, annually, to enable Her Majesty to defray the expense of Pensions conferred on the Honorable *Jonathan Sewell*, Esquire, and the Honorable *James Reid*, Esquire.
