Claims a Population of 450,000, With Bright Hopes for More.

Montreal, July 1—(Special)—The thirty-seventh birthday of the Canadian Confederation finds the commercial metropolis of the country with a population of 450,000. Scarcely a city of comparable size in this continent.

There are not fifty houses to let in all this great city, and if they were at all fit to lodge people in there would be in reality no residences to be had for love or for money. There are one thousand houses now building, and if it had not been for the labor troubles five thousand new habitations would be dearer the mark.

Mayor Laporte, who has lived in Montreal all his life, has made the statement that Montreal's population has increased 75,000 during the past three years and that the commercial metropolis of the Dominion will pass the half-million mark in the near future.

His worship states that no one seeing the tremendous crowds on the streets on St. Jean Baptiste Day can help but realize that Montreal must have taken her place amongst the great cities of the American continent.

CAMPING IN THE BARREN LANDS.
Vivid Description of an Outing in the Great Northwest.

The barren lands, called by the Indians "Land of the Six Winds," are absolutely devoid of any trees, but even of brush, except for some stunted bushes to be found in occasional spots near the water's edge. These lands lie in N. W. Territory, near the Great Slave Lake.

One of the first lessons I learned, as a writer Mr. Whitney, "was to keep my face free from covering and also as clean shaven as was possible under the circumstances. It makes me hard to remember the elaborate head arrangement which was fitted for me in Canada, and which they described as one of the most important articles of my equipment. It covered the entire head, ears and neck, with one exception only for eyes and mouth, and in town I had viewed it as a great find; but I threw it away before I had been in a thousand miles north of the barren grounds.

"The most trying hour in the twenty-four was at the beginning of the afternoon. The fire furnished no warmth; it was only for the purpose of drying the clothes and, perhaps an idea of its size can be given by saying that the whole of the snow in the kettle had melted into water and the water began to boil the first hour.

"Sleep never came until the dog had finished fighting over us, for as soon as we were lulled to sleep the dogs poured into the tents. There were twenty-eight dogs, and the noise was kept seven feet in the air, and I was base.
