Myrtle V. Hopkins Tossed High and Dry on Ledges Off Sydney Harbor Yesterday --Crew Rescuel.

Sydney, N. S., Nov. 16.—Within hight of Flat Point light, after her secondard by age had almost been completed are staunch three-masted schoone Myrtle V. Hopkins, from Halifax for North Sydney, was tossed high and dry on the rocky ledges west of the light this afternoon, and at sunset the great seas had pounded her to pieces. In®Ballast.

In*Ballast.

The schooner was in ballast, and when she reached the harbor entrance this morning a strong north, northwest wind was blowing and deeming it unwise to continue up the harbor under her own sail, Capt. Zinck decided to anchor a short distance inside the light. The heavy wind increased to a gale, which continued throughout the day and kicked up a heavy sea. Despite the fact that both anchors were out the Hopkins continued to drift on the forbidding lee shore. When it became evident that the big schooner could not hold her anchorage, signals for assistance were hung out and shortly before noon the Dominion Coal Co.'s tug C. M. Winch started out, but did not get further than North Sydney. The captain claiming that the sea was too heavy to render assistance. The Hopkins continued to drive slowly but surely towards the shore, and at three o'clock she struck on the rocks, being the ledges. In a few minutes her keel was torn out and a hole pounded in her bottom, the force of the wind and water sending her high up as each succeeding breaker struck her.


