Before our next issue St. Alban's people will be getting ready for their usual delightful holiday in connection with the Sunday School Picnic and Congregational Outing, so successfully carried out in previous years. Date and place have already been decided by the Sunday School authorities unanimously choosing the well-proved and favourite spot Bond Lake, for Wednesday, July 4th. It is hoped that many of the congregation will bring their friends and help to make

the excursion a great success. Bond Lake has many attractions, besides the delightful trip of some eighteen miles through the picturesque scenery of the York Highlands, and ideal picnic grounds, well provided with pavilions, swings, boats and other accommodations.

Sunday, June 17th, St. Alban's Day, Confirmation Service will be held in the Cathedral at 7 p.m. by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.
