



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DIRECTIONS

The Service of the 5th of November will be used, with the following modifications :

First.—Beginning with the Sentences, and ending with the *Jubilate*; including the proper Psalms and Lessons, as enjoined.

Second.—Instead of the first Collect at Morning Prayer, the first Collect in the same Office, shall be used, beginning with “*Almighty God,*” and omitting all the words after “*Mighty Deliverance,*” till you come to “*from this unnatural conspiracy,*” and thence reading to the end.

Third.—Before the General Thanksgiving, the Prayer “*For peace and deliverance from our enemies,*” shall be used.

Fourth.—In the Communion, the Epistle and Gospel, for the same Office, viz : the 5th of November, shall be used.

Instead of Venite Exultemus, the proper Hymn shall be used.
