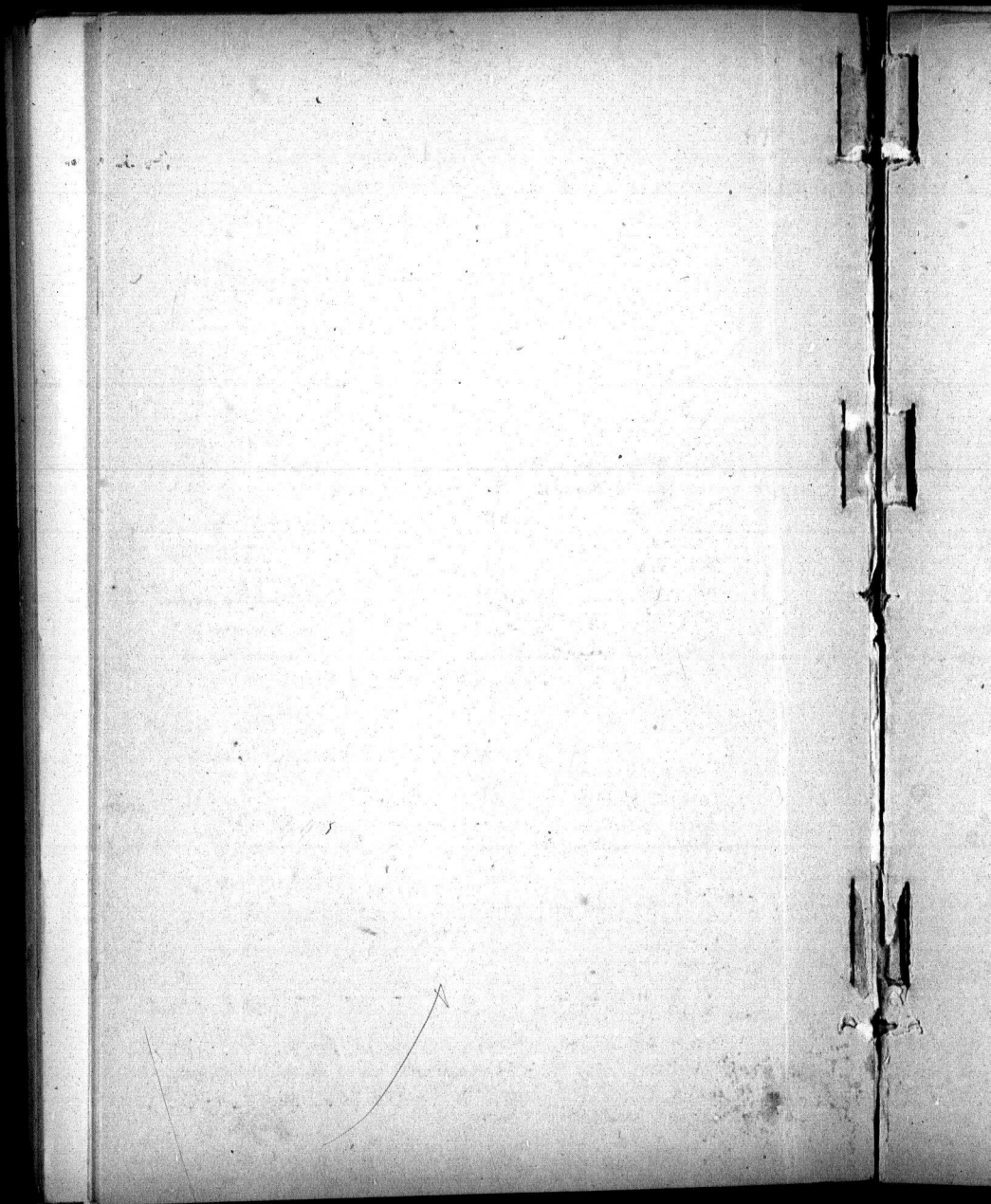

Rev. W. C. Clark, the pastor, read the report of the Kirk Session. Moved by Mr. T. H. Shields, seconded by Mr. D. McClure that the report as read be adopted. Carried.

Mr. John Anthony read the report of the Session Fund and then moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. Robertson. Carried.

Miss K. Robertson read the Ninth Annual Report of the McLaren Mission Band and moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. J. Anthony. Carried.

Mr. J. C. Kirkwood read the annual report of the Sabbath School and moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. Jno. McClure. Carried.

Miss M. Smith read the thirteenth annual report of the W. F. M. Society and moved its adoption, seconded by Mrs. R. Patterson. Carried.

MANAGER'S REPORT

It is with pleasure, not unmingled with regret, that we present the financial statement of the Congregation for the past year. Old names have ceased to appear on the weekly envelope from time to time through the year, their owners having removed which is regrettable apart from the financial aspect, while new ones, on the other hand have appeared in favorably proportionate numbers, and in the free way in which new members and adherents have taken up this side of their responsibility lies a chief cause of pleasure and thankfulness. Our great ambition is, with God's blessing, to have sufficient funds supplied to meet all stipulated and incidental expenditure on strictly Christian principles—that is of free will without personal solicitation. While granting that is only from Christian principles which involve mutual obligation to each other as a congregation that contributions have been made, still we can hardly refrain from taking the liberty of thanking heartily all contributors to the general fund from which the congregation's

liabilities are paid. The margin of funds, after meeting due claims, at no time of the year was at all extensive and at times due claims were in advance of funds, yet not of long duration was this the case at any time, and when the year closed all current claims and bills, so far as rendered, had been paid, leaving a balance on hand. This is better than 1896 closed, although arrears of that year balanced accounts, but it is due to the receipt of \$50.00 bequeathed by the late Mrs. W. Patterson and somewhat less expenditure, and not to increase of regular receipts.

The small square envelopes in which the weekly offering is made and on which contributions are kindly requested to mark amount enclosed, are on the table in vestibule, where each one may supply himself or be supplied by speaking to one of the ushers.

When looking back over our—the congregation's—financial affairs of the year that has gone, it has been thought by the managers that it would be well at the same time to forecast certain special work for the coming year, in addition to the usual routine, so that it may be duly considered by all. For some time past the renovating, &c., of the church building, especially inside, has been spoken of, if not an absolute necessity, a thing much to be desired, and now it is thought that the time has fully come when the congregation generally will approve of putting into practice this project some time during the present year. The putting in of a new organ, which has been contemplated for many a year, if it is to be done any time in the near future, would no doubt be better and more cheaply done at the same time as the other work. A breathing time has been had since the debt on our church was cleared off, and now, seeing that old Time has been leaving finger marks here and there, and that too much relaxation in church effort, even on the temporal side, is not conducive to health, it would, we believe, be proper and to the congregation's welfare to undertake the proposed work. The Managers simply recommend the foregoing to the congregation, and while speaking of material concerns they recognize and wish to emphasize most emphatically that spiritual growth, which springs from the cordial acceptance of Christ and His precepts, is the only standard of all true progress, and without this all other kind is in vain. Desiring to be guided by God's will, and longing to be more fully endowed with the spirit of Christ, we hope for a year of true prosperity, more Spirituality, and a sufficient supply of the things that are promised to be added to this.

Thirteenth Annual Report of Brampton Auxilliary of the W.F.M.S.

Meetings have been held regularly during the year on the first Friday of each month, with the exceptions of the months of July and August.

In April the Rev. Dr. Buchanan gave an interesting address on the Bheels of Central India.

Our annual thank-offering meeting was held in November. Mrs. MacRae, of Guelph, was present and gave an earnest and practical talk on the work in our own society. The thank-offering, amounting to \$35.70, was larger than the three previous years.

A bale of clothing valued at \$43.00 was sent to the Northwest Mission Schools in September.

Our membership is about the same as last year and numbers 72. Of these 21 are scattered helpers. The amount of money raised during the year is \$109.06.

We desire to place on record our appreciation of the services of our Scattered Helpers Secretary, Mrs. Hunter, who has removed from town.

While our meetings have been as well attended and as much interest has been shown as in previous years, we would urge on ourselves the need of individual effort. And that in every department of our work we many go forward and attain to a greater degree of prosperity and blessing in the coming year.

REPORT OF SABBATH SCHOOL FOR 1897.

The report of the Sabbath School this year is a brief one.

The attendance during 1897 has not been so large as in past years; and there has been a falling off in the collections. We began the year with a deficit of \$13.00 and we end the year with a shortage as great. We support a pupil at the Pointe-aux-Trembles schools at an annual cost of \$50.00. This year we have raised only \$47.00 for this object.

The teachers at their recent annual meeting were compelled to make large reductions in the number of papers and lesson helps that are distributed gratis to those who attend the Sabbath School.

The library is in a sad state, and though it is universally admitted that a well chosen Sunday school library is a great help to children and young people, our library has little attraction for anyone and must soon be closed altogether unless help and interest are forthcoming from those outside the school. Money that was raised for library purposes has been used to pay other claims to make our yearly deficit less. We have been forced to conduct our school cheaply. The best work requires money. We are compelled to look to the congregation for assistance. We want from you sympathy and money and we need teachers regular and occasional. Surely in a congregation of almost 500 members there should be no lack of all these things we need.

The Sabbath school had its annual picnic at Eldorado in June last and a pleasant day was spent.

There has been begun a regular teachers' meeting in 'connection with our school—a hopeful sign of increased life. It is the earnest desire that these meetings may be continued and a strong plea is made to the teachers for their loyal help and regular attendance. The great secret for success in any undertaking is the spirit of cheerful service coupled with faithfulness, and we enjoin on all a hearty diligence in the practice of these virtues.

THE NINTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE McLAREN MISSION
BAND.

In comparing our report with that of last year, we find the result to be greatly encouraging.

The number of names enrolled as regular members was thirty-eight, showing an increase of five names and the average attendance was twenty-two, four more than that of last year.

There have been seventeen regular meetings held during the year, these meetings being devoted alternately to the study

of different mission stations and to the making of a quilt and scrap-books.

On several occasions short papers on mission work were read, and short programmes rendered by the younger members of the Band. A comparative new branch of our work is in connection with "scattered helpers," during the past year we had three.

Our money has been raised in much the usual way, by membership fees, contributions to mite-boxes, and the proceeds of a concert and two "at homes." The total amount of money realized was thirty dollars and sixty-two cents. Besides this a box containing clothing, quilt and scrap books, valued at six dollars and fifty cents, was sent to the North West.
