Report of Secretary Duffy to the Brotherhood at the Milwaukee Convention—Officers Exonerated from all Charges.

Secretary Frank Duffy, in his report to the convention of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners in Milwaukee, said that the number of trade movements the past two years exceeded that of any other time.

The secretary noted the reduction in the hours of work throughout the country and the increase in wages from \$2 to \$2.50 a day to \$2.50 to \$3 a day.

Another was passed requesting the Executive Board to investigate the matter of establishing a home at Denver, and report at the next biennial convention.

The resolution for the purchase of a permanent headquarters in Indianapolis was defeated.

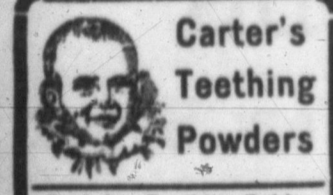
