It is suggested that after the proposed bill has been submitted and approved, it still rests with the Corporation to determine whether or not it will accept the same.

By 55 Vic, Cap. 10, as amended to 14th August, 1921, in Section 1, it is provided that the Corporation may, by resolution, acquire the right of using and running the streets of the City on all days except Sundays.

It seems, therefore, to be reasonably clear that the Corporation gave simply the right to the company to use the streets of the City for six days in the week, and that the company agreed to pay the City for such use.
