FIRE AND LIGHT COME HIGHER.

The Committee Wants an Augmentation of \$1500 More Streetlights—Some Unnecessary Hydrants. The estimates for 1923 were yesterday submitted to the Fire and Light Committee by Secretary McGowan. They exceed by \$1570 the appropriation of last year. The following is a summary:

Do We Want High Buildings? In the discussion that followed the first snag was struck when Ald. Foster objected to the purchase and maintenance of a new steam fire engine at a cost of \$7400. He held that those who erected high buildings should be compelled to take measures to protect them. In the United States they were trying to discourage the erection of high buildings. He moved that the clause be struck out.

Chief Ardagh urged the necessity of the clause passing. He said that at fires where they had to use long ladders the pressure was of necessity reduced, and cited the recent blaze in rear of King and Bay streets as an instance. Had there been a strong wind blowing that day I would not have given that piece of paper for that part of the water supply. Next I am going to ask that a new and large hall be erected in the centre of the city where I can keep my heavy ladders. As it is now by the time the hook and ladders reach a fire the hose is often laid and the way blocked.

More Electric Hydrants. Ald. Stewart held that the committee was paying too much for the water supply and he moved that the Waterworks Committee be asked to make a reduction of \$250 per hydrant. "We have 2780 hydrants and this would make a difference of \$695,000, nearly enough to pay for the fire engine."

Chairman Bell said there were hydrants that were not used once in 10 years and yet they had to be paid for. "Why, do you know there are hydrants on streets upon which there are no houses and hydrants are put down without our being consulted."

The motion prevailed. Ald. William Carlyle promising to do his best to secure its acceptance by the Waterworks Committee. Fireman Robert Foster was granted a three months' leave of absence owing to illness.

Secretary McGowan recommended electric lights at Ontario street, near railway crossing, one at Logan-avenue, north of Gerrard-street, Gas lamp one at Cavendish-street opposite Berens Church, one at Turner-avenue, one at Victoria-square, one at Blair-avenue, two at Cavendish-square. He reported against the two lamps asked for at base of Dunn-avenue.

Mr. Richard Scholtes was appointed fireman. He will, however, receive an ordinary fireman's salary until a vacancy occurs and he takes charge.

Mr. W. Leak with a request that the block of land, bounded on the east by G.T.R., on the north by Dundas-street, on the north by Bloor and on the west by the C.P.R., be taken out of the fire limit.

The City Commissioner reported against the proposal, but recommended that its portion of the block in Dundas-street (now in the brick limit) be taken out and be placed in the rough-cut limit.

Before the County Judge. Land Values Not to be Disturbed Without Adequate Proof. Yesterday Judge Macdonald heard appeal from assessments made by the County of Revision, Commissioner Maughan and Mr. Littlejohn were present throughout the entire day, as was Mr. Caswell, who acted for the city.

Joseph Duggan appealed against the assessment of the Woodbine racetrack at \$204,855. It was only \$70,000 last year, and he could not understand why the amount was raised. He refused to put a value on the land and the County assessed it at \$204,855. Mr. Martin McKee, refusing to go into the box and swear as to the value of his property, his appeal on lots 1072 and 1074 Queen-street east was dismissed.

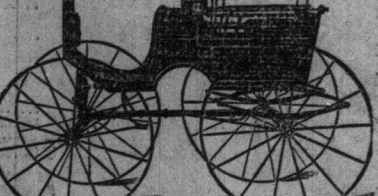
