TO find the hour of the day by this Table, take a staff, of what length you please, and (with a pair of Compasses) divide it into ten equal parts, marking them upon the staff, then in some plain level place where the Sun' shines set it upright, and mark where the end of the shadow thereof falls; then measure with your staff, the length of the shadow, and note the parts it contains, which find out in this Table against the day of the month, and over head you have the true hour of the day. For example, suppose the 13th of May or 30th of July, I should find the shadow of the staff to be forty three parts and one quarter (that is four staff lengths three parts and one quarter) therefore seeking in the Table against the said days, I see over head that it

is then either 6 o'clock in the morning or 6 in the evening; so that if your observation was in the morning it was 6 o'clock; or in the afternoon 6 o'clock.

By this example you may see the easy and excellent use of the Table, which is as ready as any moveable Sun-Dial; so that where-ever you are, or travel, you may, having this Almanack about you, speedily have the true hour of the day.
