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


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Foreword



"**B**ETTER BUILDINGS," as a book, contains a selection of actual photographs of attractive and practical buildings, suitable for Western Canada.

Careful thought has been given to present between the covers of this one book, a variety of plans covering a wide range in size and design of houses and barns. Interesting and instructive educational matter is given covering methods of construction; details as to outside walls; floors and roofs; articles on interior and exterior decoration, and information about water supply systems, plumbing, sewage disposal, heating and electric lighting. These latter items mentioned are more particularly for the rural dweller. This plan book is presented to the reader as an aid to him in selecting a plan and design which will best suit his needs, and to assist him in working out the construction of his home.

Blue prints, working drawings, general information, and full details of plans and designs shown herewith may be obtained on application at our office.

It is possible that the particular requirements of a family may dictate some change in the plans as being desirable, or that special problems will be created by the desire of the builder to house an assortment of stock different from that capable of being housed in the barns shown; or it may be that the individual will wish to have worked out his own ideas that will be to him more satisfactory than those illustrated. Our Service Department is maintained for this purpose, and is at the disposal of intending builders to work out special plans, preparing specifications, and to assist our customers generally in working out the plans and details of home building.

The advertising appearing in this book is instructive and educational. Much valuable information about building supplies and products that go into home construction may be gained therefrom. The intending builder may use "Better Buildings" with confidence, that in selecting any plan or design herein shown, it will give him, if followed, proper construction and an up-to-date building which is not an experiment, but one that has been built and proven satisfactory in Western Canada.

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BUILDINGS can be "Better Buildings" in a variety of ways. They can be "Better" in exterior appearance, in construction, in interior arrangement, and "Better" in the little things that make for comfort, convenience and economy of labor around the home. "Better Buildings" need not necessarily mean more expensive buildings, as in many cases better arrangement can be had for the same or less expense.

Individual tastes will generally dictate the style of exterior desired. The matter of the outward appearance of the home, however, deserves more careful thought than is usually given. The individual's standing in the community is influenced by the exterior appearance and surroundings of his home. The first impression received is usually a lasting one. One is labelled as having good taste or bad; as being progressive or indifferent; as being worthwhile or the reverse; through the appearance of his home.

EXTERIOR DESIGN

Without entering into the technically architectural classifications of houses, designs can be classified under the general headings of bungalow, square house with hip or gable roof, and the gambrel roofed house. Illustrations of the different types are shown.

The square house, with its pitched roof and verandah, is effect that can be obtained ornament. Proper effect can proportioning of height of walls house, and the correct pitch of the verandah should correspond to the house in order to gain a pleasing effect.

The gambrel roofed house is a near relative to the square house, in that the same arrangement of the rooms can be obtained. The elimination of the attic is advisable in Western Canada on account of saving the heating of a third story. Many pleasing designs of this type are shown, which have been worked out through proper proportioning.

There are many houses with beautiful exterior effects that cannot be classified under the headings of bungalow, square or gambrel roof types. They are classified very generally as the story and one-half types. A popular design in Western Canada features the bungalow, places the second floor, and facilitates

Keeping in mind the general features above mentioned, and by studying the various designs, the intending builder can work out a design which will be a credit to himself and the community in which he lives.

The bungalow type of house is very attractive and deserves its popularity. The rooms are all on one floor, thus doing away with the effort of climbing stairs. The low building gives less exposure to cold winds, and the low sweeping outline is in keeping with a prairie setting. The tendency to spread the building over too much ground, which makes heating arrangements more difficult, should be avoided. Originally the bungalow was designed for warm climates; the

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INTERIOR ARRANGEMENT

The planning of the interior of the house must be controlled by the accommodation required, both in living and sleeping rooms.

Careful consideration should be given to the arrangement, that the house, when completed, will be satisfactory not only at present, but, in years to come.

The sleeping rooms should be planned for good ventilation and the door and window openings arranged to give the proper placing of the beds and other sleeping room furniture.

It is important that all outside door openings have vestibules to keep out the cold which always gets in around door openings. Usually the back door has a wash room or storage shed which serves as a protection, but the front door should have a built-in vestibule for this protection alone.


When there is considerable outside help it is advisable to locate the dining room so that the help need not go through the kitchen or front of the house to reach it. The cellar way should be located so as to eliminate the carrying of produce or furnace ashes through the house.

In planning the size and arrangement of the living room, it should be remembered that the old idea of a "Parlor," "Front Room," or "Company Room," as it has been variously called, has lost its popularity. Valuable space was wasted. It has been replaced by the modern living room. Every square foot of space is made worth while. It is a room comfortable and attractive to the whole family and the family's friends. Long winter evenings are spent here, and usually the very pleasant luxury of the fire place is considered a necessity. The fire place with its ornamental mantel is a decorative feature, and it is well worth while, too. The living room is not only a room for winter evenings, but an all day every day room as well. It should have plenty of window opening space for light and fresh air. Attention should be given to the door and window openings in living rooms, to accommodate the placing of piano, book-cases, and other furniture.

The size of the kitchen should be generous. This is the place in which the woman spends most of her time, and her working arrangements should be such as to eliminate all unnecessary steps. A logical arrangement is to have the sink located where there will be plenty of light, and between the stove and the table. At small expense an ironing board closet can be built to hold the ironing board, which can be hinged and let down when in use. The closet can also hold the broom, dust pan and sweeper. A handy kitchen cabinet can be built near the table to hold pots, pans, and cooking utensils, flour, spices, and those articles which are used most often. The ice box should be placed where it is most handy, but as far removed from the stove and furnace pipes as space will warrant, and the waste connected with the sewer or run outside the house. In planning the pantry it costs practically no more in material to have cupboards and drawers built and arranged to accommodate groceries, dishes, table linen and the like. "A place for everything, and everything in its place."

CONSTRUCTION

After the plan has been decided upon and building operation starts, the intending builder should pay special attention to proper methods of construction. An illustration is herein shown, which gives the standard construction, which has been adopted generally by the best builders and architects in the West. A careful study will answer in a general way the ordinary problems which will arise. Attention is called to the footings of the cellar foundation, bridging of the floor joists and roof construction. The outside wall construction should be studied carefully and followed, as this means in the finished building either a cold or warm house. Also note the details of construction around the windows. The same construction will apply to the door openings.







A home should be planned not only from the standpoint of utility and convenience, but also from the standpoint of beauty. Here is a home which combines both features. It has beauty, is compact, has no waste space, no room to be heated in the winter, a fine large verandah in the summer time. The first floor contains a large living room with a fire place, a spacious dining room, a den or office with a fire place, or if desired, it can be used as a bedroom. It has a large kitchen, a pantry with cupboards, a back shed, and wash room. One feature about the dining room is that it can be reached without going across the kitchen. The first floor provides a grade entrance to the cellar without entering the main part of the house.

A vestibule is provided for the front door which is necessary in Western Canada to keep out the cold in winter. The second floor has three large bedrooms with a sleeping balcony at the back, and an abundance of closet room. The toilet is separate from the bath and every room has plenty of light.



By studying carefully combinations of colors for decoration, you can readily imagine how it will look when actually built. Brown or green can be used for the shingle stain and with a white or deep cream for the lower part will give a very attractive effect. Here the home builder gets real value. It has none of the furbelows, but is solid, substantial and comfortable. Seven fine rooms are provided, a spacious




verandah is on two sides of the house with an upper verandah on the side as a sleeping balcony. The first floor has a pleasant living room with a corner bay window. The dining room has two windows and a door on the porch. The kitchen is provided with a sink under the window and with ample cupboard space on the two sides of the room. The side entrance is at grade so that you can go into the dining room or down cellar without entering the kitchen or any other part of the house.

The second floor has four good bedrooms and bath with toilet separate. The stairway to the second floor enters on a hall which provides entrance to all bedrooms.


on one side and a mullion window on the other, and is equipped with a fireplace. The dining room, in the opposite corner of the house is well lighted, and can be entered either from the kitchen or from the hall. The kitchen is of good size with a pantry and a small room off the kitchen which can be used either as a bedroom or den. On entering the front vestibule, doorways enter into the dining room, sitting room, kitchen, cellar, and to the second floor. A coat closet is arranged just off the front vestibule and a wash room, which also serves as a vestibule for the back door, completes the first floor arrangements. The second floor contains two large bedrooms with lots of closet room, bathroom, and front verandah; also ample storage space under roof at rear of bedrooms. The electric lights, modern plumbing equipment, water system, as well as heating arrangement, give everything to be desired for the rural dweller with a small family. From those who have lived in this house, we learn that the longer they have called it "HOME" the more they have to say in its favor.

If the bungalow effect is a favorite, but extra space is needed, here is a solution: Two sleeping rooms are placed on the second floor. The substantial lines of the porch, the wide cornice, the solid porch railing, the walls finished with shingles set in alternate courses of seven inches and two inches make this a distinctive house. The wide verandah will be found pleasant for summer afternoons and evenings.

The first floor plan has all the features of the California bungalow and is quite complete in itself. The pleasant living room has a bay window with a fireplace. The dining room is


The hall, living room and dining room, are connected by wide cased openings; thus, each of these rooms is apparently increased in size. The kitchen, pantry, and summer-kitchen, complete the downstairs.

Upstairs there are three bedrooms, and a bath room, also a convenient balcony platform at the rear. There are plenty of closets. The capacity of the closets can be increased by shelves, for storage during out-of-season months. The hall closet for linen is unique. Above are shelves for sheets, towels, etc. Below are four drawers for pieces easily crumpled, such as bureau sets or curtains.


The living room can be charmingly lighted by means of an indirect lighting fixture in the center, accompanied by four wall bracket fixtures.



The shingles on the gable ends and the shingled dormer window and the heavy bracketed cornice, makes the effect more pronounced. An effective color combination of white or cream below the belt and brown shingle stain above completes the exterior design.

The interior with its large living room, connected with sliding doors to the dining room, the kitchen pantry, one bed room, wash room, and convenient summer kitchen, completes the first floor.

The second floor has three large bed rooms and bath with plenty of closet space. A home to be proud of. 

The second floor has four nice bedrooms with plenty of closet space, and a sleeping balcony in the rear. The third floor is provided with three bedrooms for servants or extra sleeping accommodation in emergency.


Note that the chimney for the fire-place has two flues. The second flue serves the furnace. This is important in every house as each stove, heater, or furnace should have a separate flue of its own to give proper draught.

Here is a house with a high-pitched gable roof, containing all that is to be desired in a home, attractive in exterior design, and spacious room arrangement. On entering the house through the front vestibule, the hall gives entrance to the living room, the upstairs, the kitchen and the cellar. A grade entrance is provided on the right side to go down to the cellar and up to the kitchen. The living room is large with a bay window and windows on each side of the fire-place. The dining room has a window seat or buffet recess with three windows and a mullion at the end. Entrance to the kitchen from the dining room is made through the pantry where plenty of shelf room and drawers are provided. A wash room and cupboard space for brooms

all siding or brick veneer. No mistake will be made in choosing any one of these materials for the exterior walls.

This is, comparatively, only a small home—Twenty-four feet by thirty-six, and yet it will accommodate a big family. There are very few homes of the dimensions mentioned with five bedrooms.

To be "a joy forever," a home must be "a thing of beauty." Outside and inside, upstairs and downstairs, this is "a joy forever" home. Its general architectural lines with gables front and back and both sides; its overhanging eaves supported on heavy brackets; its wide, deep verandah with pillars ornamented with cap and base; its generous supply of windows, the upper sash of which are small paned; its grade entrance at the side; all deserve individual mention and each feature deserves emphasis. The individual taste of the home builder may be allowed all the freedom it wishes in making a choice as to whether this home built to this design and plans be stucco, half shingles and half siding,



The exterior of this small home of the popular bungalow type has gable ends of shingles, a belt of siding, with shingles to the ground line. The verandah and porch are large and attractive. The interior shows careful planning. The front entrance opens on a cheery living room, possessing a large oriel window and fire-place with built-in book cases. Between the living room and dining room is a very wide opening, giving the effect of spaciousness, an effect not always accomplished in a house of this style and type. The size of the dining room is further increased by a specially designed recess for the buffet, which may be built-in if desired and finished to suit the trim of the room.

The kitchen with pantry and cupboards has plenty of windows; a desirable feature for light and air are most essential in the workroom of the home.

The sleeping quarters are really an upstairs on the ground floor. They are completely isolated from the living quarters by a passage. There are clothes closets and a large bathroom.

A full basement, assures warmth for floors, provides ample space for heating arrangements and cistern, also vegetable and preserves cupboards.




GROUND FLOOR

The gambrel roof type of home is always attractive. The attractiveness of this particular example is increased by the decorative effect of the shingling and the overhanging eaves.

The living room and dining room are divided by a pilastered, cased opening. Ornamental pillars will add greatly to the effect of these rooms. The design of the fire place should correspond with the kind of furniture that will be used in the living room. Large leather-covered easy chairs, an oak cased piano, comfortable lounge, and an oak library table will suggest a substantial rough brick

fire place with an oak mantel shelf. If the furniture is to be more ornamental accordingly. Both of these rooms are very well lighted and are all that can be desired in a house of this size.


If the furniture in the kitchen is carefully placed the housewife will save herself unnecessary steps.

The wide cased opening between these commodious rooms would produce inc. a attractive point about that room. The kitchen opening directly from the dining room has opening off it in turn, the well laid out pantry, and the handy wash room. The basement is reached easily by the stairs leading directly from the kitchen. The three bedrooms have been mentioned previously, but attention has not been drawn to the ample bathroom. Notice it and—Now aren't you an enthusiast?

"It is just large enough and no more; it is as pretty within as it is without; it is perfectly well arranged and comfortable." This is the description in a nutshell of this lovely stucco bungalow. Such a description would persuade anyone to examine the details of this home. If six rooms—three of them bedrooms, and the other three of them living room, dining room, and kitchen—is the accommodation you require, if you appreciate the inherent advantages of the bungalow type of home; if you admire, as most people do, the effectiveness of the stucco treatment of the exterior walls; then—this is the home for you.

In spite of the fact that a general description such as the above must lead the prospective builder to an analysis and careful study of the design and plans, the temptation to emphasize some of the outstanding points cannot be resisted. Notice the artistic effect of the stucco walls run right down to grade; and the compact verandah of the main roof of the house. Note the overhanging eaves, supported on ornamented brackets. Can you resist the appeal of this home from the exterior? If you can resist it from the outside then step inside and become an enthusiast. Do you know that a vestibule is one of the hardest details to work into a bungalow satisfactorily? But this one has that most desirable feature; practically insurance against cold in winter.



All the rooms in this home are large and the planning has been carefully handled. Notice may well be drawn to the fact that the rooms on the ground floor may all be reached from the hall without it being necessary to pass through any one room to reach another.

The coat closet off the hall, convenient to both the front entrance and the grade entrance at the side, is a pleasing feature.



The kitchen is the most important room in the house and should be designed with due regard for convenience and saving steps. The positions of the stove, sink, work table, and cupboards have been carefully considered.

The second floor bedrooms are all well lighted. There is plenty of closet space and a linen closet in the hall.

The Bathroom is convenient to all bedrooms.


The attic may be finished to provide four bedrooms.

dumb waiter and broom closet handy to kitchen, and a large workable pantry with plenty of cupboards and drawers.

This house does not have a built-in vestibule, but a movable one is provided, about 4 ft. by 3 ft., built in sections, that may be easily removed in the summertime.

The outstanding feature of the second floor is the lack of waste space. It contains four good square bedrooms with closet space, bathroom, linen closet, stairs to attic and splendid balcony which is so much appreciated by the housewife.

Attic space is available for extra bedrooms if desired.

This is an alternative layout for No. 4010 being the previous design and is similar in external appearance. The bay window adds valuable space and attractiveness to a large, well-proportioned Dining Room, which may be further enlarged upon by utilizing the living room when occasions warrant.

The kitchen which is 15 ft. by 12 ft. is large enough to accommodate the hired help during meal times. The helps' bedroom, too, off the kitchen, gives access to sleeping quarters without interfering with the rest of the house. This little stucco semi-bungalow combines many features that are usually only found in the larger and more pretentious homes. All the lines of the exterior are suggestive of a cozy compactness. The pitch of the main roof corresponds with the pitch of the gables in being low. The overhanging eaves; the bevel of the shingled portion of the walls from grade up to the water table; the closed rail stuccoed verandah, with its substantial columns; all are designed particularly to carry out the cozy compact idea.


The interior also has many attractive features in keeping with the pleasing exterior effect. The two wide cased openings in the entrance hall open opposite each other, into the living room and dining room respectively. A glance into these rooms makes one feel at home at once.

The kitchen, pantry, wash room and help's bedroom, completes the first floor accommodation.

Three good-sized bedrooms, bath, ample closet room with sleeping balcony at the rear is the second floor arrangement.

The requirements of the housewife are important, and it is just as necessary for her to save time and labor by embodying every convenience in the home, as it is necessary to install machinery on the farm or in the factory. Therefore, in planning this house, as well as any house, the rough plumbing should be done before the house is lathed and plastered, as well as the electric wiring for the lighting system.

When this home is completed with modern conveniences installed it will be, indeed, a model small house.


A Popular Gable

This is a compact, attractive cottage. It is both livable and practical and can be built most economically.

The popularity of stuccoed exterior walls is well deserved, especially when the stucco is used in artistic combination with timber. The half-timber, and stucco gables of this cottage are an example of the effectiveness of this treatment.

The placing of the veranda is a little out of the ordinary. The triple window feature in the front suggests flower boxes as an artistic finish for summer, as well as providing, finish for summer, as well as providing, as it does, plenty of light and sunshine through the long winter months. The living room is large and cheerful. The kitchen admits the fact that the housewife of today has learned to concentrate her working materials close at hand. The convenient cupboard conserves space and eliminates steps. A suggestion might be added here; namely, that tables can be practically eliminated by the hinging of boards at convenient places in the wall. These may be dropped when not in use.

The second floor has three bedrooms and bath. These are provided with closets and linen shelves, also small storage or trunk room at head of stairs.


On the face of it, it should not be more difficult to design a perfect five-roomed bungalow than it is to design a perfect eight-roomed house; and it is not more difficult. The difficulty arises in making the design of the bungalow so that its cost, when completed, will be consistent with the accommodation provided.

In this particular home the architect has succeeded most admirably in combining the maximum of beauty in exterior; comfort and convenience in the interior; and economy of first cost.

The "all shingle" outside walls are admirably suited to this type of bungalow. The effect produced is one of substantial comfort in combination with quiet beauty. The hip roof, relieved in its severity of line by the gable roof of the verandah, is a big factor in the individuality of the home. The verandah may be so detailed that it can be screened in summer and glazed, to form a vestibule in winter. The living room and dining room are both fairly large in themselves—12 feet by 15 feet is a good-sized room—but the wide cased opening between them lends an effect of size to each that is very desirable.

The two bedrooms, with a clothes closet off each, are nicely laid out for furniture, are both well-lighted, and handy to the bathroom. The linen closet in the hall, for bed linen and towels, is something that the housewife will appreciate.


The kitchen lay-out has received the attention it deserves. Places for the stove and sink, table and kitchen cabinet are convenient to each other. Notice the stairs leading from the kitchen direct to basement, that make for a saving of steps.



There is no "ring" that is essential that is lacking in its interior arrangement and every feature of the exterior is attractive. It is not that we want to slight the exterior, but we do want to get inside this home just as quickly as possible.

Be one never so quick he would, of necessity, notice the wide deep verandah; the dormer windows and sleeping porch breaking the long line of the front sloping roof; the walls are half shingles and half siding.

INSULATION

THE IDEAL HOME IS WARM IN WINTER AND COOL IN SUMMER

Comfort, convenience and beauty are the three items a home builder should have foremost in mind in planning his home. Each factor is distinct in itself and must be considered separately. Comfort is, perhaps, the most important one, and entails the problem of making a building secure against outside cold or heat.

The word "Insulate" is derived from the Latin "Insula" meaning "island"—therefore the meaning, "is to place alone or in a detached situation"; hence insulation in a building is applied on the exterior walls under the roof and lower floors, to prevent, as far as possible, the passage of heat and cold.

Insulation is usually thought of in connection with electricity, or in connection with refrigeration. As applied to home building, although it is used, it is a term little known, but it is of vital importance in Western Canada on account of climatic conditions, and should be given careful consideration by the home builder.

INSULATION NECESSARY FOR COMFORT

A comfortable home can be obtained—always providing the heating plant is sufficient—by proper insulation of walls, floors, ceilings, and roof of the building. The walls and floors are insulated that the outside temperature will not come through to the interior, and the ceilings and roof, that the heat generated in the building will be confined and not allowed to escape in the winter time, or the outside heat in summer time come in.

The standard form of construction as shown on page two is one form of insulation. Its value lies in the air space between the studding. The courses of building paper, shiplap and siding have little, if any, value as insulation, but are simply to keep out the wind and to give strength to the structure. There is a constant movement going on at all times between the air currents of heat and cold inside the building as well as in the walls—an effort of the different temperatures to equalize. Heat rises and cold falls to take its place. The air spaces in this construction, although confined, are large in size and the circulation is rapid, so that the difference of temperature soon passes through the wall which minimizes its value as insulation.

CONFINED AIR BEST NON-CONDUCTOR

Air is recognized as being one of the best non-conductors of heat or cold and the efficiency of air as an insulator depends on its being confined in small spaces so that it cannot circulate. There is no material known that will entirely prevent passage of heat or cold. The best insulators, however, are those which contain the greatest amount of entrapped air in small spaces.

The several forms of insulation material for house construction available in the West are all made for the one purpose of making buildings comfortable, and all of them manufactured on the one principle of air as an insulator. The materials come in sheets or rolls in convenient sizes for easy application.

METHODS OF APPLICATION


There are two methods of applying insulation material to the side walls. One is to nail it between the studding by means of thin straps as shown in the illustration, which provides, in addition to the insulation material itself, two air spaces in the wall which is an advantage, although it is a little more difficult to apply. The other method is to nail direct on the studding. The method of application to the roof is to nail the material between or on the underside of the rafters. Care should be taken that a tight job is done, that there may be no communication for heat, cold or air to pass through.

True economy in building demands the use of every help at hand in construction in order to get desired results in comfort.

The value of insulation in home building goes further than comfort and health alone, which cannot be figured in dollars and cents. It means also the saving in fuel bills.

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

In summer time the screen can be removed and screens inserted. This house is easy to heat, is compact, and leaves little to be desired from the standpoint of room for the small family.

A man cannot expect to get full value for his efforts unless he has a pleasant home to spend his leisure moments, any more than a housewife is able to accomplish her work in a minimum of time unless her surroundings are pleasant and she has proper tools for doing her work, and a handy place to put them.

This is especially noticeable in the kitchen. Cupboards should be built and arranged so that each utensil will have a place which will be most convenient for ready use.

A good rule in working out cupboard arrangement for keeping things, is to get a meal in the old kitchen and to lay the utensils down in the easiest place when working and then in the new kitchen build the equipment necessary in that place.

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



THE HEATING SYSTEM

A Properly Heated Home Means Pleasure and Comfort

Modern conveniences today are within the reach of everyone. No one need be deprived of electric lights, modern plumbing, and heating equipment.

Imagine yourself in a home without modern heating improvements. Picture yourself getting up on a cold winter's morning without a fire in the house, the water frozen, the house filled with unpleasant odors on account of lack of ventilation, or imagine coming home from a long winter's drive to a cold cheerless house where a fire must be built in the kitchen stove and rooms heated before you or the family can hope to get warm. Then picture to yourself a home with a heating system, where every room is equally heated all the time, hot and cold running water, well ventilated house and a bathroom. This is the difference between losing and winning, the difference between comfort and inconvenience and misery.

Many years' experience in the installation of heating plants has taught manufacturers certain well-established rules.

A heating plant is practically worthless unless it warms the whole house comfortably and easily without forcing the furnace. Therefore, in planning the heating system of the proposed home furnace experts should always be consulted.

ITEMS TO CONSIDER

There are several items which enter into the installation of warm air heating systems which mean results.

First. The proper size of furnace for the building.

Second. The furnace should be located as near as possible to the centre of the cellar. If impractical in the centre the North and West sides should be favored.

Third. Hot air pipes should be equal in cubical contents to the size of the cold air pipes, no more air can come into the furnace than goes out of it.

Fourth. The pipes in the cellar should be as short and as near the same lengths as possible.

Fifth. Register openings should be of equal capacity to the size of pipe serving them.

Sixth. No warm air pipe should be located near a cold air pipe.

Seventh. The furnace should have a separate flue as good draft is essential.

Eighth. Pipes in the cellar should be insulated to conserve heat.

The ideally warm air heated home is one where the circulation of air is gradual and even, flowing easily and freely from the registers.

HOT WATER AND STEAM

Hot water and steam heating each has its advantages. Many of the heating problems discussed above found in warm air heating apply to hot water and steam as well. The arrangement of a house may adapt itself for one form of heating system better than for other forms. Therefore, it is as well that heating experts be consulted.

The inevitable question arises in the heating problem: "What is the cost?" The best answer to this question is that a heating system can be obtained for not much more than the price of a couple of cows or a span of horses and less sometimes than a long spell of sickness or a first-class funeral.

A heating system properly installed is a constant source of pleasure and comfort.

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
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Ground Floor

BARN. A GOOD SIZED HORSE BARN.

PAINTING

PRESERVATION and DECORATION

THE finishing touch in home building is the painting. The reasons for painting are two fold, preservation and decoration. Preservation is the most important and, perhaps, the least thought of by the average home owner.

How often one hears the expression—"My house would look good with a coat of paint." The real reason for painting is overlooked. Paint is applied to exterior surfaces of buildings to preserve and protect wood against the action of the elements. Decoration is, and should be, an afterthought. Therefore, it is evident from the home owner's standpoint, after he has spent time, thought and money building a nice house barn, that he preserve that building by keeping it well covered with paint.

There are only two known metals having weather resisting properties that can be converted into pigments from which a lasting paint can be made. These two metals are lead and zinc. Linseed oil is the life of paint when used on exposed surfaces. The surface of the wood absorbs the oil which has in suspension the lead and zinc pigments. These metals, by means of the oil, fill the pores of the wood and when dry, form a tough, elastic, unbroken film over the entire surface and give a perfect metallic protection from the elements.

A well constructed building, if properly preserved with good paint, will last a life-time. There are buildings in the New England States today 200 years old in perfect states of preservation, because they have been well protected with paint. The same thing applies to farm machinery. It is a well known fact that more machinery rusts and rots out than wears out because of the lack of paint.

It is equally true that no matter how well constructed a building may be if the outside lumber does not have its surface protected with a water-proof material the wood will soon check, crack, rot and go to pieces. The reasons for painting are so apparent and simple that further comment seems unnecessary.



A HARMONIOUS EFFECT

RULES FOR PAINTING

Cover all knots and sappy places with shellac before painting. Priming coat should be thinned with Pure Linseed Oil—raw oil preferred. Putty all cracks and nail holes after first coat. Work paint well into the wood. Good brushes are important. Wood and weather must be dry. Never paint in the heat of summer sun or in cold or frosty weather. Put on second coat not less than four or five days after first coat, and third or finishing coat after second coat is well hardened. Pure lead zinc and linseed oil is the best paint and the cheapest at any price.

COMBINATION OF COLORS

The new coined term "Camouflage" is used in home decoration and wonderful effects are obtained. Proper combination of colors will make an unsightly building pleasing, a large building look small and a small building have the appearance of size, a tall building low and a low building have the appearance of height. For instance a low set cottage painted a light color, as cream, with contrasting dark trim of brown, tends to make the house wider and taller. A large building in a dark shade, as terra cotta, trimmed in a cream, makes the building stand out with pleasing effect—The West has few trees—green for roofs is in great favor.

INTERIOR DECORATION



A PLEASING ENTRANCE

First impressions are usually lasting ones. A pleasing front hallway with an attractive staircase is always to be desired. The above hall and stairway is bright and cheerful. The white enamel trim is relieved by the mahogany stair rail and steps. Then the soft cream and ivory walls and ceiling and the beautiful floor in the natural wood protected by a waterproof floor varnish is pleasing. One is agreeably attracted with the entrance and looks with anticipation to further pleasant discoveries.

Living rooms should be decorated to give a feeling of cheer and restfulness. The living room shown herein is cheerful and rich in its effects of golden oak trim and the walls in buff and ceiling in a lighter shade.

THE FIRE PLACE

Fire places are always an addition to the home and a great source of pleasure and comfort. In the early days it was the hearth stone where the family met for instruction and prayer and the stranger was welcomed; here it was by the firesides friendly warmth and glow that childhood's stories were told, deeds of bravery recounted and tales of future success and romance woven.

Modern conveniences have supplanted the fire place as a necessity but we have not outgrown its beautiful old memories nor the permanent charm of its leaping flames and sense of cheer, besides a fire place aids wonderfully in the furnishing and decoration of the home. The contrast of the light walls, dark woodwork and beautiful brick colorings is always pleasing.

SLEEPING ROOM DECORATION

Bedroom decoration should always tend to a feeling of cheerfulness and restfulness. White enamel trim is always good with delicate tints for walls and ceilings and floors finished in natural wood protected by varnish.

North side bedroom walls should have delicate tints of pink, light yellow, cream ivory light tans or buffs with white cream or ivory ceilings.

My Home! Our Home! These words always cause a thrill of pride and they are as old as father time.

In these days we are proud of our homes because they are OUR HOMES and because we want them to express our ideals of comfort, convenience and beauty.

Interior decoration many times best expresses our ideals. Beautiful tinted walls, colorful rugs, artistic furniture and pleasing color combinations each plays its part in the satisfying interior.

Paint and varnish are wonderful agents in making a house a home. Besides protecting from wear and decay, they play an important part in bringing out the beauty and restfulness of the home.



COMFORT

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Kitchens should be light, airy and sanitary.—White enamel trim with walls painted with water-proof paint in light tints is always cheerful.

FLOOR FINISHING

So few people understand the proper method of floor finishing that a few rules are given.

Hardwood floors should always be varnished, not painted. Finished floors should be covered with building paper as soon as laid to keep them clean. Give the floor a first coat of good varnish thinned with turpentine of a consistency of one to eight, well brushed in and allowed to dry twenty-four hours or more. The second coat should be thinned a trifle with turpentine and allowed to dry thirty-six hours. Finish with third coat applied freely without any turpentine. Sand lightly between first and second coats to remove rough spots. Bedroom floors should be varnished using the same method.

The old method of floor decoration was to cover entirely with carpets. This was unsanitary and removed a real means of decorative effect. Modern floor decoration is finished floors and small rugs.

Your house and your neighbor's may be entirely different in design, arrangement and furnishings, but the essentials of protection and decoration remain the same.

The old saying, "Clothes make the man," can be applied with great emphasis in home decoration. Paint and furnishings will not make a warm, comfortable and substantial building, but with a well built building they make all the difference in the world between a "house" and a "home."



A RESTFUL BEDROOM

Decoration is so important that there are experts who do nothing else but give advice on decoration. The mere detail of applying paint is mechanical and is done by painters.

Farm Lighting and Electric Power

Electricity Brings to the Farm Comfort and Modern Conveniences

Modern business methods and ways of living are entirely different today than fifty years ago. The world is living faster. Time-saving methods are being used and labor-saving devices are not luxuries but necessities.

In early days every farmer had his yoke of oxen for travel and for power on the farm. Later this was replaced by horses and today even horses are too slow, and most farmers have automobiles, heavy work on the farm being done by power machinery.

The same degree of transformation has taken place in the home. The open fire-place and the stove has been replaced by the modern heating system. The tallow dip and kerosene lamp by the electric light and power plant.

The New

The greatest labor-saving device on the farm today, one with the greatest number of uses and the one used most, is the electric lighting and power system. Inventive ingenuity has perfected the farm electric plant so that it is safe, simple, easy to operate and inexpensive for individual farm use.

The pressing of a button lights any room in the house, barn or outbuilding. It is quick and danger of fire is eliminated. It furnishes running water automatically for the house and for stock, and it runs many small machines about the farm which saves extra help.

In the house it means to a great extent the difference between happiness and drudgery in the housewife's life. The general well being, not only of the family, but of the hired help as well, rests on her shoulders. There is washing, ironing, sweeping, churning, meals, dish washing, water to carry a dozen times a day, and countless other things, and all to be done on time in order to keep the wheels of farm life turning.

Electricity shoulders most of this work and reduces other work to a minimum. The electric washer does on Monday, in an hour, what takes the housewife all day to do. The electric flat-iron turns ironing from a warm tiresome job over a hot stove with countless steps, into pleasure. The electric vacuum cleaner takes the back-ache out of sweeping. The electric pump supplies running water to the kitchen ready for use on turning a faucet, and electricity does many other things, turning farm life from drudgery into a life worth living.

A comparison of the length of time different kinds of machinery are used on the farm is interesting. Over a period of a year on an average farm, a walking plow is used nineteen days, sulky plow fifteen, spring tooth harrow three, disk four, roller five, drill five, cultivator six, mower three, rake three, binder four.

Even an automobile averages only forty-five full days. The electric lighting and power system is in use almost constantly all day and night in one way or another, three hundred and sixty-five days in the year.

In planning the houses the rough wiring should be done before the inner walls are lathed and plastered. Proper wires should be run to all of the rooms for light, either in the ceilings or side walls as taste dictates. Connections should be made in rooms for electric appliances—living room, table lamp—dining room, toaster—kitchen, electric flat-iron—collar, electric washer and water pump—outside connections in shed for cream separator and churn—and in outbuildings for lights and connections for small machinery.

Electricity brings to the farmer and his family the same conveniences enjoyed by their city cousins and means saving of labor and comfort and happiness in farm life.

In the middle. Running water is provided. The grain bin is located in the loft which is very convenient with the feeding chute. Shown herewith is a medium-sized cow barn, with a capacity for twenty-four head of cattle. Like all well-arranged barns the stalls range length-wise of the barn with a passageway through the centre. 


A farmer does not own his land and it does not become a farm in the true sense until he has it well stocked and has comfortable well-furnished buildings for his stock.

As a general rule each animal should be allowed about 600 cubic feet of air space.

This barn is 40 ft. x 60 ft. and is arranged to conveniently house twenty-four head of cattle and fifteen horses. The layout is good and the barn has plenty of light and good ventilation.

Horses and cattle should not be housed together, so in this arrangement the stalls are run crosswise of the barn, and although separated by a partition, they are all housed under the one roof.

MODERN PLUMBING

A Necessity Not a Luxury

Modern plumbing is a term which is more or less vague to the average home builder; still it is of the utmost importance to him and his family.

Modern plumbing means a bath room with hot and cold water, a toilet in the house, a kitchen sink, running hot and cold water and the sanitary disposal of kitchen waste and sewage—it means comfort, convenience, health, sanitation and cleanliness.

The days of the lack of plumbing necessities on the farm are past. Modern plumbing is no longer a luxury, but an absolute necessity. Comparing plumbing arrangements and equipment on the farm with farm machinery and conveniences, they are used more often than anything else on the farm.



A Modern Bath Room

Shown herewith is a modern bath room as a suggestion for the intending builder. The closet, lavatory and bath tub are necessary. The foot tub shown is very convenient, especially for bare foot children, but it can be disposed with.

PIPING

The rough piping for the bath room, kitchen sink and sewage disposal should be planned and put in before the house is plastered. This consists of running a cast iron vent pipe from the sewer arrangements to the roof and connecting with each fixture trap to prevent foul air and gasses escaping into the house—each fixture, such as bath tub, closet, lavatory and sink should be trapped separately. A cold water pipe should be run to the closet, and hot and cold water pipe run to the tub, lavatory and sink. All piping should be as far away from the outside walls as possible to prevent freezing.

SEWAGE DISPOSAL

Health on the farm has always been a real problem and contrary to the general impression, farmers have more sickness than city people, due in a large part to the lack of sanitary plumbing arrangements.

The outside closet and waste water drain is a menace to health. Practically all of the typhoid in the country can be traced directly to the outside closet and sink drain contaminating the drinking water.

Statistics have proven that most of the sicknesses of the female members of the farmers' family are due in the summer time to this unsanitary arrangement of the closet and sink close to the house, and in the winter time to exposure.

Modern sewage disposal corrects all of this, the closet is in a warm room and the sewage is conveyed to a sanitary disposal field which is buried in the ground and frees the home and surroundings from unsanitary conditions, by a natural purification process.

No modern farm home is complete or sanitary without modern plumbing.



A Well-Equipped Cow-Barn

A good farm deserves good buildings. Very often good buildings will make a farm good with proper methods and stock. Any farm is a good farm that provides a good living for the owner. Stock is essential to good farming. Even land which has been ruined and abandoned may be brought back to life through the aid of livestock properly housed and cared for.

Economy in farming methods means spending money for necessary improvements. A barn is just as necessary on the farm for living quarters for stock as a house is for the owner, and stock, although they cannot talk will tell you by their actions, appearance and contentment, the value of comfortable quarters.

An animal that requires all the feed which it can consume to keep alive and keep warm will not be a paying investment. A goodly portion of the food consumed should go to beef producing in order to bring a return on the investment—this means that cattle must be housed in warm and comfortable quarters through the winter that the food consumed will go to beef producing instead of being used for heat production—the building should provide the heat.

This illustration shows a cow-barn with a capacity for fifty head. Here we have an ideal arrangement both from the standpoint of feeding and cleaning. Attention is drawn to the position of the silo, which is at the end of the barn right opposite the central feed passage. Here, by means of the feed carrier, the ensilage is taken and distributed to all the stock on both sides of the passage the entire length of the barn.

PLANNING THE BARN

Barn building requires careful thought and planning, that when the building is complete it will harmonize with the other outbuildings and surroundings of the farm, and that it will properly and economically serve the purpose for which it is intended.


The scope of design and artistic effect is limited to a few general types. The most important factor in barn construction, however, is in the interior arrangement. The planning must have a definite purpose whether it be the proper housing of stock, storage facilities for feed, or implements or for whatever purpose a building is built.

It is well to keep in mind that it costs no more to build a barn right with convenient arrangement, warm, proper lighting and ventilation than to build wrong.

"Better Barn" planning is providing sufficient room for present and future requirements, convenient arrangement for the saving of steps in feeding and cleaning, and construction which will aid in the better breeding, health and general well being of the stock. A well known fact which has been demonstrated time and again is that cows will eat less feed, give more milk and put on more flesh, if they are housed in comfortable quarters. The same applies to horses and other stock. A horse that has a pleasant, light, warm, dry, well ventilated stall, consumes less feed and is capable of doing more work than the horse housed in cold un-ventilated stalls.

Rectangular not more than 36 or 38 feet long and 20 or 22 feet wide is the best shape for a barn. It is easier to clean and to care for. It is more comfortable for the animals and easier to heat. It is more economical to build and to maintain.

Studding higher than 8 feet is a waste of added expense and can be avoided. The space above the roof may be used for hay storage.

LOCATION AND FOUNDATION

The foundation and location of the barn should be on high ground to permit good drainage. Barn drainage should always be away from the house. This is necessary both from the standpoint of health and cleanliness. Barn yards should be well drained. Many farmers have concrete yards while others fill their yards with broken stone covered with gravel or cinders.

The foundation wall should be made of cement or stone and built up at least one foot above ground to prevent wood posts and plates rotting. Floors should be made of cement, they are permanent and sanitary —Wood rots, makes up manure and is a harbor for disease germs. Floors should be six or eight inches above the surrounding ground and should be well drained by running drain tile the entire length of the barn in a straight line and on a slant, and extra tile should be run where the stock stand in order to ensure dry stalls. The floors of the stalls should be overlaid with plank for the stock to lay on, and to prevent slipping.

ARRANGEMENT

The best arrangement of stalls for either horses or cattle is in rows the long way of the building, with the stock facing or backing each other. This is handy for feeding and cleaning and means a great saving of steps. Feeding arrangements should be such that stock can be fed without entering the stalls. Box and maternity stalls should be near the outer doors so that sick or young stock need not be taken past vicious animals to get out doors.

LIGHTING

It is well to remember when studying lighting arrangements that light plays a very important part in the health of stock. Sunshine is the world's cheapest and best disinfectant. The windows should, therefore, be arranged so that the light will reach every part of the barn.

Nine-light windows with 10 in. x 12 in. glass are the best to use. They should be placed as high as possible and have spandril checks (see illustration) so that draughts will not blow down directly on the animals. At least four square feet of glass should be provided for each animal in the barn.

Barns should run north and south, this allows the sun to get in both from the east and west, and the north winds will strike the end of the building instead of the sides, making a warmer building. Danger from fire is always present in the barn, therefore a perfected farm lighting system now available should be installed for light. This eliminates the use of a lighted lantern or any kind of fire in the barn. Electric light is good business and mighty cheap insurance. The expense of the lighting equipment is not prohibitive especially when the cost of the plant is spread over the house and other farm buildings.


VENTILATION

Ventilation is another important item. A barn may be built warm, have plenty of light, be laid out conveniently and still be a veritable disease breeder. A barn filled with stock without ventilation will be robbing with moisture in a very short time which conveys itself to the stock and the result is a herd constantly having colds and other sicknesses. The other danger is that there are sure to be one or two animals in a herd sickly, and contagious diseases will soon spread through the entire herd. Ventilation is so important today that there are concerns which make a business of barn ventilation and the intending builder should get their advice on ventilation when planning the barn.

Silos

Ensilage on the farm is getting to be a very live question even in Western Canada. It means "better feed" for stock, which of course means "better stock"; it means more productive land on account of the fertilizer gained; and it means an absolute insurance against lean years from crop failure. Good stock on the farm are sure producers and the silo keeps them in green feed. Ensilage can always be grown and preserved.

It is impossible in this space to more than point out a few vital points in Barn Building. But it is becoming more and more apparent to the Western Farmer that Good Buildings are vital to success. A finishing touch to the barn and the complete farm home is in giving the farm a name. A name for the farm gives the owner an identity and an individuality which in time can be made of real value in marketing farm produce. It stimulates pride and is an asset to the community. The designs in this book have all been named. Any of them are suitable and appropriate as farm trade mark names and so far as this book is concerned any farmer is at liberty to use them.



Hogs, like poultry, cost very little to produce on the farm and they are big money makers. There is always waste material around the farm in the shape of unmarketable produce which can be either fed raw or made palatable by cooking. It makes good feed and feed on which hogs will thrive.

Hogs are easy to keep, easy to breed and are not subject to sickness ordinarily. The dreaded hog cholera, one of their worst diseases, is seldom found except where the living quarters are wet and unsanitary. Therefore, successful hog raising requires clean and comfortable housing conditions.

Shown in this illustration is a hog house with sufficient room for fifteen animals. The construction is such that at any time when the herd increases the building can be added to with the same construction.

Sleeping quarters are arranged with a raised platform made of plank, this provides a dry and clean bed and observation has shown that a hog, given a clean bed, will keep himself clean.

The feeding troughs are built next to the partition which is arranged to swing in over the trough for feeding which eliminates lifting the feed over the partition, lightens the work and helps to keep the place clean.

A feed room with stove for cooking food is built in the centre with the pens on either side.

A Good Hen House to Build

Hens on the farm are clear profit. All that is necessary is to house them properly—Give them good warm living quarters with plenty of light and ventilation, protected from draughts, and with proper feed, which is in abundance on practically every farm and they will produce in spite of the owner. This illustration shows an inexpensive yet substantial building to hold one hundred hens.


The building is arranged with all the windows on the south side, which is proper, in order to get all the sun and warmth possible in the winter time. Fixed nine-light sash are shown for every alternate opening, the remainder are fitted with frames covered with unbleached cotton and hinged at the top.

The roosts and nests are placed at the back of the building so that plenty of floor space is given for the fowls to scratch in the gravel and straw for loose grain. The nests are built under the dropping boards which slide like drawers and are easily taken out and cleaned. A canvas screen is hinged from the ceiling in front of the dropping boards to retain the heat and help to keep out the cold and draughts at night.

The separate feed room is located at the end of the building where the feed can be kept dry and clean and away from the fowls. Best results are obtained by not having over fifty fowls in a flock.

A feature of this Hen House is that it is a unit building. The units are 14 ft. x 14 ft., each unit accommodating fifty hens. Additional units can be added as individual requirements demand.

The price of eggs and poultry today makes this building a gilt-edged investment.



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WATER SYSTEMS

The time was when the rural dweller would put up with the discomforts which the lack of running water brings, because there was no choice, especially on the Prairies where it was impossible to get a natural elevation. Electricity for lights and running small machinery, the modern heating system keeping every room in the house warm and comfortable, and the modern plumbing functioned by a water system, supplying running water throughout the house and other farm buildings, makes the ideal farm home.

THE OLD—THE MODERN

Picture to yourself a farm without modern water system conveniences. The bare kitchen with nothing but a stove, a table and a couple of chairs, the bench and the water pail—All water must be obtained by going out in the cold and priming a lazy pump. Hot water must be heated in a kettle or dish on the stove, and after every meal dishes must be washed on the table and the dirty water thrown out doors—the periodical bath must be taken in the kitchen in front of the stove—the outside closet—the water for the stock—either pumped and carried to them in the winter time, or a case of cutting a hole in the ice in some far or near-by stream.

The other picture is running water which only requires the turning of a faucet where everything is handy—Hot and cold water always at hand as long as the kitchen stove or the furnace has a fire—The bathroom and inside closet—the running water, piped direct to the stock stalls and to the outside watering trough, and always a supply of water on hand with plenty of pressure in case of fire.


These are the things that a water system means for the farm, and the question of cost is so small in comparison with the conveniences obtained that no farm need be without them.



ELEVATION TO KITCHEN OR PANTRY.




ELEVATION TO DINING ROOM.
