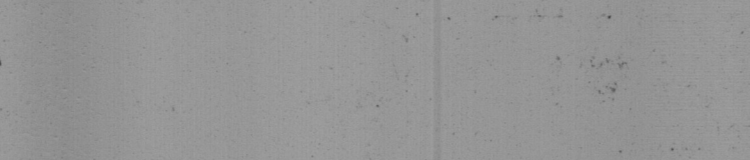

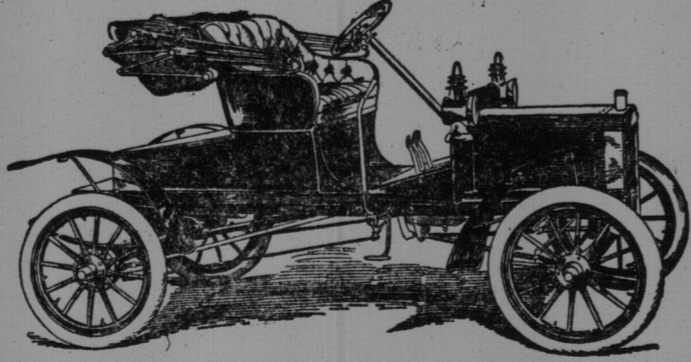

STARTLING FACTS BROUGHT OUT AT THE HARRIMAN ENQUIRY



During the five hours which Mr. Harriman spent in the witness chair on the first day of the inquiry, Attorney Kellogg brought out an amazing story of high finance spent.

New York, Feb. 26—After amazing his listeners with the complete story of the celebrated Chicago and Alton Railroad reorganization, which netted millions to him and his associates, E. H. Harriman surprised the members of the interstate commerce commission by refusing to tell what his individual holdings were of the original stock.

Under advice of counsel, he declined to answer a question put to him by James B. Kellogg, chief investigator, on the ground that the commission is not clothed with power to inquire into the private transactions even of a railway president.

ANNUAL GRANTS ARE RECOMMENDED

Considerable Business Done At Treasury Board Meeting Last Night.

At a meeting of the treasury board last evening the appointment of one or two additional assessors was recommended.

The receipts from the present season's winter port business were shown to be \$500 in advance of last year. It was indicated that the rates might be increased for 1907-8.

P. W. Lantalam, the lessee of north and south market wharves was granted a reduction of \$100 in the amount to be paid for the privilege of collecting fees, on account of a falling off in the revenues.

The matter of paying Chief Clerk for time absent at the Collins trial was referred to the safety board.

The following comparative statement of the amounts received for top and side wharfage during the present and last winter port business was submitted:

Balance in favor of season 1906-7, \$647.59. The following annual grants were recommended: Victorian Order of Nurses, \$1,000; St. John Horticultural Society, \$4,000; S. P. C. A., \$300; Tourist Association, \$750.

A number of minor matters were dealt with. It was decided to hold a special meeting early next month to take up the estimates. The board then adjourned.

The bride was given away by her brother-in-law Alexander McLennan, and looked charming in a gown of cream silk, elaborate made princess style, with yoke of embroidered chiffon and bands of silk embroidery, antique cream velvet ribbon, the gift of her sister, and carried a handsome shower bouquet of cream roses. Miss Katie Evers, who acted as bridesmaid, was becomingly attired in a white lace dress, and carried a bouquet of pink roses. The groom was ably supported by D. McLennan. The groom's present to the bride was a handsome gold watch and chain to the bridesmaid a gold crescent brooch, set with pearls, and to the groomsmen a gold and ruby stick pin. The bride and groom received a number of useful and costly presents.

Montreal, Feb. 28—In L'Assomption today there were three candidates nominated: Dr. Rubel Laurier, government candidate; Joseph Achambault, Liberal, and Edie Lemire, Conservative. This seat was made vacant by the death of Charlemagne Laurier.

In Richelieu there are two candidates, Adelard Lanctot, government candidate, and C. A. Rondeau, independent Liberal.

While this stand on the part of Mr. Harriman, whose railway systems, the Union and Southern Pacific, are undergoing the most searching inquiry ever instituted against a railroad in this country, was the principal development of yesterday's hearing, far greater interest was aroused by his calm narration of the details of the Alton deal.

Mr. Harriman explained the steps by which he and three associates came in possession of ninety-seven per cent of the stock of the Chicago and Alton Railroad, increased the capitalization in seven years from \$30,000,000 to \$122,872,000, \$60,000,000 of which he admitted was watered stock, and profited to the extent of more than \$12,000,000 through special dividends declared just after their assumed control and through the sale of three per cent bonds to themselves at a price thirty points lower than that at which they disposed of them.

PENSIONS FOR POLICE

A pension scheme in connection with the St. John police department will likely come into operation next April. At a meeting of the salaries committee of the common council yesterday afternoon it was decided to recommend an increase of pay to the men on the force on the understanding that an amount not to exceed 3 per cent of their earnings should be devoted to establishing a pension fund.

The building inspector was recommended for an increase of \$100 a year in consideration of his additional duties as inspector of electric wiring.

SMALLPOX AND A CAT

Smallpox, in the form it has struck Pictou County just now, does not seem to be a particularly violent attack though it is hardly some enough, but it surely makes up in infectious properties what it lacks in fatality.

A curious instance of catching the disease was related to us on Saturday. The occupant of a house near Matheson's Foundry are quarantined, suffering from smallpox. They also possessed a cat that was a pet of the fireman at the foundry. Since the outbreak of the disease the cat visited the foundry boiler-house and received its usual affectionate greeting from the fireman and while purring a return greeting handed the fireman a dose of the obnoxious disease. At any rate he is now in turn suffering and quarantined at his home in Eureka. The unfortunate but unmentioned feline is now in that happy hunting ground for cats.

PARIS EATS HORSE FLESH BY THE TON Record for Last Year Was 22,500,000 Pounds, and Taste is Growing.

PARIS, Feb. 28—Are you fond of horseflesh? This is a question which will be asked in Paris shortly if the increasing popularity of horseflesh as an article of food continues. Statistics show that of 28,973 horses sold at the Paris market last year in the Boulevard de l'Hopital, 22,792 were sent direct to the slaughter house to be prepared for human food.

The average weight of edible flesh from a horse being about five hundred pounds, it is estimated that 22,000,000 pounds of horseflesh were eaten in Paris during 1906. In 1890 the amount was 10,000,000 pounds.

It is stated that horseflesh is more nourishing than either beef or mutton, and much cheaper. Some doctors recommend the flesh of the horse to patients who are in need of supralimentation. The only objection to it is that the grain is somewhat coarser than that of beef.
