In laying before the Shaveholders the Thirty-Fourth Annual Report, with the usual Financial Statements up to the 30th September last, the Directors have another opportunity afforded them of congratulating all concerned on the favorable results of another year's operations.

- Amongst the extensions made during the past year 4,218 yards of larger mains have been substituted for smaller ones; 8,750 yards of new mains have been laid, and 760 new services have been put in.
- 8. Eighteen Gas Engities, varying from 2 to 7 horse-fower each, are now in use. The gas consumed thereby and by gas cooking stoves, amounted during the year to nearly two millions cubic for a very considerable quantity was constituted by gas heating stoves and for manufacturing purposes. - 3. The illuminating power of the gas throughout the year has far exceeded the standard required by the Government.
- 4. His place has been filled by the appointment of Mr. W. H. Pearson, Jr., a former employé of the Company, but had considerable practical experience in gas making, and in the various mechanical departments of simulations.
