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THE MISSION TO THIBET

A RIDE TO THE GATES OF UNKNOWN LAND. The Expedition Is Not a Picnic—Plenty of Hard Work and Discomfort.

The special correspondent of the London Daily Mail, with the Tibetan expedition, sends the following account of the country from Chumbi: From Thibet to Lhasa is 304 miles. These, as in the dominions of Nangay Doolai Raja, are mostly on the road.
