NOVA SCOTIA RAILWAYS.

A BIG BOOM IN PROGRESS—THE HANTS CENTRAL.

The Sun is informed by Levl Young, of the Bolt and Nut works, who is one of the promoters and has recently returned from a business trip to Nova Scotia, that railway building is booming in that province. The latest scheme, and one that meets with most popular favor, is the Hants Central railway, to run from Truro to Windsor direct by the valley of the Kennebec river.

This scheme was taken in hand by E. A. Charters of Sussex, N. B. who saw the advantages and necessity for its construction, and having arranged with the directors of the Hants Central Railway Company a definite line of action succeeded in inducing some American brokers and capitalists in Boston among them being Mr. Winthrop, M. B. Howard, a Mr. Mudge, capitalist, and a Mr. Frink, contractor, who have looked into the merits of the proposed route and expressed themselves ready and willing to float the bond of the line and construct the same.

The preliminaries are now about all arranged and the prospects are that the matter will be put into business shape as speedily as possible and the surveys and work of construction commenced.

So favorably are the people of Truro disposed towards the scheme that they unanimously voted the company a cash bonus of \$50,000 in aid of the construction of the same. Mainland and Windsor are both proposing to do likewise, and the municipalities of Hants and Colchester have signified their willingness to provide the free right of way over the whole line, which will be about 50 miles. This route meets with universal favor all through Nova Scotia, as with the construction of the "missing link" and the construction of the line direct line of travel will be had from Cape Breton to Boston by the Hants Central railway, W. and A. railway, Western Counties railway and railway and Yarmouth steam-ship line.

The only heavy work of any importance is the bridge across the Stubbins at Matland, which will probably cost in the vicinity of \$300,000.

FIRE AT MCADAM JUNCTION.

About five o'clock Sunday afternoon a fire broke out in the New Brunswick Railway shops at McAdam and the flames spread with such rapidity that all the offices of the railway employees and the inhabitants were unable to stay their progress until the machine shop, boiler shop, blacksmith shop and pattern shop were destroyed. The fire burned fiercely and it was by the most heroic work that all the other buildings were saved. The telegraph poles in the immediate vicinity of the fire were destroyed. Ten cars of lumber and freight on a siding were also destroyed. The fire was the result of the explosion of a lamp in the pattern shop, report says. The buildings destroyed were all insured as was also the machinery. Now standing this the earth will be a heavy one to the New Brunswick railway.

Advice from McAdam this afternoon place the loss much heavier than it was at first stated. A valuable engine in the machine shops was destroyed as were all the other buildings. The total loss is estimated at over \$300,000. The property is insured, but to what extent is not known. It is probably held in the United States.

JOHNSTOWN, Pa., July 6.—Cholera morbus in its worst form has made its appearance here. Last night Dr. Foster attended over a hundred cases among workmen. Early this morning Gen. Hastings and Col. Douglas were stricken with the complaint and are confined to their beds. Physicians say the disease has been caused by continued wet weather. Heavy rains flooded out the fans, at Johnstown, Penn., last night. There is a great alarm over the condition of the Conemaugh river which it is feared will sweep over its banks and flood the town.

NOTES ON PASTURE LAND.

BY JOHN DRYDEN, M. P. P., BROOKLIN, ONT.

After a visit to England, there is one thing which I do not think it is sinful to covet, and that is the thick, closely-grown grasses which abound in that country, and upon which their animals are permitted to graze. I do not suppose that we shall ever attain the degree of excellence in Canada which is known there. Our climate and soil are so different that it seems to be impossible; and yet it has often occurred to me that some improvement on what is generally found in this country might be easily obtained. I do not think the system of permanent pasturing would succeed in any district in this country. We are therefore driven to a system more generally obtained in the north of Scotland where the land is alternately cultivated, and laid down for grass. It may be that precisely the same kind of grass would succeed in our district, but if so, it would be well for them. But if the same preparation of soil, and the same care afterwards were given to this matter, I apprehend we might occupy a much advanced position even here. No grass that grows successfully without moisture, and during seasons such as the last two now passed, it is almost impossible to lay down a field of grass successfully. But in ordinary seasons this will be the case. Success in this matter depends somewhat on the kind of

REMEDY FOR CUT WORM.

N. S. C. Plymouth county, Mass. I wish to know what is the cheapest method of protecting his cabbage from the ravages of cut worms. Some gardeners recommend winding pieces of paper or bark, or a bit of burdock leaf around the plants when set. The cut worms work on the surface of the soil or directly beneath it, and when they come to the surface which they do in the evening, they are almost equally objectionable.

AGE TESTS FOR CATTLE.

In an item entitled to "Ex" it is said that a heifer has no rings on her horns until she is two years of age, and one is added each year thereafter. You can therefore tell the age of a cow with tolerable accuracy by counting the rings on her horns and adding two to the number. The bull has no rings as a rule, until he is five years old, so to tell his age after that period add the number of rings. The heifer to the third pair; and the third and fourth and last pair have appeared, and at this time the central pair are of full size. At seven years a dark line, caused by the wearing of the teeth, appears on all of them, and at nine years the central pair become to shrink; and the third and fourth can only be determined by the degree of shrinkage generally. At fifteen the teeth are nearly all gone.
