"No, I'm not. He actually demanded to share my wealth with me!"

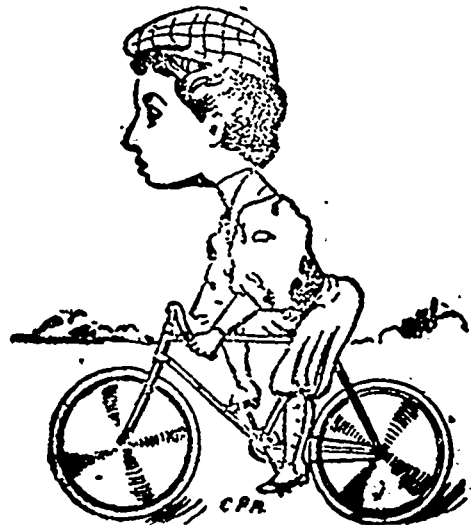
"Ravie did that? Why, papa, what did he say?"
