ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, LONDON, ONT., FOR THE YEAR 1868.

In submitting the Eighteenth Annual Report since the settlement of our Pastor, the Rev. John Scott, the Deacons' Court and Managing Committee desire to acknowledge the goodness of God for His watchful care over us as a congregation during another year, and for continuing to us the blessings of peace and prosperity; and above all we desire to render our sincere thanks for the great blessing of having the Gospel faithfully preached to us. May the good seed sown in the hearts of young and old, take deep root and bear fruit an hundred fold to the praise and honour of God's Holy name.

Since our last annual meeting, the hand of death has been amongst us, removing the old, the middle aged, and the young, some of whom were called away very suddenly, reminding us that "in the midst of life we are in death," and that "we know not what a day nor an hour may bring forth."

We would desire again to render thanks to God for His kindness to us in sparing the life and services of our beloved Pastor, and in restoring his health so far as to enable him to perform so much Pastoral work, and other important duties. In consequence of the difficulty of obtaining a suitable assistant, he had, during the past year, to accept of such casual aid as he could secure, and consequently was sometimes overworked, which we fear has been too much for his health and strength. Your Committee would be glad, if some suitable arrangement could be made which would relieve him of part of his heavy and responsible duties.

In a financial point of view, we have to report that the ordinary receipts and expenditure of the Congregation are in a satisfactory condition; the books of the Treasurer, Mr. Wm. Begg, have been audited and found correct; an abstract of the receipts and disbursements for the year 1868, will be found annexed to this Report which will show the financial position of the Congregation.

THE NEW CHURCH.

At a special congregational meeting, held on the 4th of Dec., 186,7, the Deacons' Court and Managing Committee was constituted also a Building Committee, and instructed to accept of the tenders of Messrs. Elliott & Denham, for the erection of a new church; the amount of the contract was \$19,608, not inc. 'uding lighting or heating.

Your Committee regreat to have to report the melancholy and sudden death of Mr. William Elliott, one of the contractors, which took place between the corner stone of the edifice was laid; but his brother, a ting as his administrator, made arrangements for the bricks ork with Mr. Samuel Flory, and Messrs. redit work. As yet no arrangement has been made for the heating, as the Committee wish to get more information before deciding on which plan to adopt.

Having had an offer from Mr. Robert Lewis to put stained glass in the windows, instead of the plain contracted for, at an additional cost of \$450, after ascertaining the views of many of the congregation upon the subject, the committee agreed to accept of his tender. This change, we believe, will be a great improvement and ornament to the church.

The congregation is aware that the foundation stone of the new church was laid on the 25th May last, by our respected pastor, assisted by the Rev. D. McKenzie, of Zorra; Rev. Mr. Cochrane, of Brantford, Rev. Mr. Proudfoot, and other ministers of this city, taking part in the proceedings. The work has progressed very satisfactorily since, and the edifice was safely covered in before the cold weather came on. The work, so far, appears to have been well and substantially done, and your Committee hope that, when finished, St. Andrew's Church will be an ornament to the city and a credit to the Canada Presbyterian Church.

The Books of the Treasurer to the Building Fund, (Mr. Alex. McIntosh,) have been audited and found correct, and an abstract of the receipts and disbursements will be found annexed to this report.

The amount paid on subscriptions to the Treasurer, to the same date, was..... \$ 6781 55

As the money paid on the subscription list has not been found sufficient to meet the demands of the contractors, arrangements for the present have been made with the Bank of Commerce to advance the required amount, and the sum of \$6,000 has been borrowed and paid to the contractors during the progress of the work, in addition to the amount received on the subscription list.

As the Committee wish to give a full account of all the money paid in to the Treasurer, and from whom received, a list of the subscriptions and amounts paid up to the 23rd January will be found annexed to this report.

Having a very heavy responsibility resting upon them: to meet the demands of the contractors, your Committee have to call on the subscribers to pay up their instalments promptly when due, and those who can will oblige by paying in advance, and all the members, adherents and friends of the congregation are invited to do what they can to assist in the building of this house for the worship of God, "as the Lord hath prospered them." To enable your Committee to pay the interest on the borrowed money, and to meet other expenses connected with the new building, it will be necessary to take up quarterly collections to meet these claims during the year.

In order to carry out the resolutions passed at last annual meeting, Messrs. Daniel Lester, J. G. McIntosh and John Ross, were elected to fill up the number required on the Board of Trustees for the Church Property, and Mr. Andrew Chisholm was added to the Trustees for our Church Cemetery, in place of the late Mr. Hugh Rose, and these appointments were duly executed and registered, as the law requires.

The Sabbath School organization of the Church, comprises the Central School, and four Branch Schools, two of which are in the Township of Westminster, near the city limits, one in the Gore of London, and one in Petersville.

THE CENTRAL SCHOOL

is held at half-past two P. M., on every Sabbath Day, excepting those on which the ordinance of the Lord's Supper is administered. In the year ending December 1, 1868, the number of Teachers on the roll was 28, males, 14; and females, 14. Average attendance of Boys, 76; Girls, 81; total, 157. The Library of the School contains about 500 volumes, which are circulated among the scholars every two weeks, being replenished with new books as the funds at the disposal of the school will admit; and the scholars are regularly supplied with a monthly S. S. paper. In connection with the Sabbath School, Rev. J. Scott conducts a Bible Class, having on the roll 28 young men, and 30 young women; average attendance, 17 young men, and 19 young women.

The Superintendents and Teachers of the Central and Branch Schools, meet on the first Monday of each month, for the transaction of business; and annually on the first Monday in December, to receive reports, appropriate surplus funds, and elect officers. At the last Annual Meeting, the following were appointed

THE HAMILTON ROAD BRANCH SCHOOL

has an average attendance of 40 scholars, under the superintendance of Mr. D. Fraser, who has the assistance of Mr. H. E. Nelles, and four female teachers. The collections during the past eighteen months amounted to \$1456. The sum of \$10 has been handed over to the Central School, from which the branch has received a library, and has been supplied with the S. S. paper.

THE PETERSVILLE BRANCH SCHOOL,

under the superintendence of Mr. Campbell, with the assistance of four male and two female teachers, has an average attendance of 40 scholars, 75 on the roll, and has a library of 100 volumes.

MR. DODD'S BRANCH SCHOOL,

in the township of Westminster, is conducted by Mr. Dodd, who has the assistance of 5 teachers. Average attendance of 28 boys and 21 girls; total, 49. Has a library of 204 volumes, and circulates 40 copies of the S. S. paper monthly. The collections for the past year amounted to \$10:75. This school, although in connection with St. Andrew's Church, is financially self-sustaining.

MR. DIPROSE'S BRANCH SCHOOL,

also in the township of Westminster, is conducted by Mr. Diprose and Mrs. Jones; has an average attendance of 25 scholars, the library and S. S. paper being at present supplied from the Central School.
