Lombroso, the alienist, professor of psychistry at the University of Turin, has written a long article on the state of the minds of the geople during the recent Italian earthquake. He says the recent disaster enables one to sound the very dopths of the human soul. He quotes one of the survivors as saying: "I saw the last judgment, the end of the world. I am sure the end of the world must come this way. In the pitch black night I saw houses tremble, shake and subside, abysees open in the earth, endless shrieks and cries. I thought it was the reign of death as I had pictured it in night-mares. I no longer felt alive. I thought myself dead. I thought that my conclousness was the conscious-ness that must follow death." Prof. Lombroso continues: "No one, though seriously wounded, speaks of physical suffering. Panic and terror took possession of their senses and paralyzed ali sense of pain. Man who had an arm broken ran miles without knowing it. A woman, whose eye was so badly hurt that it had to be remov-ed ,declares she felt nothing. 
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
