RIOTING IN THE

AZORES ISLAND

Lisbon, Sept. 26. (via frontier)—There has been a resumption in the Azores Islands of the serious rioting that broke out about ten days ago as a result of the anger of the population aroused by the failure of the local authorities to take preventive measures against the bubonic plague.

The people of Horta, on the Island of Fayal, which is isolated because of the pogrenor, are dying of hunger, and when the governor, are dying of hunger, and when the governor, at the head of a piatoon of troops, attempted to prevent the landing of a boat from Picolisiand with supplies, the maddened populace, frenzied by their hunger and sufferings, attacked the troops with all sorts of weapons. 



FIVE BROKERS IN JAIL FOR THEFT

Members of Firm of A. O. Brown & Co. of New York are Charged With Larceny -Woman Says They Stole


