

Answer of Officerless Company
When Imperial Officer Tells Them to Retreat After Capture

of Trench Toronto, July 16—In a letter dated June 15 and written on stationery of the Grand Hotel du Louvre et Termnus Boulogne-sur--Mer, to Jack Hervert, of Toronto, Captain D. W. Megafin, of 165 Close avenue, a member of the 12th York Rangers, 4th Battalion, E. E. F., recounts how fifty-four out of Stressey of his men were wearded.

the 12th York Rangers, 4th Battalion, C. E. F., recounts how fifty-four out of fifty-seven of his men were wounded and how nineteen of these had won the "wooden cross."

He tells, too, of a company of York Rangers who, without officers or non-commissioned officers, advanced, took a German trench and refused a British officer's orders to retire "because they were Canadians."

The letter reads: "I was in hospital for a long time. I am better and back again in this inferno. It is awful. I lost fifty-four men out of fifty-seven, and nineteen of the fifty-four have a wooden cross over them. We lost twenty-four officers in four hours.

"My battalion paraded 181 strong after the battle of Ypres. They were at once ordered to St. Julien, where the 12th boys (York Rangers), without officers or N. C. O.'s went on and took a German trench and held it until reinforcements came up and relieved them. An imperial officer told me that he had ordered them to retire and that they had promptly told him to go to blazes as they were Canadians and never retired. This may sound strong, but on my honor it is true. Nothing finer ever trod than my boys.

"I am, as you will notice, a little shaky (referring to his writing, which is remarkably clear), but feel O. K. Of course you know of our casualties. They were terrible, but grand."

ITALIAN CLERICS IN WAR

60,000 Are Said To Be Taking Part—
Chaplains, Red Cross Workers and Officers

Rome, July 16—According to a Vatican report, there are now about 60,000 Italian ecclesiastics in the Italian army. They are engaged variously as chaplains, as Red Cross workers or as officers.

Cardinal Falconio, former apostolic delegate in the United States, recently visited his ancient Franciscan monastery of San Antonio, where he found more than a dozen fellow monks dressed in military uniform, and full of enthusiasm to go to the front.

An alternative proposal affects the entry of Roumania into the field of action on the side of the Germanic powers. In this event the ceded territory would be extended to Czernowitz and the line of the Pruth and the frontier on the Danube would be extended beyond the Iron Gates and include Mehadia. The undertaking mentioned in regard to the situation of Roumanians in Hungary, would also apply, but allowing complete autonomy to Transylvania. There was also an undertaking that the Austro-German armies will occupy Besserabia and hand it over immediately to Roumania. Germany guarantees the execu-

The significant point is that they have fixed the term of one month in which either alternative arrangement must be agreed to. This is the time the Germans hope that the Turks will be able to hold out in the Dardanelles.

The proposals are being considered by the king and prime minister. In political circles they are regarded as a manoeuvre to delay diplomatic action by Roumania.






