

Turning From Gold to Silver.
The Yukon is turning from gold to silver mining. While the value of the former, or its purchasing power, has decreased, that of silver has been doubled. There is great activity in two silver bearing areas tributary to Dawson, the Mayo district on the upper Stewart river and along the Twelve-snile creek. These fields are 150 miles apart. Silver was discovered in these areas years ago, but no work was ever done.






