hesitatingly declare that the wholly successful organization of the working class movement absolutely depends upon the entire abolition of the wage system, wage slavery, the present accompaniment of capitalist class rule, in a civilization based upon machine processes.

To achieve this great object, the working class must be politically organized to vote for the abolition of this wage system, and instead for the collective ownership of the means of life, the instruments of production and distribution, the same to be administered democratically in the interests of all humanity.

The movement of the capitalist class through the political field is a terrible story. The law courts, the executive machinery of governments, have hitherto fought, injunctions, have declared black living on the part of employees legal, strikes illegal, picketing, boycotts and other methods of self-defence, offences punishable by law.

Funds of trade unions have been legally seized, and members held liable for fines and costs.

When we remember how the workers have been trampled upon and ridden over throughout the centuries, and picture Colorado, Chicago, Russia, the South African mines, and all our working efforts in this city which we, the working class, have built, enriched, and filled with merchandise, words seem cold and inadequate in attempt to describe the feelings of the human heart.

Between the capitalist and working classes there can be no possible compromise or identity of interests, any more than there can be peace in the midst of war or light in the midst of darkness. A society based upon this class division carries in itself the seeds of its own destruction. Such a society is founded on fundamental injustice.

The past year has been a satisfactory one to organized labor. Nine or ten new internationals have been formed.

The membership of the American Federation of Labor has increased, notwithstanding the attacks made by citizens' alliances and other unfriendly organizations, by fully 400,000, bringing our membership up to 2,800,000.

The Federation, both numerically and financially, is splendidly equipped. Fifty general and 1,100 district organizations have been established, and are unusually successful in just strikes and lockouts. At the end of the year, when strikes now are adjusted, it will be found that labor organizations have been generally successful. Even where defeated they have retained their organization and prevented resolutions.

Again, we declare that with society split into antagonistic classes, the class in possession of the essential factor in production has always been the ruling class—the class that to-day maintains itself in power by control of legislation and buttressing with legislative enactment of robbery and exploitation of the workers.

The disposition of labor throughout the country is to refuse to surrender one inch of advantage they have gained either in this or in another year through their unions. In that way they will be able to win the day, to defeat the attacks made by citizens' alliances and other unfriendly organizations.

The disposition of the ruling class, let us call it the bourgeoisie, is to resist every effort to increase the rights of the working class, to maintain itself in power by control of legislation and buttressing with legislative enactment of robbery and exploitation of the workers.

The disposition of the intelligentsia, the cultured, educated, disciplined and equipped to press forward during the coming year, is to the labor movement to intelligence and to the working class.

We require any evidence illustrating the moral delapidation of the ruling class, let an Associated Press despatch depicting a scene at the New York convention of the Manufacturers' Association.

The wage scale at the shop has ranged in the past from \$1.75 to \$7 a day, but the number getting the higher pay was hardly worth mentioning. It is the intention to eliminate piece work, and the result, the company says, is to be made on this kind of work.

Prophet Party, in making its annual report, said: "Trade unions are nothing but antidemocratic bodies of dogs and anarchy; they represent self-ordained and unadmitted authority. They are a mob, a crew, and cowardly, brutal, interfering with the rights of the nation, and of more harm than all the world over." They use murder, assault and riot as their weapons."

At the conclusion of Mr. Party's speech, the convention rose en masse and cheered him to the echo, the delegates standing on chairs, frantically waving

their arms, and cheering vociferously for ten minutes.

These are the representatives of a class described by its organized defenders as possessing a largeness of heart and the greatest magnanimity of purpose.

They have proved themselves totally unfit to regulate industry in the interests of the toilers.

Once more we say unto you, the instruments of production necessary for life must cease to be the monopoly of a class, and become the possession of the people. In your hands rests the future of our free institutions; in your hands, and yours only, numbers of the working class, rests the moral advancement of civilization.

We appeal to you to study the political economy of your own class, the science of socialism, finally to demand the obliteration of the wage system, and the world of that great tribe of toilers, Eugene V. Debs. "The end-class struggle and class rule, of ignorance and vice, of poverty and shame, of cruelty and crime, the dawn of brotherhood, the birth of freedom, the beginning of man." This is the demand.

HOUSE RENTS

Report of Committee of District
Labor Council upon the
Question

Your committee appointed to consider the high rents now being paid by the members of the Toronto District Labor Council, and the possibility of our members acquiring possession of a home through the cooperation of the landlords, desire to report as follows:

Your committee met at The Toiler Hall, on the evening of July 15th. Present: Mr. Darwin, Mrs. Hudlinson, Mr. Tweed, John Armstrong and J. H. Cook. We agreed unanimously on the following points:

1. That the burden of rent is pressing very heavily on the manual toilers.

2. That this burden is unreasonably heavy, is growing heavier, and ought to be abated.

3. That almost every householder pays the purchase-money of a home, oftentimes twice over, in the course of a lifetime, some few for themselves, but the majority for their landlords.

4. That a large number of the manual toilers of this city would welcome the opportunity to purchase homes of their own.

Organized labor has made good progress during the past year. The situation, past and present, is summed up by Mr. Frank Morrison, general secretary of the Federation of Labor, in this statement:

"The past year has been a satisfactory one to organized labor. Nine or ten new internationals have been formed. REPORT OF LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE.

Your committee met at the Toiler office on the evening of Friday, September 10th. The majority reported progress on the question of assisted emigration of orphans and friendless children from the United Kingdom. In discussing the interests of labor and the immense difficulties of making any impression on the combined and solid ranks of the Employers and Manufacturers' Association for an increase of wages or shortening of hours, the attention of the committee was called to the subject of the poor law. Current Comment

The Mother's Union had a visitor during the past week in the person of Mr. J. J. Mulcahy, the president of the Atlanta District Union. He is here on business connected with a new scale of wages at present being negotiated.

The trade union movement has been a great safeguard of British freedom. It was the chief influence in securing the extension of the franchise in 1868, and again in 1872, and upon the whole, the men whom the unions have sent to Parliament have done excellent work in assisting to realize democratic ideals. Some of them, no doubt, have from time to time shown an inclination to play the role of leaders of their districts, but they have been more loyal to the Labor party than to any other.

The shareholders of the Labor Temple Company Limited, held a meeting in the Temple on Monday evening of this week, for the purpose of electing directors and an additional five shareholders to the company. The balloting for directors comprised the whole of Monday evening, and resulted in the election of the following directors, to serve for the balance of the year: Jas. Simpson, 4,140; Alf. Baynor, 3,619; Bobt. Clocker, 3,539; D. A. Carey, 3,071; J. H. Huddleston, 2,934; Jas. Wilson, 1,924; Wm. Boland, 2,501; W. T. Thomas, 2,072; D. W. Kennedy, 2,098; Robt. Hungerford, 1,910; P. M. O'Neil, 1,871; J. F. Farren, 1,625; John Armstrong, 1,449; Mr. Walsh, 806; M. J. Carmody, 78.

The union, the directorate is divided as follows: Printers, 11; Stationers and Electrophysians, 11; Tailors, 11; Bootmakers, 11; Musicians, 11; Machinists, Street Railway Men, 11; Cigarmakers, Carriage and Wagon Workers, 11; Plumbers, 11; Pianomakers, 11; Bricklayers, 11. The directors hold their initial meeting to-night (Tuesday) in the Temple, and will expect that the alterations to the building will be imminent, so that it will be ready for occupation by December 1st for the purpose of meeting.

The question of political action will be discussed by the Trades Council Thursday night. It is expected that some action will be taken to effect a permanent organization, but at this writing it is impossible to tell what course will be pursued regarding the present Dominion elections.

GEM THOUGHTS FROM REV. J. L. GORDON'S SERMON ON "THE COMING UNIVERSAL FAITH."

All languages strike down to the same root.

There has been one origin.

By and by we shall have one science.
